Minnesota law requires that ALL children must participate in Early Education Screening. The school district provides screening for ALL children between the ages of 3 and 5 years of age that have not already been screened.

The screening will consist of the following components and will take approximately 30 minutes

- Vision & Hearing check

- Family factors interview

- Physical growth assessment (height & weight)

- Developmental screening

- Immunization review

*All children attending preschool or kindergarten in the fall of 2025 must be screened. There will be one screening day prior to school starting in the fall for those children who turn 3 during the summer.
