The Barnesville Trojans come into the 2018 football season as two-time defending Section 8AA champions and state participants, with their eyes on trying to make it back to the section championship game.

The Trojans have been very successful over a 10-year stretch, thanks to the leadership of Head Coach Bryan Strand.

Strand has been at the school for 14 years and has an overall record of 104 wins and 37 losses. He has been named conference or district coach of the year on seven occasions and won section coach of the year four times.

Last year's squad surprised many people by winning 10 games and

another section championship. They finished with an overall record of 10-2 and were 5-1 in the Midwest District-White Division, making it to the state quarterfinals, where they eventually lost to a very strong and talented Paynesville team.

"Last year was a ton of fun," Strand said. "We shocked many people by knocking off Hawley in the section finals. The kids improved and worked hard all season long and made it back to the state tournament. However, we did not play our best game against Paynesville. Turnovers doomed us on that night and Paynesville took advantage. Things like that happen and hopefully we have learned from that game. I believe it has motivated many of our boys to work very hard this offseason. They seem ready to get after it. We had a great camp and have looked very good in our first week of practice."

Strand will once again have the services of a talented group of assistant coaches, many of whom

have been with the program for numerous years.

Offensive coordinator Phil Trowbridge returns for his 19th season as an assistant to the Trojans football program with Nick Paur and Nathan Strand teaming up to lead the junior varsity and freshman teams. Paur will enter his second season while Strand returns after a one-year hiatus as a volunteer coach.

Volunteer coaches will include Scott Snobl, Ace Gregg and Dain Biewer. The junior high will be coached by Matt Askegaard, eighth grade, Scott Amundson, seventh grade, and Tracy Hinsz, 7/8 grade assistant.

The Trojans will be looking to replace some key losses to graduation as Jonny Kletsch, Brady Tweeton, Brady Martz, Caleb Stetz, Jack Trowbridge, Matt Bredman, Alex Jenison, Jalen Plath, Robert Mark, Joey Marquart, Tyler Stage and Tristan Elliott will not return in 2018.

However, Barnesville does



return many players that saw significant playing time last year. The offensive line returns senior Jackson Poepping, center/defensive tackle, along with juniors Connor Morse, guard/linebacker, and Matt Samuelson, tackle/defensive tackle.

Junior Hunter Zenzen returns to play both end positions, as does senior Preston Snobl, who can also shift out to linebacker, and senior Brooks Martinson, who will play tight end and linebacker.

The Trojans return two running backs with plenty of experience in junior Jackson Wahl, who will also play linebacker, and senior Chase Brenner, who mans a corner spot on defense.

Sophomore Adam Tonsfeldt has been slotted to start the season at quarterback while also playing corner, as the Trojans look to replace two-year starter Caleb Stetz. Tonsfeldt has a world of athletic talent and is extremely intelligent, making him a great fit to lead the team at that position.

Three senior players, who return after not playing last season, have high hopes of helping their teammates to a successful season. Kellen Hinsz is back to lead the defense at the safety position and helping out anywhere possible on offense. Gabe Dent will be filling in a spot on both lines. Nick Detloff takes over the fullback spot and helping out on the defensive line as well.

Eighth-grade athletes Jonny Robideau, Spencer Schumacher and Tate Inniger look to see some time this season.

"We have a solid group of athletes returning from last year's team that saw plenty of playing time," said Strand. "Some of these players have played for a few seasons and will be expected to be our leaders. Seniors Jackson Poepping, Preston Snobl, Chase Brenner and Brooks Martinson had great seasons last year. Add in juniors Hunter Zenzen, Jackson Wahl, Connor Morse and Matt Samuelson, which gives us seven offensive starters returning. Their familiarity with each other should help our early season continuity. We feel Adam Tonsfeldt can take over at quarterback and lead us to many victories. With the additions of Kellen Hinsz, Gabe Dent and Nick Detloff, as well as some talented seniors and underclassmen that have not seen varsity playing time yet, I like how our team is taking shape."

The Trojans have been successful thanks to the coaching and development of players starting at the junior high level and rising up through the system. The continuity attained at these early levels helps speed up the process of possibly playing on Friday nights. The kids have bought into a system of learning, lifting weights, teamwork and wins.

The Trojan program is rich in athletes that fit all four of these parameters, which is why they have high expectations every year about competing for a section

championship.

"Our expectations are the same every season," Strand said. "We expect to be playing in the section championship game and know that Hawley is the team we will need to beat to get there or beyond. Our team outlook is bright. We will need to stay healthy and improve daily, but I think we have the tools to do so. I feel we have the personnel to compete for a district and section championship, but the key is to stay healthy and learn to play together as a team."

Barnesville will once again battle teams in the Midwest District, representing the white division. They will be joined by the Breckenridge Cowboys, Crookston Pirates, Frazee Hornets, Hawley Nuggets, Pelican Rapids Vikings and Roseau Rams.

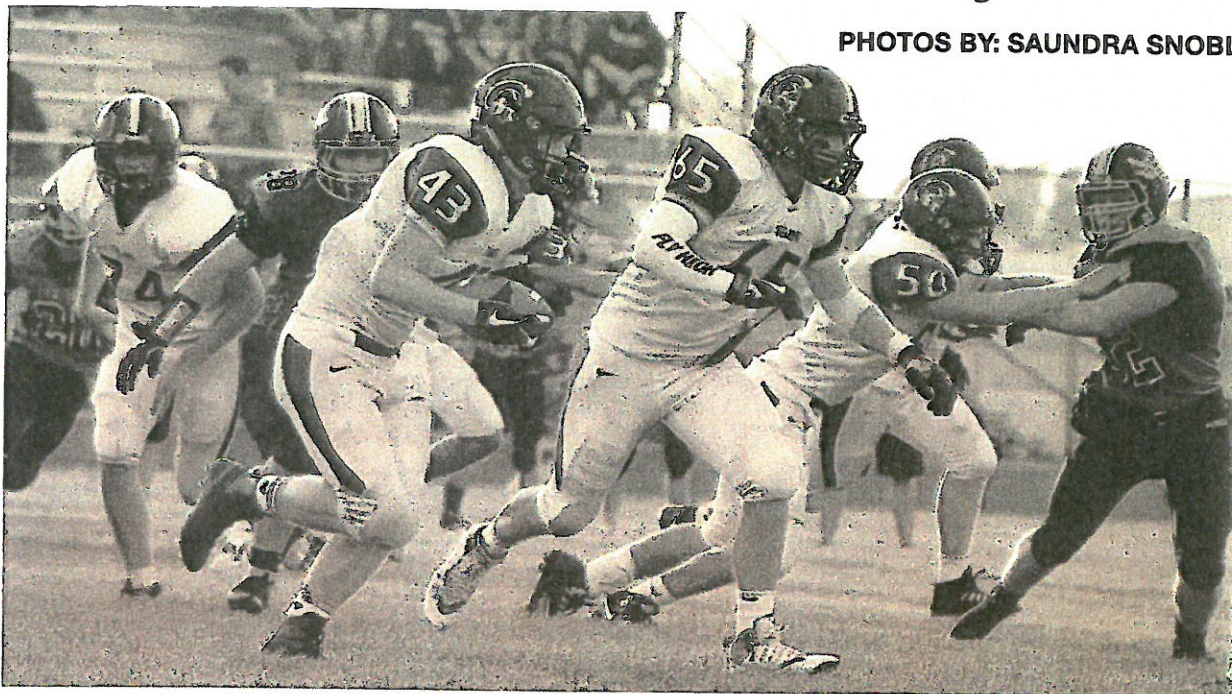
Coach Strand feels that Hawley is the team to beat in the conference and section, and Caledonia is the team to beat for the state title and is the odds-on favorite until somebody figures out exactly how to do that.

# Strong Second Half Leads Trojans To 28-8 Victory

The Barnesville Trojans traveled to Dilworth-Glyndon-Felton to take on the Rebels to open the 2018 football season. The Trojans were not sure how this game would play out after losing their starting quarterback and running back to injuries during the preseason. After an evenly paced first half, the Trojans exploded for 22 unanswered points to win their debut 28-8.

Barnesville's offense looked explosive on their first drive, even with penalties putting the team in precarious spots. Fullback Nick Detloff was gashing the Rebels defense for big chunks of yards up the middle as Barnesville moved the ball down the field. The Trojans would finally hit pay dirt as Chase Brenner took a pitch in from five yards out. The two-point conversion was stopped short giving the Trojans an early 6-0 lead.

The Rebels would answer immediately as they took their opening drive down the field ending on a beautiful 28 yard run from quarterback Aiden Leach. DGF would run another nifty two-point

conversion play that was successful giving the Rebels an 8-6 lead.

Barnesville had one more drive that looked to tally points, but a turnover gave the Rebels the ball back snuffing out the drive. The rest of the half would play out evenly with neither team able to get into the end zone keeping the Rebels up two at the half.

The second half started with DGF on offense, but the kickoff would pin them at their own 10-yard line. Two plays later, Leach rolled out to pass and fumbled the football. The Trojans' Jackson Poepping would recover the ball on the four-yard line putting Barnesville into great position to retake the lead.

Quarterback Preston Snobl would take the first snap into the end zone for a Trojan touchdown. The two-point conversion failed making the score 12-8 Barnesville.

The Trojan defense was starting to turn the tide as they forced the Rebels to lose the ball on a loss of downs on their next possession at the Trojans 43 yard line.

Snobl did most of the damage on the 57 yard touchdown drive

running the ball, with running back Kellen Hinsz adding in a 13 yard run and Detloff finishing off the drive with a 17 yard touchdown scamper. Barnesville finally tallied their two-point conversion on a pass from Snobl to Brenner giving the Trojans a 20-8 lead.

The defense would continue to shine as Snobl snared an interception on the next series, as the ball hit off a Rebel shoulder pad and bounced high in the air. Snobl grabbed it at the 32-yard line and rambled to the 49.

Barnesville was asserting their presence and kept it going as Brenner mixed in a 13 yard run to start the drive and finished it off with a 17 yard touchdown catch from quarterback Sam Askegaard on a beautifully thrown ball. Snobl finished off the two-point conversion run that made the score 28-8 early in the fourth quarter.

Both teams entered their reserves and played it out to a draw giving Barnesville a season opening victory by the score of 28-8 making it three straight victories over the Rebels.

"After losing arguably two of our

best players in the preseason, I was a bit concerned coming into week one against the Rebels," said Head Coach Bryan Strand. "They are well coached and we do not match up well with their speed and height. We made way too many mental mistakes in the first half and had too many penalties, but we did not break.

"We got on the scoreboard first, but DGF answered to take the lead. We had a chance to score in the second quarter, but turned the ball over and went to the half down two points. We discussed that we are in a great spot and are in excellent shape so we expect to clean things up and win the second half," Strand continued.

The second play from scrimmage we created a turnover that changed the momentum of the game. We scored on the first play taking the lead and never looked back.

"I was most impressed with our defense as we held DGF to 42 yards rushing and 120 yards passing. The kids played hard from start to finish. We still have a lot to work on, but I was very pleased with their performance. Hunter Anderson, Preston Snobl and Brooks Martinson shined on the defensive side of the ball with Snobl, Nick Detloff and Chase Brenner having excellent games on offense. Our offensive line also had a great game. I was very impressed with our grit and determination. We will continue to work to get better," Coach Strand concluded.

Offensively, the Trojans were led by Detloff who tallied 144 yards rushing on 14 carries with one score, while Snobl added 82 yards on 15 carries and a score.

Hinsz added 22 yards rushing on two carries with Brenner netting

16 yards on nine carries and one touchdown, while adding one reception for 17 yards and another score. Askegaard finished 1-2 with a 17-yard touchdown pass.

Defensively the Trojans were led by Hunter Anderson who tallied 10

tackles and caused a fumble, with Joey Mark netting six tackles, two for loss, a fumble recovery and a sack.

Hunter Zenzen also had six tackles with two for loss and a sack with Connor Morse netting six tackles and two tackles on kicks.

Martinson chipped in seven tackles with one for loss, while Poepping added four tackles, a fumble recovery and a sack. Snobl finished the game with nine tackles and an interception.

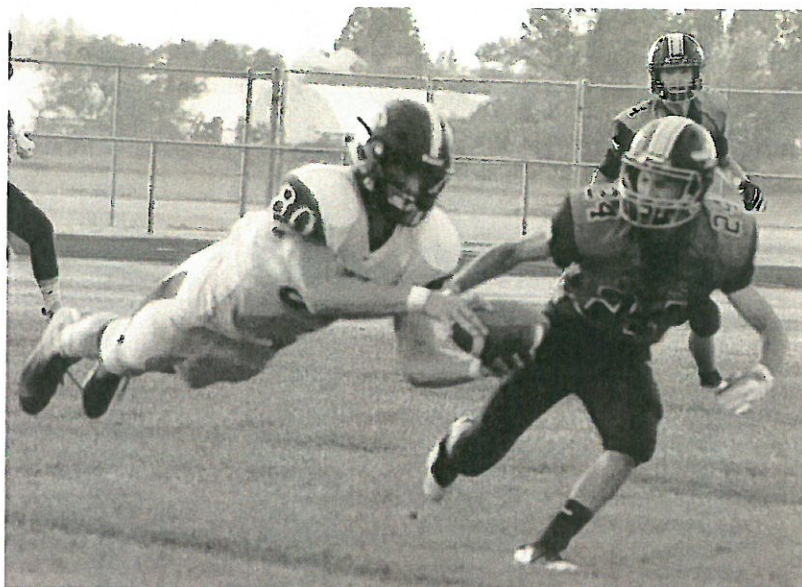
The Trojans finished with 277 yards of total offense with 266 coming on the ground and 11 through the air, while the Rebels finished with 162 yards of total offense.

# Trojan Defense Shuts Out Frazee Hornets 28-0

The Barnesville Trojans had their second consecutive road game to start the 2018 season as they traveled to Frazee to take on the Hornets on Friday, September 7. After a scoreless first quarter, the Trojans tallied a pair of second quarter touchdowns that propelled them to a 28-0 conference victory.

The Trojans opened up their first series with a pair of first down runs from Kellen Hinsz before the Hornets stopped Barnesville on fourth down to take over on downs.

This is how the first quarter would play out as neither defense was giving up much yardage and forcing punts.

Barnesville would catch a break when the Hornets were called for

a roughing the punter penalty that kept a drive alive and resulted in a Nick Detloff 31-yard touchdown run a few plays later. The two-point conversion pass from Sam Askegaard to Chase Brenner was good making the score 8-0 Trojans.

Frazee would mount a small drive that was finally stopped on downs and two plays later, running back Hunter Anderson would bust off a long run of 72 yards before being caught by a Hornet player who punched the ball loose. Frazee would recover the ball at the nine-yard line to negate the potential score.

Frazee had a nice drive going when the Trojans forced a fumble that was recovered by Preston Snobl at the Hornets 45 yard line with time running down in the half.

Barnesville would put together a few nice runs to move the ball to the 29 yard line before Askegaard connected with Snobl on a long touchdown pass for the Trojans second score of the game. The extra point play was stopped on a sack making the score 14-0, which is how the half would end.

The second half started with a Snobl 57 yard kickoff return setting the Trojans up in great field position. The five play drive ended with a Detloff six-yard touchdown run. The two-point conversion run was good as Brenner waltzed into the end zone for a 22-0 lead.

A turnover would negate another scoring opportunity for the Trojans but the team would net one more score in the fourth quarter as Hinsz

took a handoff on a reverse, made a few nice cuts and raced into the end zone from 33 yards out for his first varsity touchdown. The two-point run was not good making the score 28-0. Both teams would play out the rest of the game with their substitutes with neither team able to get into the end zone as the game came to an end.

"Frazee played a very physical game, but I thought we improved on our mistakes from the first week with the exception of our turnovers," stated Head Coach Bryan Strand. "We seemed hesitant to start the game, but executed much better starting in the second quarter. Nick Detloff got us on the scoreboard with a 31-yard run and our defense continued to shine as they stopped the Hornets getting us the ball back. We got a touchdown pass right before the half from Sam Askegaard to Preston Snobl that put us up by 14 points and seemed to deflate Frazee.

Our defense was lights out, led by Hunter Zenzen who was pressuring the quarterback relentlessly as we secured a shut out. We have some areas to clean up in the defensive backfield, but I was very pleased

with our play overall.

We need to get ready for our first home game against WCA and will work to improve on both sides of the ball with a great week of practice."

Detloff was the workhorse once again, netting 15 carries for 139 yards and two touchdowns, with Anderson adding three carries for 72 yards. Hinsz added four carries for 49 yards and a touchdown, with Brenner netting seven carries for 40 yards.

Snobl finished with two carries for 10 yards and one reception for 29 yards and a score, with Askegaard completing one of three passes and a touchdown.

As a team, the Trojans finished with 378 total yards of offense, netting 348 yards on the ground and 29 yards through the air. They held the Hornets to 125 total yards with 78 yards rushing and 47 yards receiving.

Snobl led the defense with seven tackles, three for loss, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery, with Zenzen netting seven tackles, four for loss and a sack.

Brady Kroll added five tackles, one for loss and a sack, with Brooks

Martinson chipping in five tackles and a forced fumble, while Anderson tallied five tackles and a tackle on a kick.

Barnesville's record now stands at 2-0 on the season. They will play host to West Central Area on Friday, September 14 in their home opener.

The Barnesville Trojans finally were finally able to play on their home turf after two straight road games to start the season. West Central Area/Ashby came to town and left with a 38-14 loss to the Trojans.

The Trojans got on their new

scoreboard quickly as a nine-play drive after the opening kickoff was finished off with a 17-yard touchdown run from Kellen Hinsz. Hunter Anderson was the recipient from a pass from Preston Snobl netting the two-point conversion for a quick 8-0 lead.

Late in the second quarter, corner back Adam Tonsfeldt, who returned from a broken finger to intercept a pass, cast an all, stopped the next WCA drive to send both teams into the half with the Trojans leading 24-0.

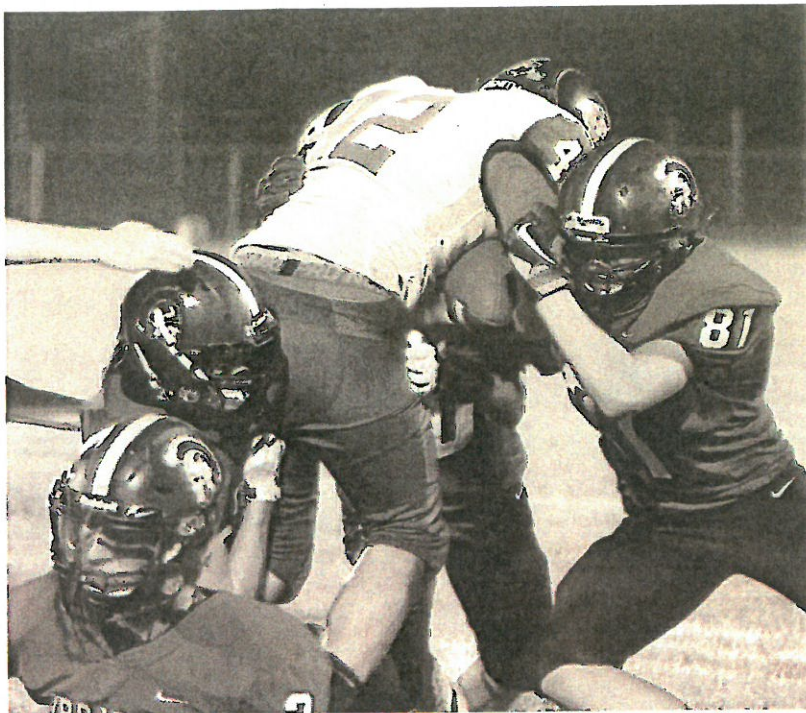
The second half started with the Trojans stopping the Knights and forcing a punt. It would only take three plays to cover 60 yards before Barnesville found the end zone as Snobl finished off a 22 yard run for the score. Brenner would take the pitch to net the two-point conversion making the score 32-0.

Barnesville would add one more score as Brenner took a hand off and raced 24 yards for the last score for the Trojans. The PAT was blocked making the score 38-0 as the fourth quarter was about to begin.

The Knights would put up two scores in the fourth quarter but the outcome had been decided making the final score 38-14 giving the Trojans another convincing victory.

Snobl had four rushes for 29 yards and a score with Hinsz netting two carries for 23 yards and a touchdown. Jacob Morgan got one carry for 32 yards.

Askegaard finished with four completions in five attempts for 54 yards and a touchdown, with Snobl adding two catches for 40 yards and a score and Hunter Zenzen netting two catches for 14 yards.

As a team, the Trojans finished with 429 total yards netting 375 yards on the ground and 54 through the air. Barnesville held WCA to 257 total yards with 87 rushing and 170 yards passing.

Brooks Martinson led the defense with nine tackles (5 solo, 4 assist) and a tackle on a kick with Snobl adding seven tackles (3s,4a), including one for loss and an interception. Tonsfeldt tallied six tackles (3s,3a), one for loss and an interception in his first game back from his injury, with Joey Mark adding 11 tackles (3s,8a) including one for loss.

Zenzen added seven tackles (2s,5a) with Brady Kroll netting three tackles (2s,1a) and Hinsz adding five tackles (2s,3a) and a tipped pass.

Barnesville improved their record to 3-0 on the season. They will host Pelican Rapids in their next game on Friday, September 21.

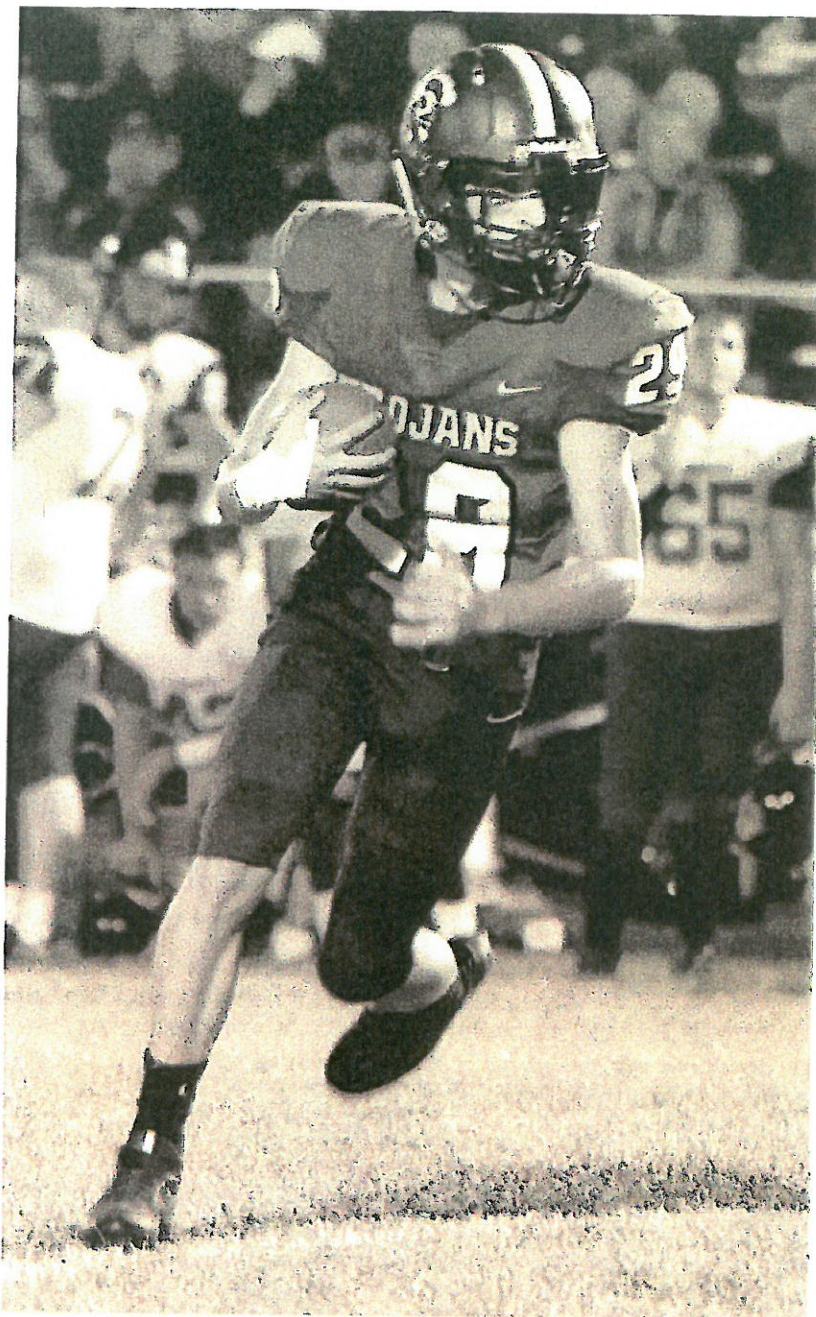

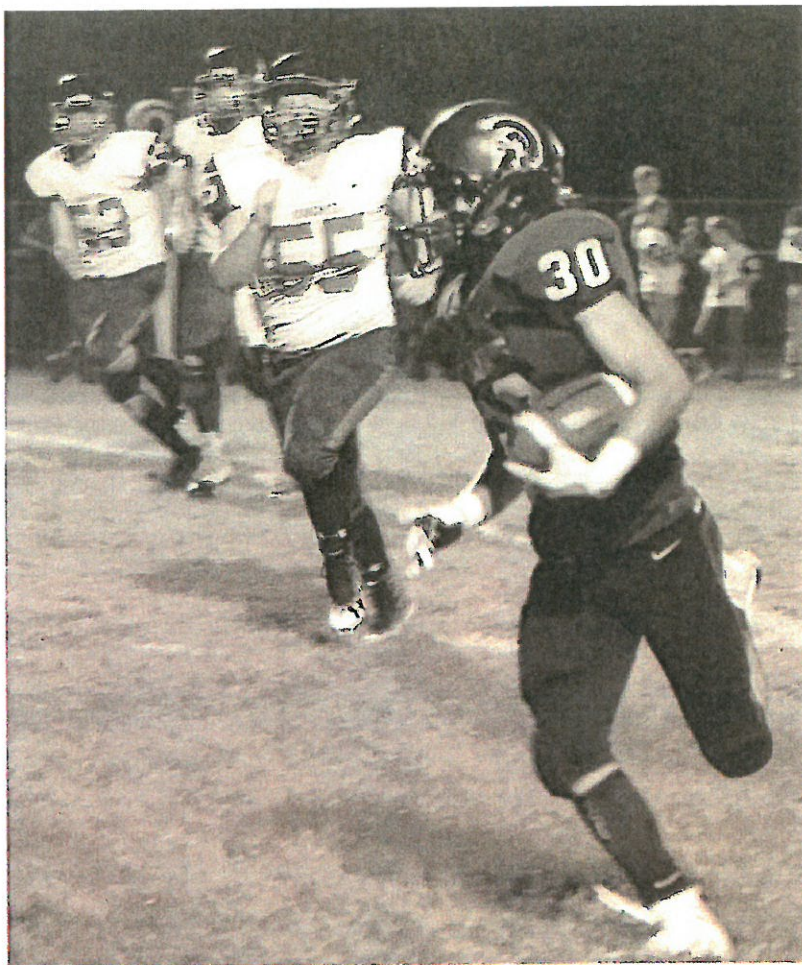

The Barnesville Trojans have been playing some pretty good defense lately and Friday night's game was more of the same as the Trojans produced a shut out of Pelican Rapids by the score of 53-0, holding the Vikings to 49 total yards of offense.

The Trojans took the opening kickoff and marched it down the field, albeit with some great adlib plays by quarterback Preston Snobl off miscues with the snap. The drive would culminate with a 24-yard touchdown pass from Snobl to Hunter Zenzen. Chase Brenner would add the two-point conversion run for an 8-0 lead.

The defense forced a quick three and out punt that gave the Trojans the ball on the 43-yard line. Snobl found Zenzen to start the drive with another pass covering 19 yards. The two-point conversion pass was complete as Snobl found Brenner making the score 16-0.

Barnesville would add one more score in the first quarter when Brenner returned the Vikings punt 65 yards for the touchdown. Hunter Anderson ran in the two-point conversion that increased Barnesville's lead to 24-0.

The second quarter was more of the same as the Trojan defense stopped Pelican Rapids in four plays giving the offense the ball again. This time quarterback Sam Askegaard found Zenzen on a 27-yard pass for the score. The two-point conversion run was not good making the score 30-0.

After another great defensive stand by the Trojans, Askegaard would connect with Snobl on another touchdown pass, this time from 11 yards out. Brenner would convert the two-point conversion run for a 38-0 lead. Brenner would end the half with a beautiful over the shoulder interception that he returned to midfield before being

tackled sending both teams into intermission.

The Vikings would get the ball to start the second half and on the first play, Snobl would make a great read from his linebacker position to undercut a slant pass, intercepting the ball and racing untouched into the end zone from 39 yards out. Snobl would add the two-point conversion run that made the score 46-0.

With both team agreeing to running time, the rest of the game went by quickly. Barnesville reserves would add one last touchdown as freshman Cameron Heng showed his impressive speed in cruising to the end zone on a 28 yard run. Snobl would kick the extra point for their first successful try of the season that made the score 53-0 which is how the game would end.

Snobl tallied 44 yards passing, completing all three passes including a touchdown, while adding 25 yards on five rushes, one reception for 11 yards and a score and securing a defensive touchdown with his interception.

Hinsz finished the game with 26 yards rushing on three carries and a score, with Heng adding a touchdown on two carries that covered 30 yards.

Anderson tallied one carry for 23 yards, with Wyatt Roller toting the ball six times for 13 yards, while Askegaard completed two of three passes for 38 yards and two scores.

Offensively, Barnesville tallied 319 total yards with 237 yards rushing and 82 yards passing, while defensively, the Trojans held Pelican Rapids to 49 total yards of offense with 39 yards on the ground and 10 yards passing while producing three turnovers.

Adam Tonsfeldt led the defense with six tackles, one tackle for loss, one fumble recovery and three tackles on kicks with Snobl netting six tackles and a touchdown scoring interception.

Joey Mark added five tackles, with Aaron Schiefert netting four tackles and a tackle on a kick and Brenner netting two tackles and an interception. Matt Samuelson provided the Trojans only sack of the game.

"I thought we had good intensity

to start the game again this week," said Head Coach Bryan Strand. "We started off slow but turned it around quickly on offense and our defense was very good all night long. We hit very hard, followed our assignments very well and tackled better than we have all season.

We limited our penalties this week and executed much better on offense. We came away with the win and stayed healthy. Everyone that dressed got into the game to get some varsity experience.

This week we travel to Roseau and hope to get Jackson Poepping back from his injury.

The boys are playing well, but we still have things we can improve on. We have some tough games coming

up in the next few weeks so we have to keep improving every day."

Barnesville record now stands at 4-0 on the season. The Trojans will travel to Roseau to take on the Rams on Friday, September 28.

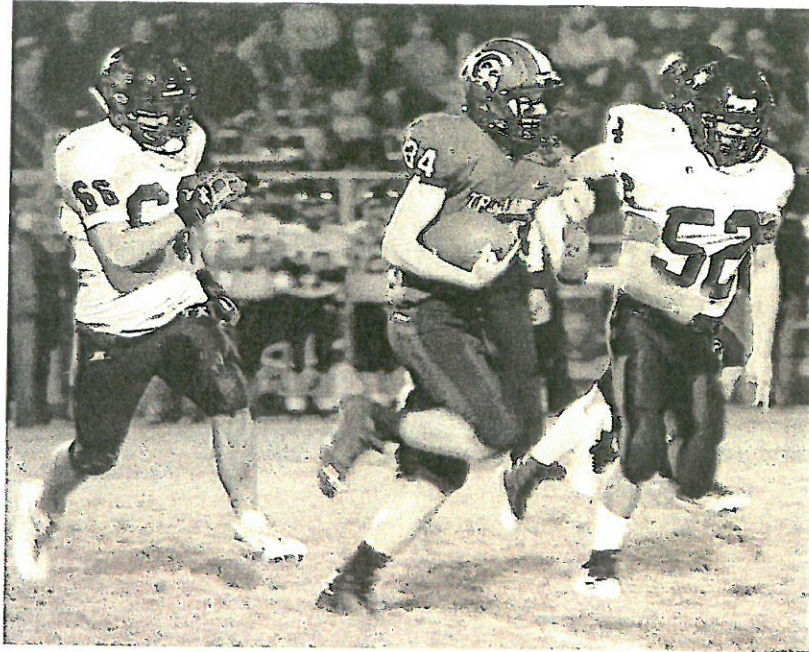

# Preston Snobl Leads Trojans Past Roseau 32-6

Sometimes winning games is not pretty, but a win is still a win. The Barnesville Trojans will not get style points for this victory, but they also will not give it back, as the Trojans made the long trek on a cold night to Roseau and came home with a 32-6 victory.

Barnesville was starting a new quarterback in Sam Askegaard and getting the services back of starting center Jackson Poepping from a broken finger, so expectations were high. Unfortunately, the fumble bug reared its ugly head to start this game causing some angst amongst coaches, players and fans.

The Trojans could not get any offense going as their fumbles or bad exchanges derailed their drives. Roseau would finally break open

on the scoreboard when Ben Olson broke through the line and found a hole, waltzing into the end zone untouched from 35 yards out for a score. The extra point was not good as the Rams had an early 6-0 lead.

Barnesville finally found pay dirt in the second quarter as Preston Snobl was reinserted at quarterback and threw a 12-yard touchdown pass to Hunter Zenzen. Snobl would add the two-point conversion giving the Trojans an 8-6 lead.

On their next possession, running back Kellen Hinsz would take a run 12 yards into the end zone for another touchdown. Snobl would connect with Chase Brenner for the two-point conversion giving Barnesville a 16-6 lead that would hold up as both teams went into intermission.

The Trojans got the ball to start the second half and quickly fumbled, giving Roseau great field position inside the 20-yard line. After marching the ball down to the one, the Trojans put on a goal line stand and regained possession after stopping the Rams on all four downs.

The defensive stand was huge, as a score would have cut the lead to less than four points. The Trojans could not net another score until the beginning of the fourth quarter when Snobl scored from two yards out. He then found Brenner for the two-point conversion pass that made the score 24-6.

Barnesville would add one more score late in the game as Snobl found Brenner for a one-yard touchdown pass. Hunter Anderson would add the two-point conversion run that

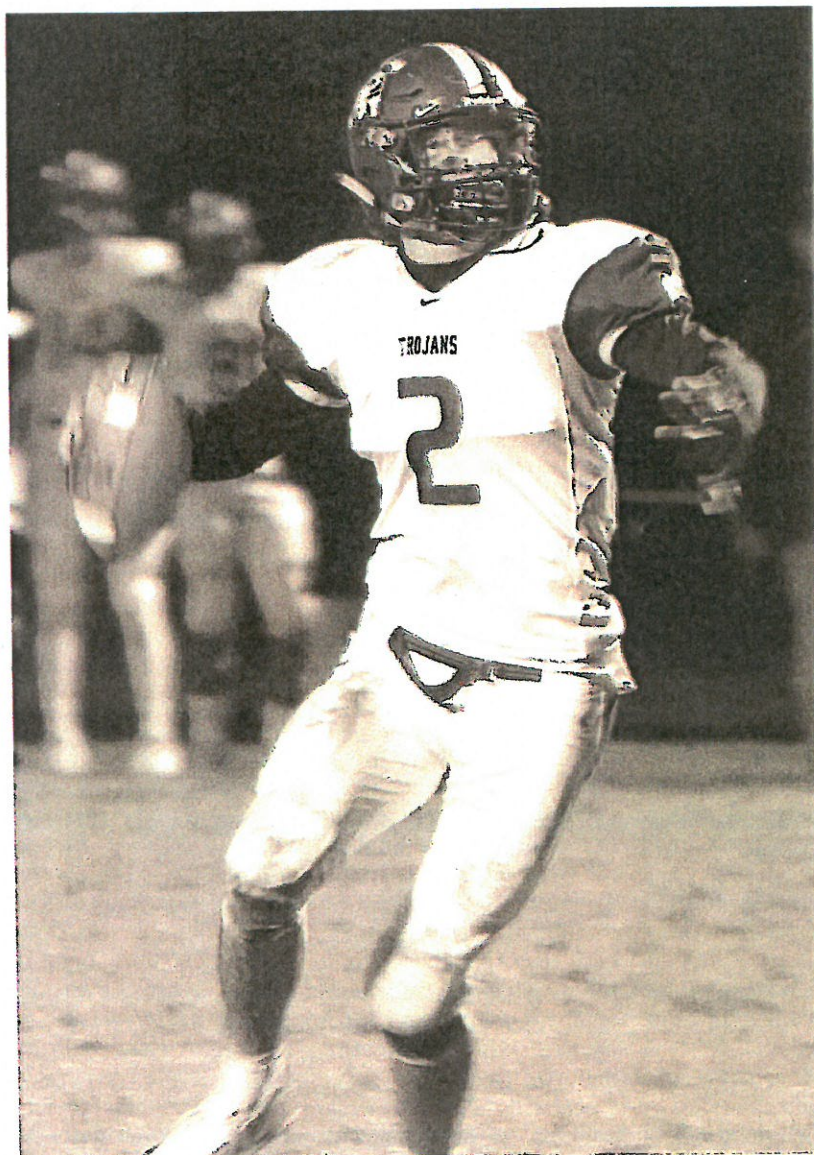
made the score 32-6, which is how the game would end.

"We had a heck of an issue holding onto the ball tonight coming out of center," said Head Coach Bryan Strand. "I am not sure if it was getting our starting center back, who is snapping left handed or the cold conditions. But we put the ball on the ground at least nine times and lost three of them. Defensively, we came out and shut them down on their first two drives until we had some breakdowns on their third drive that allowed the Rams to score a touchdown. We got ourselves settled, fixed our issue and moved on.

The biggest issue we had was the wasted plays on offense. We cannot do that and expect to win games. We were sloppy with the ball and not crisp. We have tough games coming up and will need to be sharp to be successful. But a win is a win and we will take it."

Snobl was the offensive catalyst that seemed to get the Trojans' ship righted when he entered at quarterback. He led the team to 32 points, netting 66 yards rushing on 14 carries with a touchdown, while adding eight completions in 11 attempts for 81 yards and two scores. He also had a hand in two of the two-point conversions.

Nick Detloff finished with 89 yards on 11 carries, with Chase Brenner netting 70 yards rushing on nine carries, while adding two receptions for 10 yards and a score.

Anderson finished with three carries for 26 yards and one catch for 10 yards, with Hinsz adding three carries for 17 yards and one touchdown, while adding a reception covering 12 yards. Zenzen tallied four receptions for 49 yards and a score, giving the Trojans 344 total yards of offense with 263 coming on the ground and 81 through the air.

Defensively, the Trojans held the Rams to 123 total yards with 112 coming on the ground and 11 in the air.

Zenzen was the leader on the defensive side of the ball netting 10 tackles (8 solo, 2 assist) including one for loss, with Brooks Martinson adding six tackles (4s, 2a) with one for loss.

Connor Morse added five tackles (3s, 2a) one for loss and a tackle on a kick, with Snobl adding five tackles (4s, 1a) including one for loss. Adam Tonsfeldt tallied five tackles (2s, 3a) with Matt Samuelson netting six tackles (2s, 4a) including one for loss, while Brenner corralled the only interception of the game.

The Trojans record now stands at 5-0 on the season. They will face Crookston next Friday, October 5 on Homecoming.

# Trojan Defense Continues To Shine In 28-0 Shut Out Of Crookston

The Barnesville Trojans hosted the Crookston Pirates on Homecoming Week and quickly jumped out to an early lead before riding their defense to their third shut out of the season with a 28-0 victory on Friday, October 5.

The Trojans opened up the game on defense and after surrendering a long pass, the defense stiffened. Crookston's shotgun snap went off the hands of their quarterback and was recovered by defensive end, Hunter Zenzen at the Trojans 46-yard line.

It only took the Trojans three plays before fullback Nick Detloff took the hand off at the 27-yard line and raced up the middle untouched for the score. Chase Brenner took the two-point conversion pitch into

the end zone for an 8-0 lead.

Crookston's second possession saw another errant snap go over the head of the quarterback. A mad scramble ensued and when the dust settled, linebacker, Brooks Martinson recovered the ball on the seven-yard line.

However, the Trojans would give the ball back a few plays later when quarterback, Adam Tonsfeldt and Brenner could not handle a fake attempt that came loose and was recovered by the Pirates, negating a scoring threat.

Crookston would net a first down but the Trojans defense would step up and shine again as defensive tackle Matt Samuelson provided pressure on the quarterback causing a quick throw that safety, Kellen Hinsz stepped in front of to make

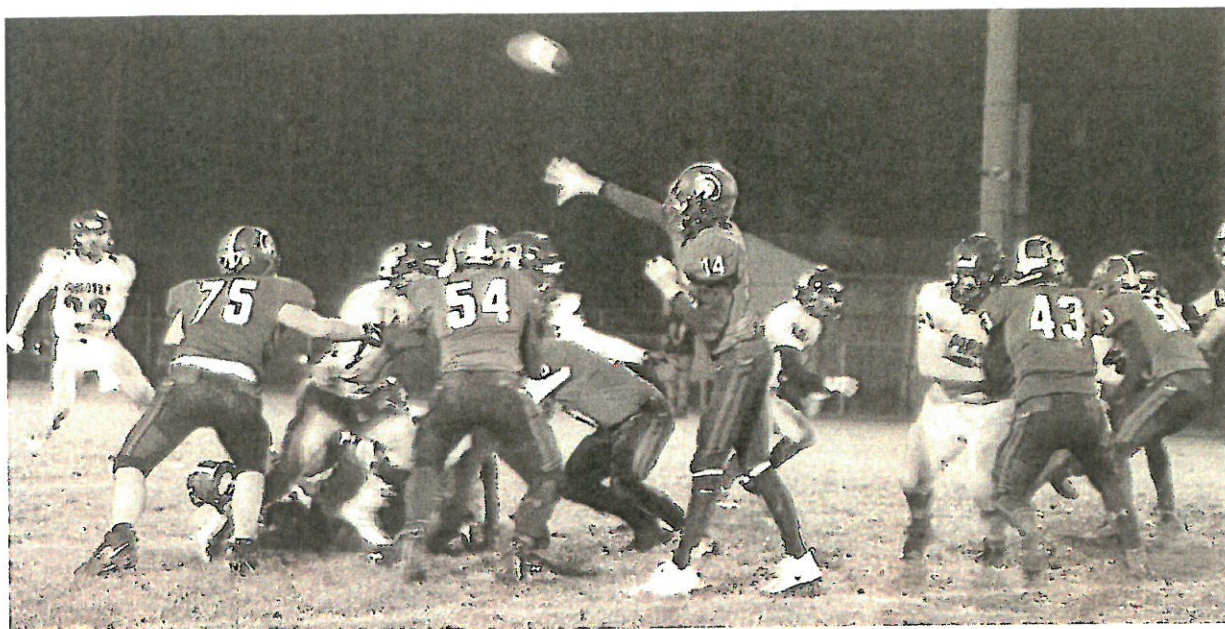
his first varsity interception, giving Barnesville great field position again at their 40 yard line.

After a 20-yard run by Detloff, and a nice pass from Tonsfeldt to Hunter Zenzen, Tonsfeldt would net a one-yard touchdown run for the Trojan's second score of the game. Brenner would add the two-point conversion giving Barnesville a 16-0 lead.

On their next possession, Tonsfeldt connected on a long pass to tight end, Grant Inniger covering 33 yards, putting the ball on the 12-yard line. After getting the ball to the one, Hinsz would take a sweep and run in for the touchdown. The two-point conversion run was no good, making the score 22-0 Barnesville.

The Trojans would net one more offensive possession in the first half,

with another Tonsfeldt to Inniger long pass covering 35 yards moving the ball down the field. Barnesville managed to get the ball to the five-yard line, but penalties and a fumble stalled the drive, with the fourth down touchdown pass negated as Zenzen was ruled out of bounds turning the ball over on downs, which is how the half would end.

The second half would start with a bang, as Preston Snobl would secure the ball on the 26-yard line and race up the middle of the field without a Crookston defender touching him for a 74-yard kickoff return touchdown. The two-point conversion pass failed making the score 28-0 in favor of Barnesville.

However the second half was filled with mistakes on the offensive side of the ball. After an 11 yard run by Hinsz got the ball to the three-yard line, the Trojans fumbled the next play, before missing a wide-open Snobl for a touchdown pass that was knocked down by a Crookston defender. The next snap was a fumble again, this time recovered by the Pirates negating a third drive for the Trojans inside the five-yard line.

But the defense was not going to let the Pirates get anything going this game forcing another punt. However, Crookston faked the punt and returned it to midfield. That would be their only highlight as Barnesville's defense again rose to the challenge as Zenzen forced a fumble that was recovered by cornerback Adrian O'Brien for

another Trojan takeaway.

In what would become a turnover fest as both teams struggled to keep the ball in their hands, in the rain and sloppy field conditions. The Trojans, Inniger would come up with an interception of a Crookston pass to get the ball back to Barnesville. However, both teams fumbled the ball numerous times on their ensuing offensive possessions in what became a sloppy ending to the game.

When the final horn sounded, the Trojans had secured another shut out victory by the score of 28-0, setting up a heavyweight tilt next Friday at Hawley as the Trojans travel to take on the Nuggets.

"It was a wet and slippery night and that showed as both teams had trouble holding onto the football," said Head Coach Bryan Strand. "Adam Tonsfeldt started at quarterback for the first time this

year and played fairly well. He had some nice passes and scored a touchdown. We also got scores from Nick Detloff and Kellen Hinsz, as well as a kickoff return by Preston Snobl for a score. We fumbled the ball too many times in the second half and will need to clean that up. We travel to Hawley to take on the Nuggets who have a very talented team. We cannot put the ball on the ground on Friday night. The weather for the game is going to be cold and could be raining again. But, I am looking forward to a great game."

Detloff led the rushing yards category netting 101 yards on eight carries including a score, with Tonsfeldt netting 45 yards on 12 carries and a touchdown, while adding four completions in seven attempts for 93 yards passing.

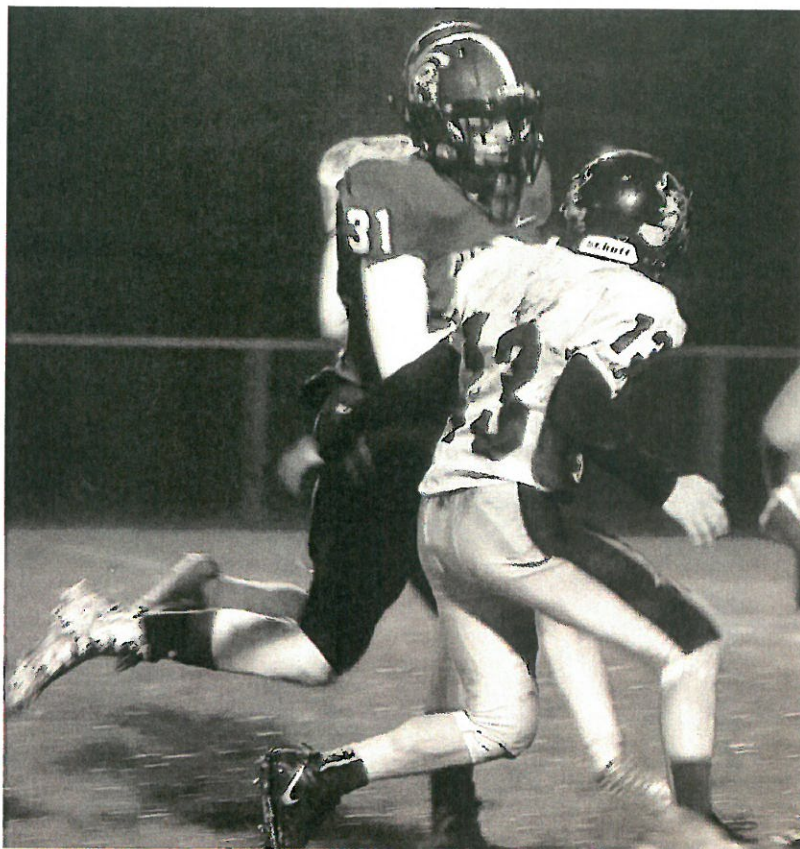
Brenner added 38 yards on eight carries, with Hinsz netting 27 yards rushing on five carries and a score. Hunter Anderson tallied 13 yards on three carries with Snobl netting nine yards on two carries. Aaron Schiefert had one carry for 15 yards and Jacob Morgan added one carry for 11 yards.

Crookston tallied 103 yards of total offense with 57 yards rushing and 46 passing as the Trojan defense forced five turnovers.

Zenzen tallied seven tackles (two solo and five assisted), three for loss, a tackle on a kick, a fumble recovery, a caused fumble and a sack, while Brooks Martinson had eight tackles (4s,4a), two for loss and a fumble recovery.

Snobl added 10 tackles (4s,6a) with one for loss and a tackle on a kick, with Joey Mark netting four tackles (4s) one for loss and a

# Hawley Wins Battle For Lee's Paddle Over Trojans



The match-up between the Trojans and the Nuggets have been highly anticipated throughout the season. It did not disappoint fans as a single point separated the teams after a hard fought game. A rematch in the tournaments at the dome is a real possibility.

In a battle of the area's two heavy weight football rivals, Hawley and Barnesville squared off in round two for the Battle for Lee's Paddle. In a hard fought, back and forth contest, Hawley would end up prevailing by the score of 19-18 to win the Paddle for the second straight year.

The Nuggets received the opening kickoff and were forced to punt where the first big play of the game would take place. The punt was muffed by Barnesville's Chase Brenner and recovered by the Nuggets' Noah Glad at the Trojan 30 yard line. A handful of plays later, quarterback, Jacob Vetter would score the game's first touchdown on a one-yard run. The extra point by Chase Libak, which would be significant in the final score, was good for a quick 7-0 lead.

The next big play happened on the ensuing kickoff as the Trojans' Preston Snobl corralled the low kick at his 20-yard line and was off to the races for an 80-yard touchdown. The two-point conversion was stopped short of the goal line keeping the

lead in Hawley's favor 7-6.

The Trojans defense forced another Nugget punt and the offense was finally on the field. In a nice time consuming drive that used up the first quarter, Barnesville found pay dirt early to start the second as Brenner took a hand off, off left tackle and behind some outstanding blocking. He found a hole to his liking and was off for a 23 yard touchdown run. The two-point conversion pass failed making the score 12-7 Barnesville.

The kickoff would produce the next big play as a loose ball was recovered by the Trojans Adrian O'Brien at the Nugget 15 yard line. A fantastic run of 13 yards was nullified by a chop block penalty that backed Barnesville up to the 30-yard line. Brenner and Kellen Hinsz would take a few runs to get the ball back to the 11-yard line where Barnesville faced fourth down. They opted to go for the score. The play worked as well as could be hoped, but the receiver could not corral the ball, turning the ball over on downs.

A short punt gave the Trojans

the ball on the Nugget 33 yard line. Another short field to work with, but Barnesville could not capitalize as the Nugget defense forced a 24 yard field goal attempt by Snobl that was wide left. These two possessions deep in Nugget territory that resulted in zero points would be crucial at games end.

Hawley would take over the ball on the 20 yard line and quickly hit a big play as Vetter found running back Treyton Cossette for 40 yard pass play that was well covered by Barnesville's Adam Tonsfeldt. But Cossette managed to make the catch, giving the Nuggets some steam.

After getting the ball to the 20-yard line, Vetter found his tight end, Hunter Magnusson, open down the seam for a touchdown pass with less than a minute to go in the half. The two-point conversion run was stopped making the score 13-12 Hawley as both teams went into halftime.

Barnesville would open the second half with the ball and drive it down to the Nugget 35 yard line, where Tonsfeldt took the snap and



ran off the right side of his offensive line, finding a hole and racing in for the score. The two-point conversion run was stopped making the score 18-13 for the Trojans.

The Trojan defense made a quick stop, forcing a punt and had the momentum, when a fumble, recovered by Hawley at their 45 yard, line changed that.

Vetter found Libak on a beautiful out and up as Libak made a diving reception at the one yard line. Vetter would take in the next play for a touchdown that made the score 19-18 after the PAT kick was missed.

The fourth quarter saw both teams move the ball but neither team could get it into the end zone. The Nuggets got the ball back with just over six minutes left in the game and never gave the ball back to Barnesville. They converted a pair of third down passes to keep the chains moving and ended the game with a fourth down hard count that got the Trojans to jump offsides, essentially ending the game with Hawley winning by the score of 19-18.

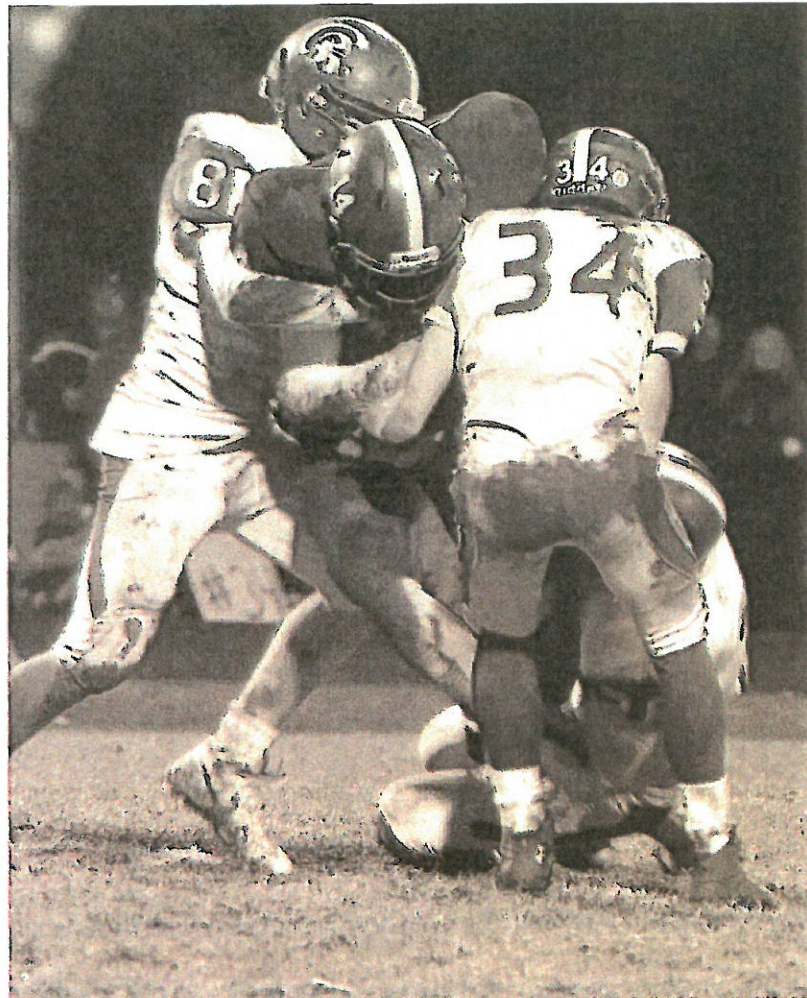
"This game went pretty much how I expected," stated Head Coach Bryan Strand. "It was a close game and a couple of small things made the biggest difference tonight.

"The muddy field did not help our speed and our running game at all, but it sure did not seem to affect their passing game. It was a good contest between two fairly equal teams. The difference on the night was the made extra point by Hawley and our inability to convert any of our three, two-point conversions. I was

very proud of how we battled the entire night. It was a great football game. The kids played hard. Hats off to Coach Naatz and the Hawley players as they played a great game. I hope we can get another shot at

them in the section finals," Strand concluded.

Offensively the Trojans finished with 227 total yards of offense with all of it coming on the ground. Barnesville committed two

turnovers to Hawley's zero and had seven penalties to the Nuggets two.

Nick Detloff led Barnesville with 69 yards rushing on 13 carries, with Tonsfeldt netting 63 yards on 10 carries and a touchdown. Brenner added 55 yards rushing on 10 carries and a score with Kellen Hinsz adding 29 yards on five carries, while Hunter Anderson tallied 11 yards rushing on three carries.

The Nuggets finished with 253 total yards of offense with 181 coming through the air and 72 on the ground.

Brooks Martinson was a stalwart on defense netting 11 tackles (6 solo, 5 assisted), two tackles for loss, a sack and a tackle on a kick, with Anderson adding 8 tackles (2s, 6a), three for loss and a sack.

Hunter Zenzen finished the game with five tackles (4s, 1a) one for loss and a tipped pass, with Snobl netting seven tackles (3s, 4a) with one for loss. Joey Mark finished with six tackles (2s, 4a) with two for loss, with Brady Kroll adding seven tackles (3s, 4a) and Hinsz netting four tackles (3s, 1a) and two tipped passes.

The loss drops the Trojans record to 6-1 on the season. Barnesville

will face Breckenridge in the season finale at home on Wednesday, October 17.

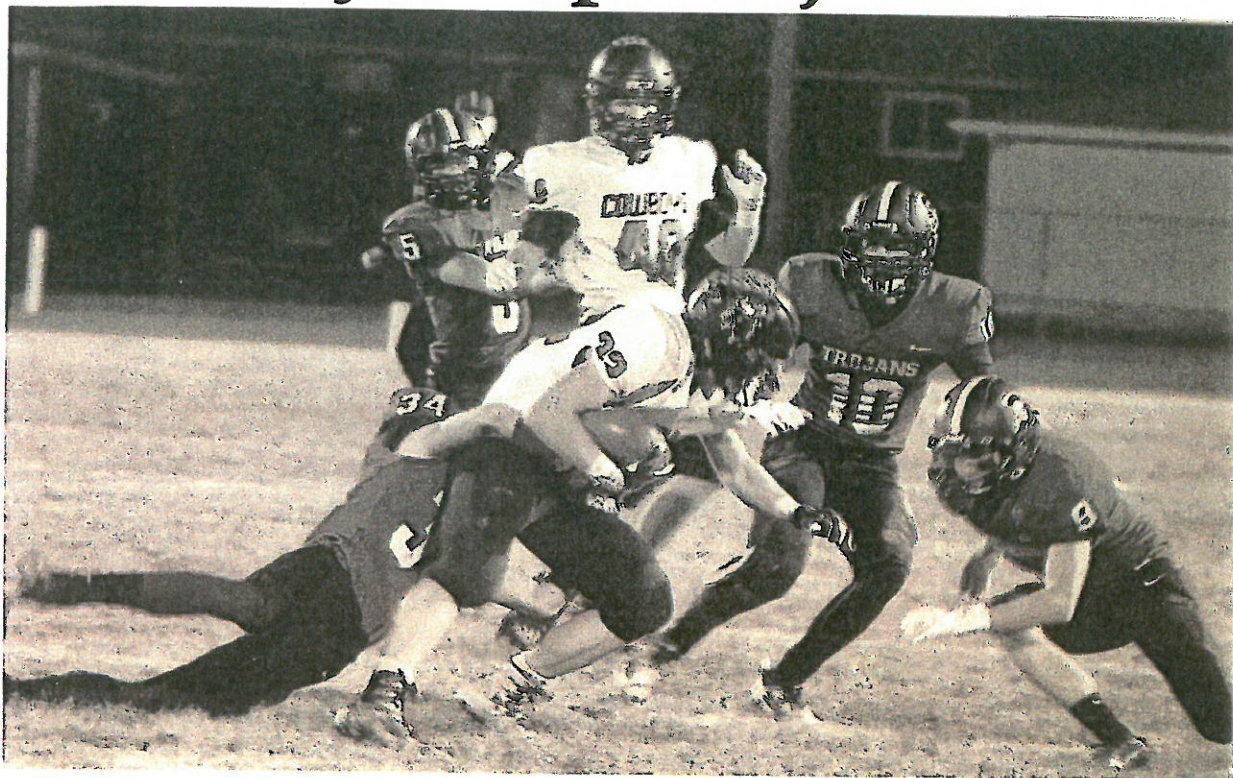

# Turnovers Costly As Cowboys Nip Trojans 21-20

Barnesville committed four costly turnovers that ended up hurting the Trojans as they fell for the second straight week by one point, in their 21-20 loss to Breckenridge.

Barnesville opened up the game with the ball and quickly hit pay dirt as Chase Brenner took a hand off and raced 52 yards for the score. The two-point conversion pass was not good making the score 6-0.

The Trojan defense forced a punt on their first possession of the game, but the punt would change field position for Barnesville for the entire first half as it was downed inside the five-yard line.

The Cowboys would force a punt and get the ball back near midfield. They would hit on a long pass that saw the Trojan cornerback fall to the ground getting the ball down to the 15-yard line. A few plays later fullback, Daniel Erlandson would plow into the end zone from eight yards out. The extra point was good giving the Cowboys a 7-6 lead.

Breckenridge tried a squib kick

that was fielded by Kellen Hinsz at the 32-yard line. After making a nice cut, Hinsz found a hole that allowed him to pick up big yardage. The Cowboys finally got him down at the 18-yard line after a 50-yard return.

The first play saw Tonsfeldt find Nick Detloff for a 15-yard pass play to get the ball to the 3-yard line. Tonsfeldt would take the next carry into the end zone for a touchdown. However, his two-point conversion run was stopped inches short negating points. The Trojans though had retaken a 12-7 lead.

Barnesville's defense thought they had a big play on their next possession, as Hinsz stepped in front of a pass by the Cowboys Cooper Yaggie for an interception. However, a roughing the passer penalty on the Trojans would negate the turnover and keep the ball in Breckenridge's possession.

The Cowboys would make that penalty hurt as they got down to the one-yard line and decided to go for it on fourth down. Hunter Feigum

would blast in for the touchdown to give the lead back to the Cowboys. The extra point was good making the score 14-12.

The Trojans would dodge a bullet as Breckenridge tipped a pass and intercepted the ball deep in Barnesville's territory. But the defense would stiffen and get the ball back on downs.

Barnesville would also stop a Cowboys drive with an interception by Hinsz just before the half would end. On the play, Yaggie would take a big hit leaving the game with an injury that would prove vitally important at the end of the game.

The second half started with the Barnesville defense getting an interception by Brooks Martinson to put the offense back on the field and gain some momentum.

The Trojans put together a nice time consuming drive that culminated in a Preston Snobl one-yard touchdown run to give Barnesville the lead again. The two-point conversion run by Brenner was good making the score 20-14.



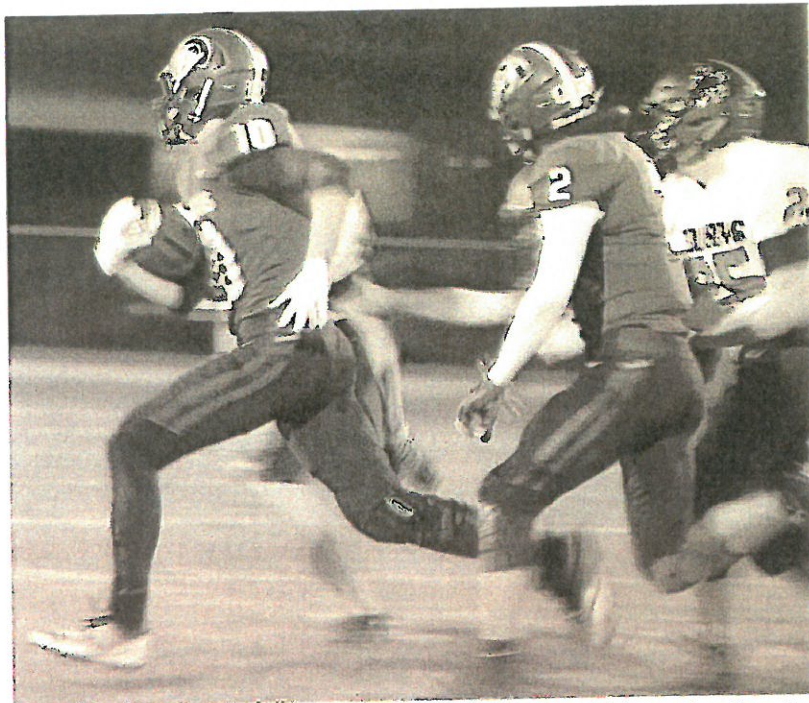
After both teams traded punts on a pair of possessions, the Trojans put together a nice drive that ended in disaster as Tonsfeldt's rollout pass was batted in the air and picked off at the 28 yard line. The Cowboys raced down the field before Detloff made a touchdown saving tackle at the 24.

But momentum had switched once again and the Cowboys would not be denied as backup quarterback, Jack Aigner bounced off a tackle and raced to the end zone for a 19-yard touchdown. The extra point kick was good giving Breckenridge a 21-20 lead, midway through the fourth quarter.

Barnesville got the ball on the 34-yard line and moved the ball to the Cowboys 21, before facing a fourth down play that was intercepted giving the ball back to the Cowboys with less than two minutes to play.

Breckenridge earned a first down, which should have ended the game, but a holding call stopped the clock and then on fourth down, the Cowboys mishandled the snap giving the ball back to Barnesville at the 30-yard line with 45 seconds left to play.

The first play from scrimmage saw Snobl loft a pass to the left corner, where Martinson had a step on his man, but the ball would carom off his hands and end up in the waiting arms of a Cowboy defender to end the Trojans chances of a

comeback victory as Breckenridge pulled off a 21-20 upset win.

"It was a very physical game, but I thought our kids responded well," said Head Coach Bryan Strand. "We made too many mistakes with penalties, which cost us one interception, while throwing four interceptions of our own. We played just bad enough to lose the game."

"I thought the kids played hard all night and had a chance to win the game at the end, but we just could

not pull the ball in. That is the way things go at times.

"We were down two points at the half and made some adjustments on defense. I thought they worked well as the Cowboys did not move the ball as well in the second half until we gave them a short field to work with" Strand continued.

"After netting a defensive stop, we went down the field and scored a touchdown. We added the two-point conversion for a 20-14 lead. We

seemed to be sitting in good position until we threw the momentum changing interception at our 28 yard line that they returned to their 24. We were on our heels but dug in. Looked like we had them stopped but their quarterback broke free of a tackle and scored. The extra point gave them the lead. We got the ball back, but luck was not on our side as a deflected pass at the seven-yard line ended up as an interception. We cannot turn the ball over and think we can win games.

"We have lost two games by a total of two points. We will get better and improve on what we are doing wrong and hopefully we can get healthy as well," Strand concluded.

Brenner led the Trojans with 77 yards rushing on 12 carries, with one touchdown, while Tonsfeldt added 55 yards on 11 carries and a score with one completed pass for 15 yards.

Nick Detloff finished with 48 yards rushing on 14 carries adding one reception for 15 yards, while Hinsz finished with three carries

for 33 yards, with Hunter Anderson netting 12 yards on three carries and Snobl adding three yards on two carries and a score.

As a team, the Trojans tallied 243

yards of total offense with 228 yards coming on the ground and 15 yards through the air.

Defensively, the Trojans gave up 221 total yards of offense with 146

Hinsz tallied five solo tackles and one interception, with Joey Mark netting four tackles (2s,2a), one tackle for loss and two tackles on kicks.

Snobl finished with five tackles (2s,3a), a tackle on a kick and a fumble recovery, with Tonsfeldt adding six tackles (3s,3a) and a tipped pass, while Brady Kroll tallied five tackles (3s,2a) and Anderson added four (3s,1a).

Barnesville will enter the playoffs with a record of 6-2. They will face Frazee on Tuesday, October 23rd in a first round playoff matchup.

# Trojans Crush Frazee 74-22 In First Round Of Playoffs

The Barnesville Trojans were looking to get back into the victory column after dropping two straight games by one point as they hosted the Frazee Hornets in the first round of the Class 8AA playoffs. A 49 point second quarter broke open a close game as the Trojans rolled to a 74-22 victory.

Chase Brenner opened the game with a long kickoff return that got the ball inside the 10-yard line of the Hornets. However, a few penalties and a fumble would be the only blemish on an impressive offensive first half.

After getting the ball back, the Trojans quickly put their first touchdown on the board as Hunter Anderson took in the score from one-yard out. The extra point kick was missed making the score 6-0.

Their next possession saw Anderson take a long run to the four-yard line and Brenner score the touchdown a few plays later with a one-yard run. Connor Morse would connect on the extra point that made the score 13-0.

The Hornets would use some

trickery on their next possession for a big gain, even though the play might have been illegal. Either way, Frazee would connect on a 51 yard pass that was not ruled a penalty with Kellen Hinsz tracking down the receiver to prevent a touchdown.

Frazee would get that score a few plays later as Cole Fleisher connected with Gabe Drewes from 13 yards out. The extra point kick from Vincent Helmers was good making the score 13-7.

Anderson would net another run to get his team down deep into Hornets territory, where Nick Detloff took an inside handoff and ran into the end zone from 13 yards out. Morse knocked down his second PAT that made the score 20-7 Barnesville.

The Trojan defense would quickly strike as Adam Tonsfeldt intercepted a pass at the 40-yard line and had clear sailing all the way to the end zone for a touchdown. Morse would connect on another extra point to quickly make the score 27-7.

Frazee would fumble the ball on their very next offensive play with Barnesville's Brooks Martinson

recovering at the Trojans 30 yard line. One play later, Tonsfeldt would find his tight end, Preston Snobl for a completion with Snobl breaking a tackle and finding the end zone. Morse would make his fourth straight PAT for a 34-7 Trojans lead.

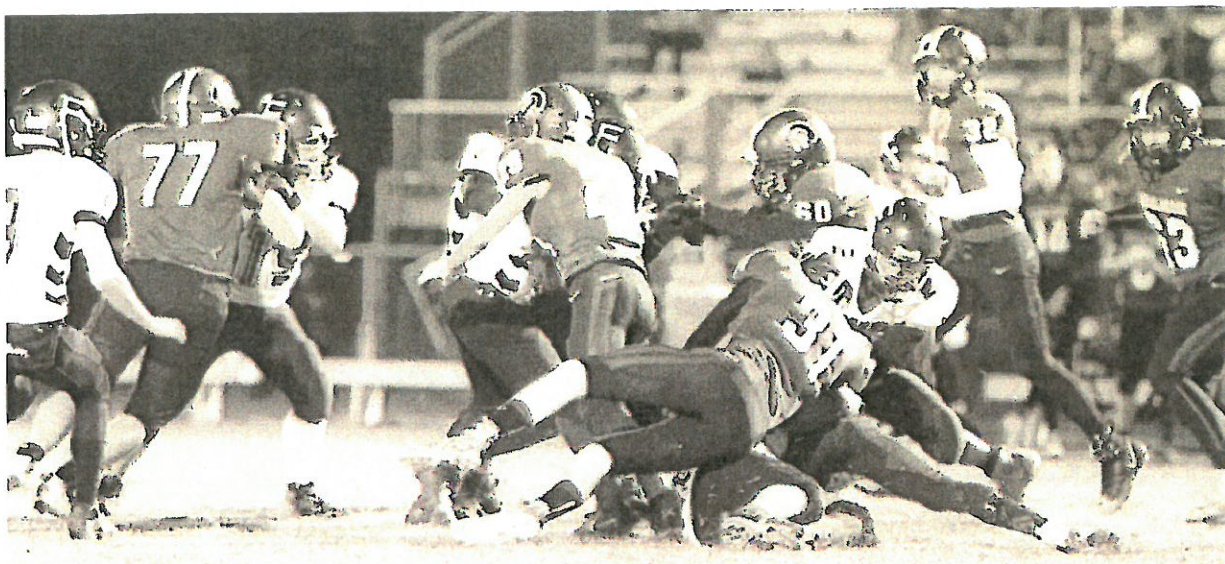
After another trick play saw the Hornets convert a double pass moving the ball deep into Barnesville territory, the Trojans defense would stiffen. Tonsfeldt would once again intercept a pass at the 15-yard line and was off to the races before stumbling and falling down at the 49.

He would quickly make up for the lost yards he may have missed by taking the next carry to the house, scoring a touchdown from 49 yards out. Morse was the man again as he connected on the extra point for a 42-7 advantage.

The next possession would see the Trojan defense force a punt, which was blocked by Snobl and recovered by Hunter Zenzen deep in Hornet territory.

Brenner would convert a 15-yard touchdown run with Morse netting the PAT for a 49-7 lead with still

more than five minutes to play until halftime.

After the Trojans dropped a potential interception, they forced a punt that was downed at the 40-yard line. The first play from scrimmage saw Aaron Schiefert take an inside handoff and race 60 yards untouched for the touchdown. The extra point kick by Morse was good again that made the score 56-7 Barnesville.

The Trojan offense would add one more score before the half as Anderson would take a reverse and scamper 43 yards for the touchdown with Morse adding his eighth straight extra point to give the Trojans a 62-7 lead as both teams entered halftime.

The first drive of the second half saw senior, Jacob Morgan race into the end zone from 36 yards out. Morse's extra point was not good making the score 68-7, which is how the third quarter would end.

The Hornets would put up two touchdowns in the fourth quarter as Cole Fleisher would connect with Broden Fleisher for a touchdown pass from 10 yards out. Helmers would make the PAT, while Dylan Selly would take a hand off and race to the end zone from 15 yards out for another score. B. Fleisher would convert the two-point conversion run that made the score 68-22.

Barnesville would add one more touchdown as freshman quarterback, Noah Krause would race around the right edge for a 65-yard touchdown run. The Trojans would kneel on the two-point conversion to make the final score 74-22.

"It was good to come out and

play well after a couple of tough losses," said Head Coach Bryan Strand. "The team played about as well tonight as we could have. We had the best second quarter that I can ever remember, putting up 49 points. We did it with a great ground game and stellar defense. I was very proud of the kids' effort. We had been battling sickness the past few weeks and I was concerned coming into the game as we had a couple of starters that missed Monday.

We only ran 38 plays on the night and had nine different players carry the ball. Our top two rushers are not

starters, so it was a good night.

We play Roseau on Saturday. We played them ok up there earlier in the year, but I expect to have a much improved effort this time around."

The Trojans finished the game with 523 total yards of offense with 484 yards coming on the ground and 39 yards through the air. Anderson led the Trojans in rushing with 117 yards on seven carries, netting two touchdowns, while Schiefert added 114 yards rushing on eight carries and one score.

Krause added 63 yards rushing on one carry and a score, with Brenner

netting 61 yards rushing on nine carries and two scores. Tonsfeldt tallied 55 yards on three carries and a score, while completing both of his passes for 39 yards and a touchdown, with Morgan adding 36 yards on two carries and a touchdown. Detloff finished with 19 yards rushing on two carries and a touchdown, with Cameron Heng adding 16 yards on three carries, while Wyatt Roller added three yards on one carry and Snobl finished with two catches for 39 yards and a touchdown.

The Trojans held Frazee to 248 total yards of offense with 110 coming on the ground and 138 through the air.

Zenzen led the way with six tackles (4 solo, 2 assisted) and four tackles on kicks, with Tanner Kadrmas netting four tackles (3s, 1a) one for loss, three tackles on kicks and a sack.

Brady Kroll added seven tackles (3s, 4a) one for loss and three tackles on kicks, with Anderson netting 8 tackles (2s, 6a), three for loss and one on a kick. Kaden Zenzen finished with five solo tackles including one for loss and a tackle on a kick, with Adrian O'Brien adding four tackles (3s, 1a) and two tackles on kicks.

Martinson finished with six tackles (2s, 4a), one for loss and a fumble recovery, while Tonsfeldt chipped in 2 tackles (1s, 1a) and two interceptions including one

for a touchdown. Snobl added four tackles (1s, 3a) and a blocked kick, with Grant Inniger adding the Trojans other interception, while Morse finished the game making eight out of 10 extra points.

Barnesville improves their record to 7-2 on the season and will face Roseau on Saturday, October 27 in the second round of the playoffs.

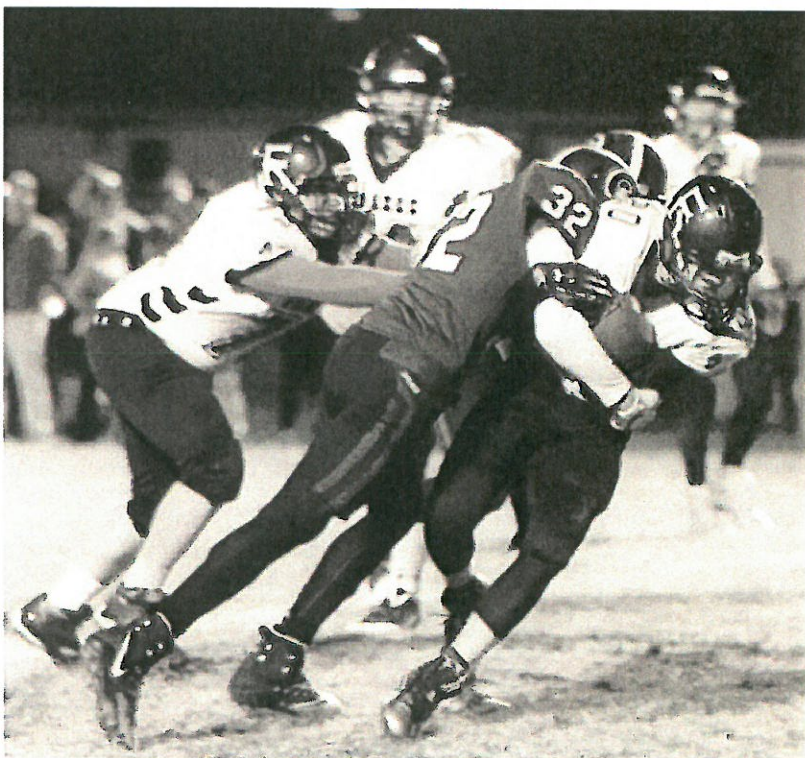

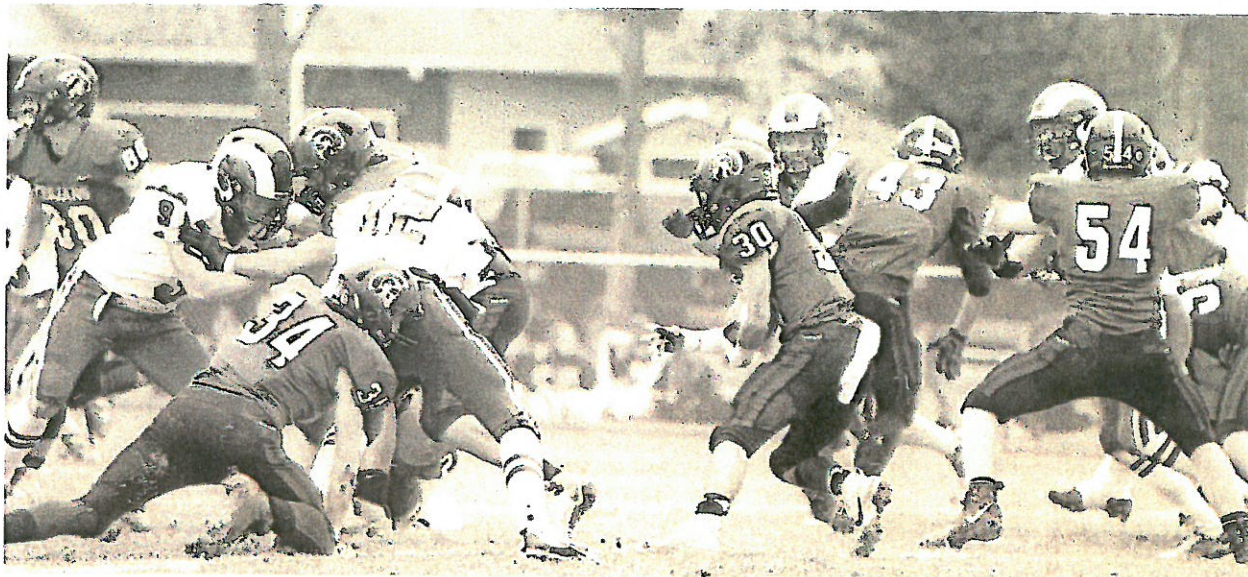

# Detloff's 181 Yards Rushing And Touchdowns Leads Trojans To Victory

The Barnesville Trojan's Nick Detloff had a huge game, netting 181 yards rushing and three scores in leading Barnesville to a convincing 53-0 victory over Roseau in the second round of the playoffs and into the Section Championship game where they will face the Hawley Nuggets in a rematch of the last two championships.

After having to punt to open up the game, the Trojans caused a fumble on Roseau's first play from scrimmage with Barnesville's Brooks Martinson jumping on the ball at the 26-yard line.

Barnesville quickly moved the ball down the field as Adam Tonsfeldt connected with Chase Brenner for a 23-yard pass play, moving the ball to the three-yard line. Brenner would take the next carry into the end zone for the Trojans first score of the game. Kicker Connor Morse would make the extra point for a 7-0 lead.

The Trojans would force a punt on the next series and two plays later, running back Nick Detloff would take a hand off 78 yards for the first of his three straight rushing

touchdowns. The PAT was not good making the score 13-0.

Barnesville would get the ball back after another punt and march down the field before Detloff ended the drive with an eight yard run. The two-point conversion pass was not good making the score 19-0, which is how the first quarter would end.

After Barnesville was forced to punt on their next possession, the Rams would jump offenses to give the Trojans a new set of downs. Barnesville would make them pay as a few plays later, Detloff took another inside hand off and was off to the races for a 60-yard touchdown run. The extra point was blocked making the score 25-0 Barnesville.

The Trojans defense would force another Roseau punt that was blocked by Preston Snobl. It would only take Barnesville three plays to get into the end zone as quarterback Adam Tonsfeldt found Snobl on a crossing pattern with Snobl running over a defender on his way for the score on a 30 yard touchdown pass and run. Brenner would add the two-point conversion that would make the score 33-0. The half would

come to an end as Brenner added a late interception to stop a Rams drive and send both teams into halftime.

The second half would see Barnesville force a punt and take over the ball on the 31-yard line. It would only take one play for the Trojans to score as Tonsfeldt would find a seam up the middle and was off to the races for the score. The two-point conversion run by Kellen Hinsz was good making the score 41-0.

With the subs into the game, the Trojans would add two more scores with the first coming on a six yard run from Aaron Schiefert with the two-point conversion run falling short that made the score 47-0 as the third quarter came to an end.

Another methodical drive by the Trojans ended with a Logan Ernst two-yard touchdown run with the two-point conversion run not being successful that made the score 53-0.

After a long kickoff return set up Roseau in great field position, the Trojans' Schiefert would step in front of a pass for an interception to end the threat and keep the shut out intact, as Barnesville went into



victory formation to end the game with a 53-0 win.

"I felt we were ready for whatever they threw at us today as our intensity was very good from the beginning of the game and the kids went out and played very well," said Head Coach Bryan Strand. "Our offense was really clicking led by Nick Detloff, who had an outstanding day after fighting sickness the last few weeks. We still have some illness going around so hopefully that will pass soon.

It was a very physical game, but I felt we matched Roseau's intensity. We got out of the game healthy and will be ready to go next Friday when we play Hawley for the section title. I thought we played well the last time we played them, we just did not convert any of our two-point conversions and lost by one. Hopefully that will improve this game.

I feel both teams are equally matched and the winner will come down to whoever makes the fewest mistakes. It should be another fantastic final between the two programs.

I have been very pleased with how hard our kids have been working and the steady progress they have shown throughout the year. I think we are starting to play our best football right now and hopefully that will

The Trojans finished the game with 497 yards of offense with 420 yards coming on the ground and 70 yards through the air.

Detloff was the game's leading rusher with 181 yards on seven

carries with three scores, while Tonsfeldt added 82 yards rushing on 10 carries and one touchdown, also completing all three passes for 55 yards and one score.

Schiefert tallied 65 yards rushing on eight carries with one score, with

Hunter Anderson added 12 yards on three carries, adding a reception that covered 15 yards, with Hinsz netting 10 yards on one carry, while Roller had 10 yards on two carries.

Jacob Morgan finished with seven yards on three carries, with Noah Krause netting six yards on one carry, while Logan Ernst had two yards on one carry that was good for a touchdown. Snobl had the other reception for the Trojans covering 30 yards and a touchdown to round out the offensive statistics.

Defensively, the Trojans were stellar again as they produced a shut out and held the Rams to 108 total yards of offense with 70 yards coming on the ground and 38 yards coming through the air, while netting three turnovers.

Hunter Zenzen was the defensive leader as he tallied six tackles (2 solo, 4 assist) with three for loss, a sack and a tackle on a kick, while Snobl added five tackles (2s,3a) three for loss, one tipped pass, a blocked kick and a tackle on a kick.

Anderson tallied four tackles (3s,1a) with one for loss and one tackle on a kick, with Brady Kroll adding three tackles (1s,2a) including two for loss and a sack, while Tonsfeldt finished with seven assisted tackles, one for loss, a tackle on a kick and a tipped pass.

Brenner finished with an interception, two tackles (1s,1a) with one for loss, with Joey Mark netting four tackles (2s,2a) and a tackle on a kick, while Kaden Zenzen had two tackles (1s,1a) with one tackle on a kick with Morgan adding two tackles (1s,1a) and two tackles on kicks.

The victory improves the Trojans record to 8-2 on the season. Their next game will be on Friday, November 2 in the Fargo Dome against the Hawley Nuggets with game time slated for 8:00 p.m.

# Tonsfeldt, Snobl Lead Trojans To Section Championship

The Barnesville Trojans squared off against the Hawley Nuggets for the Section 8AA football championship for the third straight season. Barnesville was also seaching for their third straight victory and looking to avenge an earlier season 19-18 loss to the Nuggets.

Barnesville would capture both as the Trojans played four quarters of hard, physical football to wear down the Nuggets behind quarterback Adam Tonsfeldt's 15 carries for 142 yards and two scores, while completing one pass covering 60 yards that seemed to turn the game into Barnesville's favor. Back up quarterback, Preston Snobl had three touchdown runs, as well, to propel the Trojans to the victory by the score of 34-23, sending Barnesville into the State football playoffs for the third straight season.

"I could not be any more proud of

the effort of the Trojan football team and our coaching staff tonight," stated Head Coach Bryan Strand. "We played four quarters of football and came away with the victory. Adam Tonsfeldt had the game of his life, leading us on both sides of the ball, as did Preston Snobl. Our offensive and defensive lines were outstanding and our special teams play was excellent too. The kids executed our game plan tonight, making big plays that led us to the victory.

"It was such an up and down game with so much emotion by both teams. I felt we played consistent in every aspect of the game. I was very impressed with our defense tonight holding Hawley to 242 total yards, which included a lucky bounce for a score that should have been an interception. But those things happen and we overcame that play by continuing to pound the football, driving down the field and putting

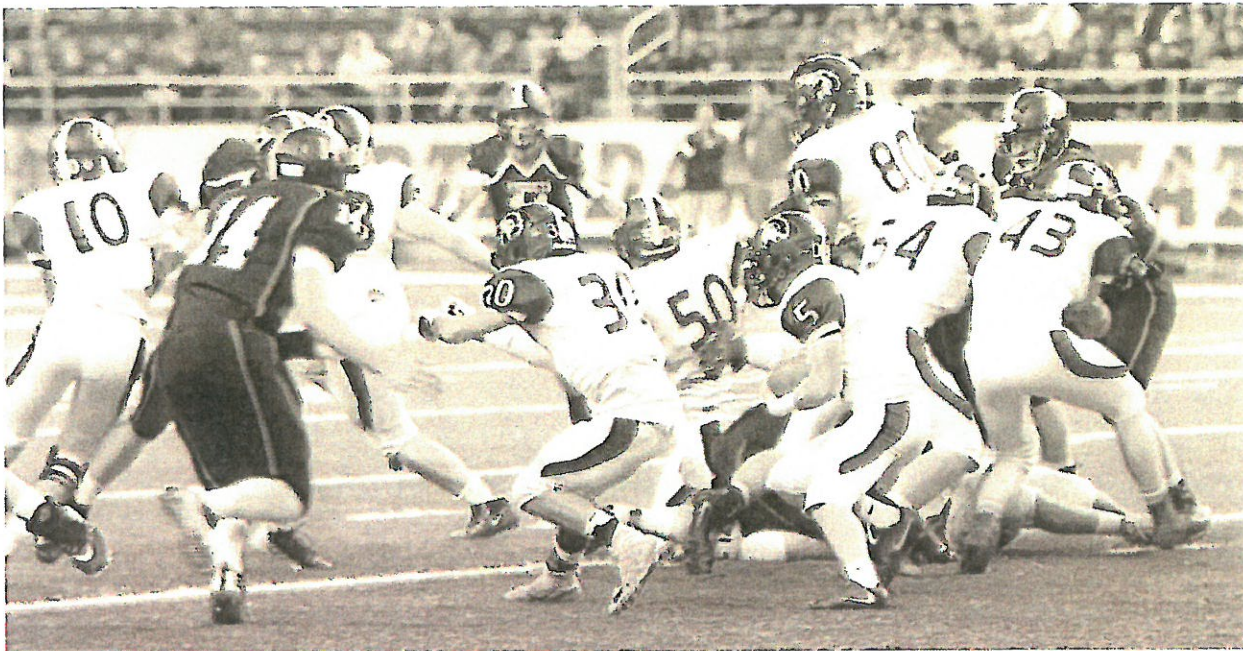
the game away with Tonsfeldt's touchdown run.

These kids have worked their tails off since last summer to get themselves into this position. They continue to work hard every day and deserve this trophy with the efforts they have shown the whole season. This was a fantastic win, our third straight section championship," Coach Strand concluded.

The game did not start out on the right foot for the Trojans as they were forced to punt on their first possession, giving the Nuggets a short field to work with to start the game.

Hawley quickly moved the ball down the field using both the run and the pass. Treyton Cossette took an option pitch to the one-yard line where quarterback, Jacob Vetter bulled into the end zone for the game's first score. Mason Klevgaard would add the extra point for a 7-0 Hawley lead.

Barnesville had a good drive going on their second possession before a fumble stopped the drive at the Nugget 31 yard line. But the Trojan defense would step up two plays later as linebacker, Aaron Schiefert stepped in front of a Nugget pass for an interception that he returned back to the 31 yard line, giving the Trojans some momentum that they badly needed.

It was not easy, but the Trojans used a 10 play drive before putting the ball in the end zone as Snobl took a shotgun, wishbone formation snap and rolled right for a touchdown from five yards out. Tonsfeldt would add the two-point conversion that gave Barnesville an 8-7 lead.

Barnesville would force a punt and had another nice drive stopped with another fumble that gave the Nuggets the ball close to the 50-yard line. Hawley would connect on a long pass to move the ball deep into Trojan territory and score on a Vetter to Chase Libak pass play covering nine yards for their second touchdown. Klevgaard would add the PAT for a 14-8 Nuggets lead.

The Trojans next offensive possession saw the team facing a 3rd and 19 play after a holding penalty. Barnesville pulled out a new play from the play book that saw Tonsfeldt complete a wheel route pass to a wide open Chase Brenner that saw Brenner race to the Nugget 17-yard line before he was tackled.

That play pumped life back into

the Trojan offense as they began to assert their will on the line, pushing their way to the end zone. First, Kellen Hinsz would take a reverse and power his way to the nine for an eight yard gain. That play was followed up by a Nick Detloff run up the middle, as he bulldozed his way to the three-yard line.

Detloff would plow to the one on the next play with Snobl taking

in a quarterback sneak for a one-yard touchdown run. Tonsfeldt would once again net the two-point conversion run that made the score 16-14 Barnesville.

The Trojan defense would force a quick punt getting the offense the ball back, with Brenner taking the first carry from the Trojan 32 yard line to the Nugget 26 for a big 42-yard run. The Trojans could taste another

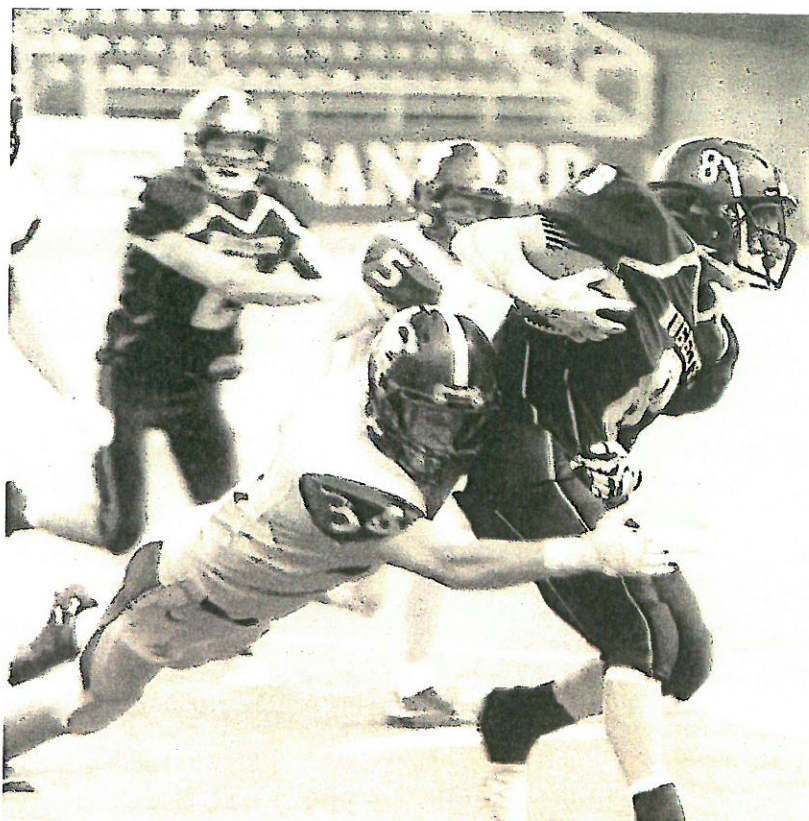
score as the line play of center Jackson Poepping, guards, Connor Morse and Jonny Robideaux, tackles Matt Samuelson and Gabe Dent and ends Hunter Zenzen and Snobl, as well as the blocking of the backs Hunter Anderson, Brenner, Detloff, Hinsz and Tonsfeldt, pushed the pile and gained yards in chunks.

Detloff would gain 11 yards on the next play that put the ball on the 15-yard line before Snobl took another shotgun snap and raced around the right edge, into the end zone for the touchdown. The two-point conversion play looked to be good, but the ball ended up on the turf for no score. However, the Trojans had taken a 22-14 lead that they would take into the half.

The Nuggets opened the second half with the ball and got a big 40 yard run from Gunnar Lawson that took the ball to the Trojan two-yard line. A penalty would back up the Nuggets and turn out to be a big play as Barnesville's defense stiffened and forced a 23 yard Klevgaard field goal that was good making the score 22-17.

The Trojan's first possession of the second half saw them get back to the ground and pound game. Tonsfeldt tallied the last 45 yards on a 17-yard run and a beautiful 28-yard touchdown run that saw him hurdle some bodies, making a great cut and running to the end zone untouched. The two-point conversion was called no good as the Trojans had taken a 28-17 lead.

Hawley's next series would see them move the ball down the

field netting a pair of defensive encroachment penalties that kept their drive alive. They would also get a fortuitous bounce on a broken play that saw Barnesville swarm Vetter as he heaved up a pass that should have been picked off. However, the ball would bounce off of the defender's finger tips and land in the waiting hands of Hawley's Noah Glad who was five yards ahead as he corralled the ball and stepped into the end zone for a touchdown. The Trojan

defense would deny the two-point conversion that made the score 28-23 with one quarter left to play in this historic rivalry.

After both defenses stiffened forcing a pair of punts on each of the next four possessions, Hawley tried to go for a trick play with a fake punt, but the pass was knocked down giving the Trojans the ball at the Nugget 37 yard line.

With the Trojans sensing victory, it would only take one play for Barnesville to hit pay dirt. A huge hole was blown open by the Trojan offensive lineman for Tonsfeldt to take a keeper through. Add in some outstanding blocks by lead back Hinsz, guard Dent and end Zenzen and Tonsfeldt could see the end zone. He only had to make one cut to make as he raced in for a 37-yard touchdown, his second score of the game. The two-point conversion pass was incomplete, but the Trojans had taken a commanding 34-23 lead late in the game.

The Trojan defense would not allow any big plays before ending the game with a couple of their own as a great defense play saw Vetter's fourth down pass end with a Tonsfeldt interception.

The Trojan offense would take some much-needed time off the clock

before being stopped on downs. But the Trojans would quickly force a fumble that would be recovered by Brooks Martinson to end the game as Barnesville's offense went into victory formation to run out the clock and give the Trojans their third consecutive Section 8AA title.

The Trojans finished the game with 385 yards of total offense, netting 325 yards on the ground and 60 yards through the air, while holding Hawley to 242 total yards of offense with 157 yards coming on the ground and 85 yards with the pass. Barnesville netted three turnovers for the game.

Other offensive individual statistics include Brenner who tallied 63 yards rushing on eight carries with one reception for 60 yards, with Detloff adding 55 yards rushing on 11 carries.

Hinsz added 32 yards rushing on seven carries with Snobl netting 21 yards on four carries and three touchdowns, while Anderson finished with 12 yards on three carries.

Defensively, the Trojans were led by Joey Mark, Brooks Martinson and Preston Snobl. Mark finished with seven total tackles (3 solo, 4 assisted) including one for loss, while adding three tackles on kicks.

Martinson tallied nine tackles (5s,4a), a fumble recovery and a tackle on a kick, with Snobl netting nine tackles (2s,7a) with one for loss, a sack and a tackle on a kick.

Zenzen finished with seven tackles (1s,6a) including one for loss, a sack and a tackle on a kick, with Tonsfeldt adding four tackles (2s,2a), one for a loss and an interception, while Anderson tallied five tackles (2s,3a), a tipped pass and a tackle on a kick, with Schiefert adding an interception for the Trojans defense.

The win improves the Trojans record to 9-2 on the season. They

will travel to Brainerd on Friday, November 9 to take on Moose Lake-Willow River who won the Section 7AA title with a 22-6 victory over Royalton. Game time is slated for 7:00 p.m.

# Three in a row for Trojans

## Barnesville takes down rival Hawley to claim section football title

FARGO — For another year, Minnesota Class 2A, Section 8 football belongs to Barnesville. The Trojans won their third straight section title 34-23, beating rival Hawley in the title game for the third straight season.

It was fitting that quarterback Adam Tonsfeldt put the finishing touches on the game, streaking for a 37-yard touchdown run midway through the fourth quarter to push the lead to two scores.

Tonsfeldt couldn't play quarterback for the first six weeks due to injury, but played on defense three of those weeks he was hurt.

"He's just such a tough kid," Barnesville coach Bryan Strand said. "He's been starting point guard since eighth grade, he sees everything so well, and nothing ever gets above what his capabilities are. If you looked at his feet, they were always under him."

His feet seemed to be all over the Fargodome on Friday, as he rushed for 142 yards and two touchdowns against No. 5-ranked Hawley (9-2).

"I was injured at the beginning of the season, it was tough," Tonsfeldt said. "Our team has been incredible. We had two tough losses right in the middle of the season, both by one point. Just a few plays changes things and we told ourselves we're going to keep working and we're going to fix those little mistakes and every moment matters."

Hawley struck first on its opening possession.

### Barnesville 34, Hawley 23

The Nuggets used six plays to go 43 yards and find the end zone, converting a third-and-7 along the way with Jacob Vetter finding Chase Libak for 8 yards. Vetter called his own number for a 1-yard plunge to get the Nuggets a 7-0 lead.

Barnesville (9-2) fumbled on the ensuing possession, but Aaron Schiefert grabbed the ball back with an interception that set the Trojans up at the Hawley 30. Nine plays later, Preston Snobl was running in the end zone

from 5 yards out. Tonsfeldt ran in the two-point conversion to put the Trojans up 8-7.

Karter Kopacek pounced on a Barnesville fumble early in the second quarter to put Hawley at their own 48. A 33-yard pass from Vetter to Trayton Cossette, a 9-yard run from Cossette and a 9-yard touchdown pass from Vetter to Libak put Hawley back up 14-8.

Barnesville answered again, marching 67 yards on eight plays, including a 60-yard pass from Tonsfeldt to Chase Brenner on third-and-20, to take back the lead. Snobl

punched it in from 2 yards out and Tonsfeldt added another 2-point conversion to give the Trojans a 16-14 lead with 2 minutes, 42 seconds remaining in the first half.

"They have such a great senior class and for our kids to come out here, after losing to them by one this season, it's incredible," Strand said. "To see them come out here and do what they did here tonight makes me proud to be their coach."

Hawley went three-and-out on the next possession and Barnesville used three plays to go 58 yards for another touch-

down. Brenner had a run for 32 yards, Nick Detloff ran for 11 yards and Snobl put the finishing touches on the drive with a 15-yard touchdown run to give Barnesville a 22-14 lead at halftime.

"They just blocked better than we tackled and played defense. They outplayed us," Hawley coach Peder Naatz said. "We looked like we didn't know what we were doing once in a while. You can't have that this time of the year. I'm taking this loss as my own. There's nothing that the kids could've done."

Mason Klevgaard drilled a 23-yard field goal on

Hawley's opening possession of the first half to cut the Barnesville lead to 22-17.

Barnesville had another answer, using four plays to go 57 yards for a touchdown. Tonsfeldt capped the drive jumping over the pile and scampering 28 yards for a touchdown to put the Trojans back up 28-17.

"He's so tough," Strand said. "He read the right things, he changed speed when he needed to. I couldn't be prouder of all of them. The line blocked outstanding all night. When they tried to crowd the holes out there, they got to who they were supposed to get to."

Hawley got some luck late in the third when Vetter threw up a pass he had no business throwing. It tipped off the hands of Barnesville's Kellen Hinz and into the hands of Noah Glad for a 30-yard touchdown to cut the lead to 28-23.

Hawley faked a punt from their own 37 with 6:25 to go, but Vetter's pass fell incomplete. Tonsfeldt took it to the house on the next play to put Hawley away.

"It's unlike anything else," Tonsfeldt said. "Just the physicality of the game, the intensity, it's unlike anything you could ever experience."

# Verndale stifles Underwood

## Pirates capture second straight section title

FARGO — Verndale's football team was well aware the expectations people had after the Pirates graduated 15 seniors from last year's team that won the Minnesota Class 9-man, Section 4 title.

"We've kind of had a chip on our shoulder the whole time," Verndale senior quarterback Tate Bounds said. "Our senior class has been through it all. We've been working hard and playing well."

The No. 3-ranked Pirates shut out rival Underwood 12-0 Friday to make it back-to-back section titles for Verndale.

As has been the story all season, Friday had no eye-popping numbers from Verndale. The box score was pretty boring, but all the Pirates care about is that they are 11-0.

"It's really satisfying this year," Verndale coach Mike Mahlen said. "We lost some pretty good football players. I don't think people were expecting this much from us. These kids played

together as a team better than any team I've ever had. We don't have any big standouts, but everybody is part of it. It's a team effort. They don't give a darn about who gets the score."

That says a lot, seeing as no high school coach ever in Minnesota has more wins than Mahlen, who moved to 393-121-3 for his career.

"They really played well, they worked hard in the offseason, they worked hard in preseason, the practices have been really good," Mahlen said. "There's been only one or two practices all year that have been poor. That's the biggest key. Every day you're practicing good, instead of once a week."

Verndale made its 18th appearance for a section championship at the Fargodome on Friday. There are 13 section titles since 2000 between Underwood and Verndale.

"It's one of the hardest-hitting games there is," said Verndale senior running back Matthew Steege, who rushed for

110 yards Friday. "We always play each other tough. They run that (run-pass option), which is very hard to defend, and we just run our wishbone, which we're known for."

It took two plays for Verndale to get within striking distance Friday, as Steege had a 59-yard run on the second play from scrimmage to put the Pirates at the Underwood 5-yard line. Two plays later, on third-and-goal, Jake Ismail found the end zone on a toss for a 2-yard touchdown run to put Verndale up 6-0.

That would be the only scoring of the first half.

"We played hard against every team," Mahlen said. "No matter if the other team was 0-4, we still played with the same intensity as we did against a 5-0 team. That's the key, too, to keep that going the whole year."

Underwood (9-2) threatened in the first half, but the Verndale defense got stops when it needed to. The Rockets got to the 27, 12 and 30 of Verndale in the first half, but the Pirates found a way to keep them

"The defense did a great job," Bounds said. "Those guys stood firm all day. We held them to zero again, we held them

to zero the first time."

Underwood fumbled on its first two possessions of the second half. Verndale made the second fumble hurt, taking over at the Underwood 35-yard line. On fourth-and-5, Bounds found Brayden Vertina for a 6-yard touchdown pass to push the lead to 12-0 with 17 seconds remaining in the third.

That was all Verndale's defense would need, as the Pirates shut out Underwood for the second

time this season. Underwood's only two losses on the season came to Verndale.

"Back-to-back is crazy," Steege said. "No one thought we were going to be this good. We're just trying to prove to everyone how good we are."

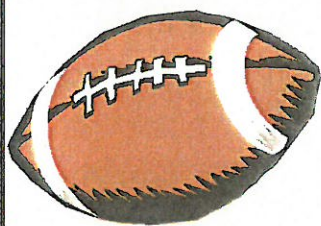
Dirksen kept his offense chugging as a pair of

fourth quarter scores iced the game away.

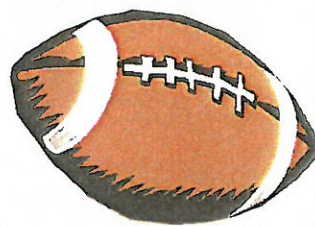

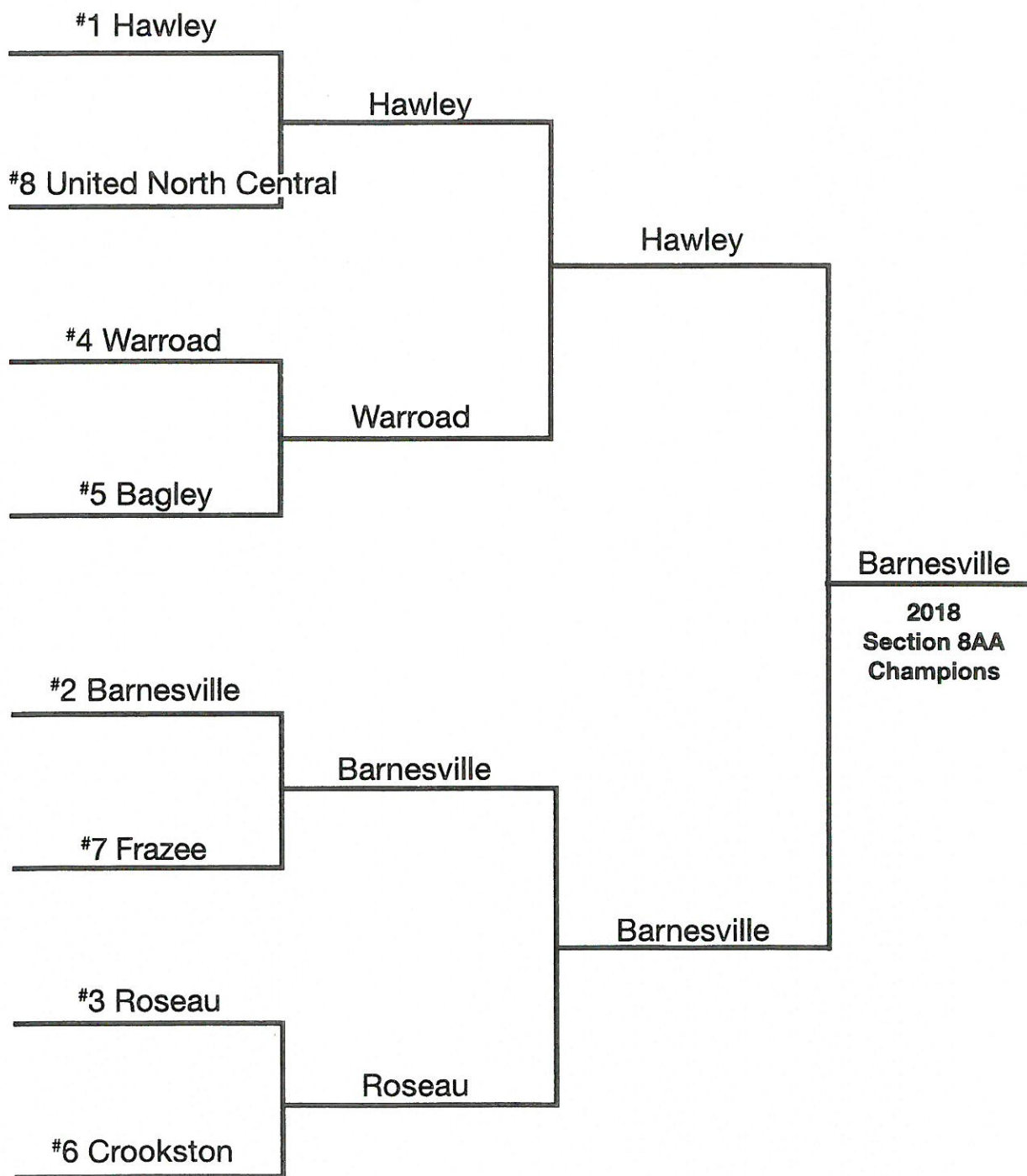

boys sealed the deal at the Fargodome on Friday, November 2 in front of a huge crowd of local football fans.

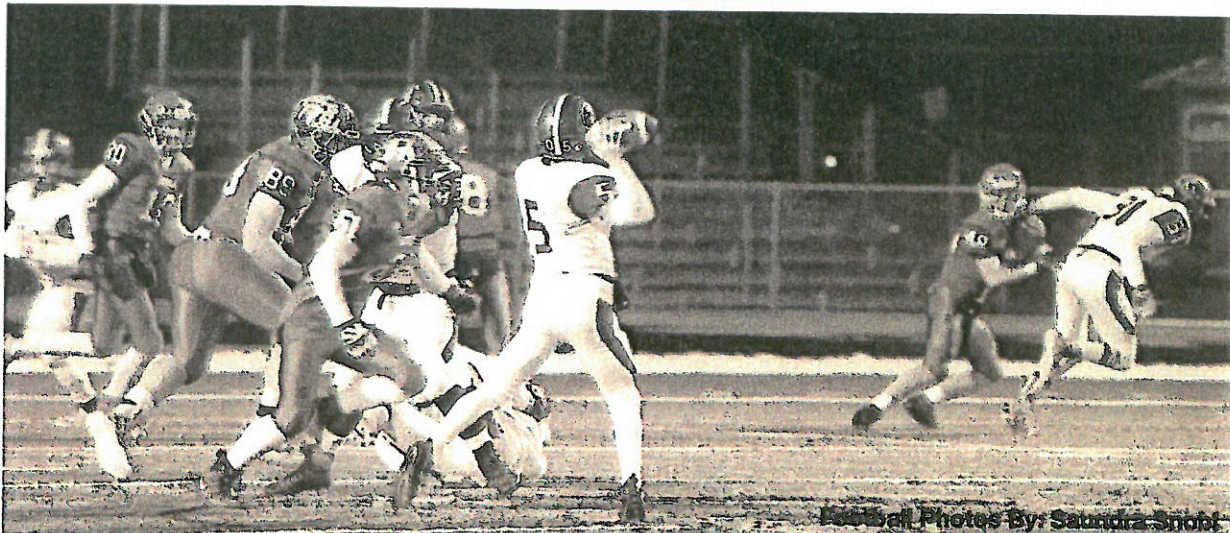
The jubilant Trojans come off the playing field last Friday,

# Trojan Defense Pitches Shut Out Punch Ticket To US Bank Stadium

The Barnesville Trojans opened the quarterfinal round of the Class AA playoffs against Moose Lake-Willow River at Brainerd High School on Friday, November 9.

A fantastic running game and a phenomenal defensive effort helped the Trojans cruise to a dominant 40-0 victory sending Barnesville to the

semi-finals to be played at US Bank Stadium, home of the Minnesota Vikings, for the second time in three seasons.

MLWR opened up with the ball to start the game and the Trojan defense was ready. Barnesville forced a fourth down play, which saw the Trojans produce a fumble that was recovered by defensive

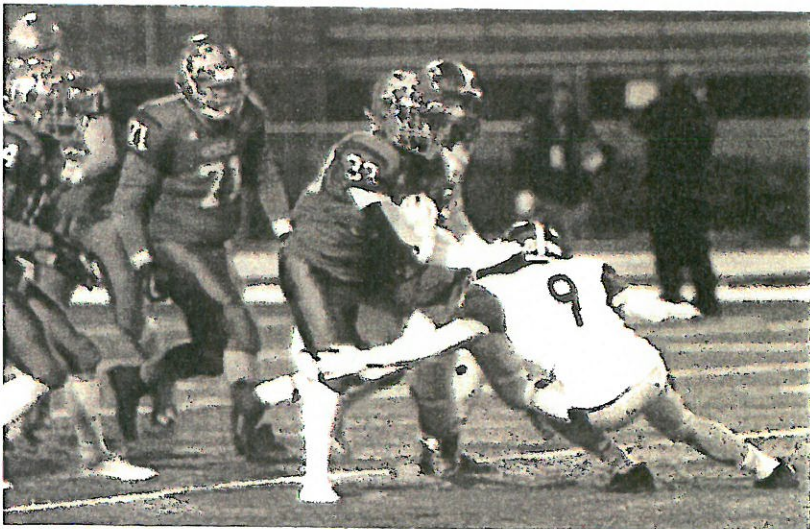
tackle, Brady Kroll at the 41-yard line.

However, the Trojans would give the ball back a few plays later on a fumble, forcing the defense back on the field. But, the defense would force a quick punt with the offense taking over on the 11-yard line.

The Trojans would move the ball to the 39 yard line after a 19 yard run by Chase Brenner, before hitting a home run as quarterback, Adam Tonsfeldt found a hole behind some great blocking and raced 61 yards untouched to the end zone. The two-point conversion pass from Tonsfeldt was tipped into the air, but found the waiting hands of tight end, Grant Inniger, giving Barnesville an 8-0 lead.

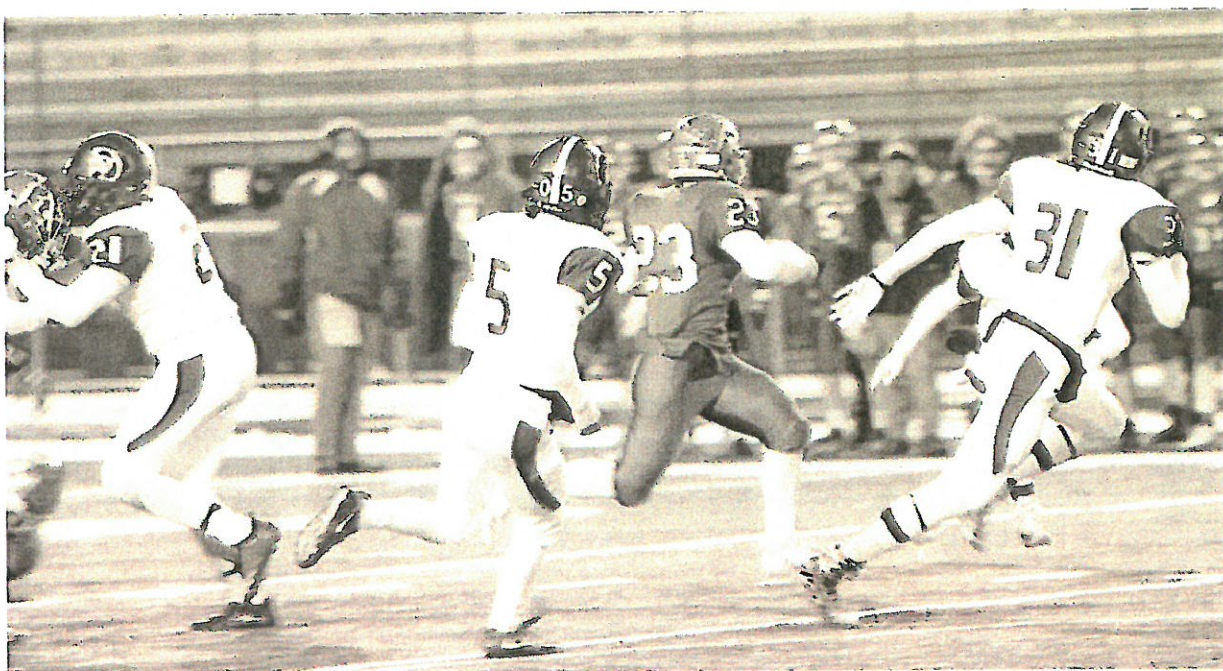
Tonsfeldt would make a great defensive play on the Trojans next defensive possession as he intercepted the pass and returned it to the MLWR 34 yard line, putting Barnesville into great field position again.

Running back Kellen Hinsz would start the drive with a five yard run, with Tonsfeldt and Chase Brenner getting the next two carries

for a Trojan first down. Brenner would plow his way for a seven yard gain to put the ball at the 14 yard line, where Hinsz would end the drive with a touchdown run off a nifty cutback play that saw Brenner and guard, Jonny Robideaux make key blocks to spring him for the score. The two-point conversion run was stopped making the score 14-0, which is how the first quarter would end.

The Trojan defense would force another punt with MLWR's quarterback doing a quick kick from his 26-yard line that would only travel 11 yards, giving the Trojans great field position once again.

Barnesville would face a fourth down play from the 21-yard line and complete their only pass of the game as Tonsfeldt hit Brenner for a nine-yard gain.

After a touchdown was negated by a holding penalty the ball was sitting on the 14-yard line with the Trojans facing a third down and 12. Hinsz would get 13 yards with a fantastic run that saw him lay out for the end zone only to come up one yard short.

Hunter Anderson would take the next carry in for a touchdown for Barnesville's third score of the game. The conversion run was not good making the score 20-0 Barnesville.

The Trojan defense, led by a great play from Brooks Martinson who read a screen pass and snuffed it for no gain, forced another punt that put the ball inside the 10-yard line.

Barnesville would put together another nice drive mixing in runs from Tonsfeldt, Brenner, Hinsz and Anderson to get the ball into Rebel territory. A penalty would negate a Tonsfeldt touchdown run, before the Trojans tried to use some deception that almost turned into disaster. Preston Snobl took a pitch and tried to make a cross the field pass that was intercepted at the Rebel 28 yard line and returned to the Trojan 49 yard line.

MLWR would hit a pass play on third down to move to the 34-yard line and a few runs later the ball would be sitting on the 26.

The Trojans would divert any momentum with a back breaking play that saw the Rebels run a pitch to the left, with the Trojans bottling

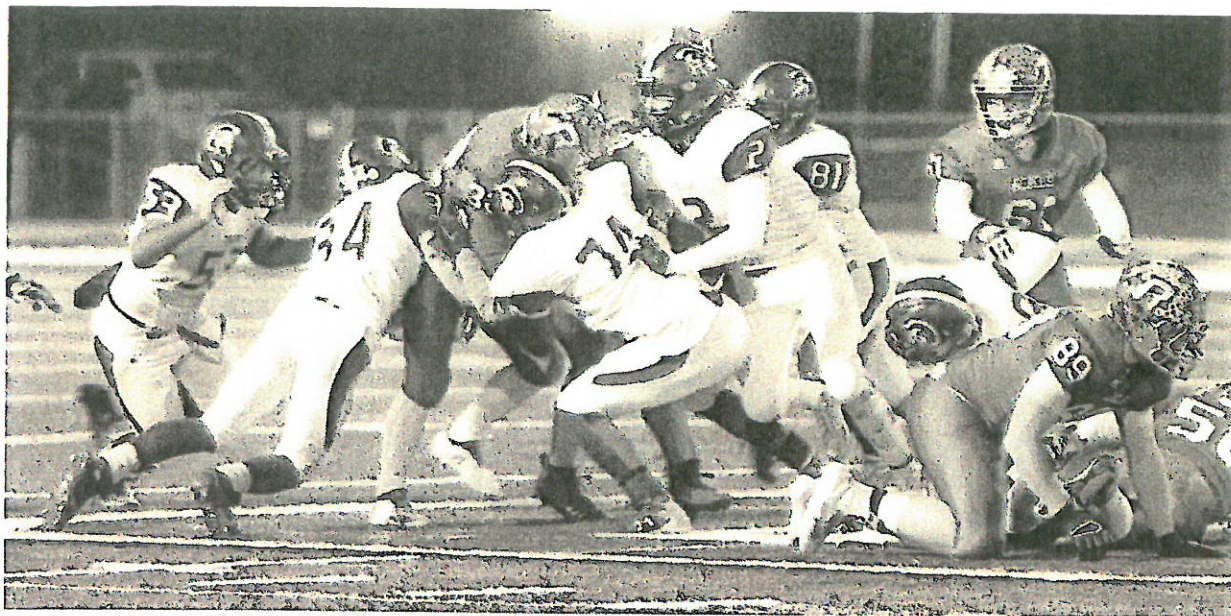
the play up. The running back decided to try and pitch the ball back to a teammate, but the ball was grabbed out of the air by defensive end Joey Mark at the 25-yard line. He saw nothing but green space ahead as he raced untouched until he was swarmed by his teammates in the end zone, 75 yards later for a defensive touchdown. Snobl would add the two-point conversion run that would put the Trojans up 28-0 late in the second quarter.

MLWR would finally put together a scoring threat by marching the ball down the field. The final play of the half saw the Rebels complete a 24 yard pass, but the receiver would not make the end zone as cornerback Adrian O'Brien tripped him up with Hinsz finishing off the tackle at the

five yard line as time ran out in the half.

The Trojans opened up the second half with the ball and drove to midfield before they were forced to punt. The snap was low, forcing the punter, Snobl, to go to his knees to receive the ball, marking him

down at the 37-yard line and giving some momentum to the Rebels. But on the first play, defensive end, Hunter Zenzen forced a fumble that was recovered by Mark giving the ball back to Barnesville at the 33-yard line.

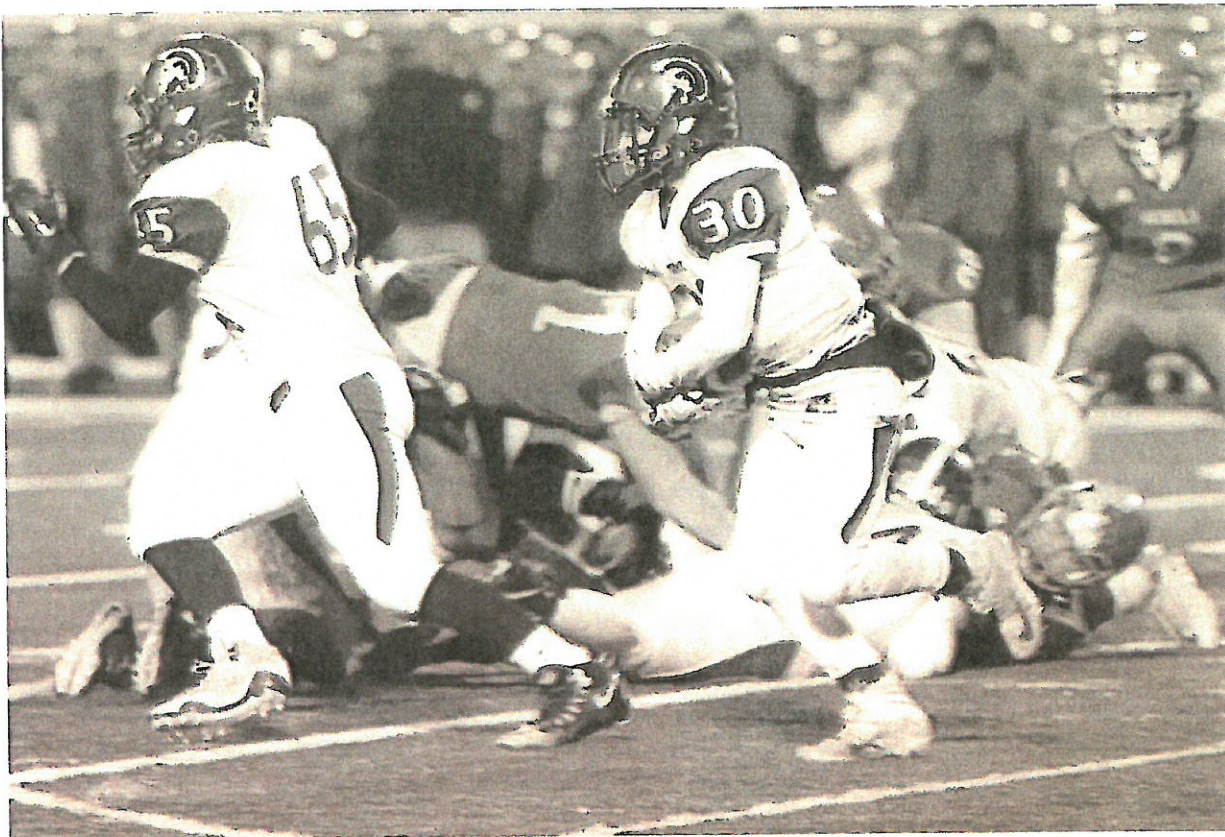
Barnesville would use a time

consuming, methodical drive to march down the football field and take time off the clock. The drive would end with a Tonsfeldt two-yard touchdown run. The conversion run was stopped after a bobbled snap, however the Trojans had taken a commanding 34-0 lead.

The Trojan defense continued to swarm the ball and forced another turnover as Tonsfeldt plucked away another interception, giving Barnesville the ball at the 41 yard line of the Rebels.

After a six yard run ended the quarter, the fourth quarter would start with a bang as Nick Detloff took an inside hand off and raced 35 yards to the end zone for another Trojan touchdown. The extra point kick was blocked making the score 40-0 Barnesville.

After allowing a big run that put the Rebels deep into Trojan territory, O'Brian would make an outstanding interception to stop the drive and keep the shutout alive.

The Trojans would run fullback Aaron Schiefert on three straight plays that gained 17, 9 and 32 yards. However, the last carry would see Schiefert get tackled hard to the ground and land on his shoulder where he would have to leave the game due to an injury.

The Trojans would fumble on the very next play, allowing their defense to come back out on the field to preserve their shutout, which is what they would do. When the final horn sounded, the Trojans had a 40-0 victory, putting them into the final four of Class AA football.

"I felt we played a very solid game against a very good Moose Lake-Willow River football team," said Head Coach Bryan Strand. "Our kids prepared and played with a ton of confidence. Adam Tonsfeldt had another outstanding game. He is hard to see and does such a great job hiding the football that nobody can ever tell if he has it or not. I could go on and on about who played well, but truly it was the entire team from offense to defense to special teams.

"We will have our hands full this week as we play Minneapolis North who is the top rated team by far in the QRF standings. I feel we can give them some trouble with our style of offense as they probably have not seen it before.

"I heard they have some good skill position players and a great quarterback, so we will need to be at the top of our game. Every game now is a blessing. Hopefully our preparation and playing well could see us get another week of football over Thanksgiving weekend.

"We will need to heal up a bit, as we lost one of our best sophomore players in Aaron Schiefert, who broke his collarbone on one of our last offensive plays of the game. He was really stepping up for us and will be missed.

"I also want to give my coaching staff a huge shout out. I have the best coaching staff around. They put in a lot of hours every week and it has paid off. Our kids were ready to play and that is a testament to the guys I have working around me," Strand concluded.

As a team, the Trojans finished with 422 total yards of offense with 413 yards coming on the ground on 48 carries and nine yards through the air. The defense held MLWR to 172 yards of total offense with 118 coming on the ground and 54 yards through the air. Barnesville also created six turnovers.

Tonsfeldt led all rushers with 138 yards on 15 carries and two scores, while adding one pass completion in two attempts for nine yards. Brenner added 98 yards on 11 carries and one reception for nine yards, with Detloff netting 61 yards on nine carries and a score.

Schiefert finished with 58 yards on three carries with Hinsz adding 49 yards on seven carries and a touchdown, while Anderson added nine yards on three carries and a score.

Defensively the Trojans pitched a shut out thanks to Martinson who tallied nine tackles (6 solo, 3 assisted) with one for loss, with



O'Brien netting seven tackles (5s,2a) and an interception.

Tonsfeldt added three tackles (2s,1a) with two interceptions, with Mark netting four tackles (2s,2a) and two fumble recoveries including a touchdown return.

Zenzen added nine tackles (2s,7a) including one for loss, one tipped pass and a tackle on a kick, with Anderson adding nine tackles (2s,7a) with one for loss and a tackle on a kick, while Snobl added seven tackles (2s,5a) and Kroll a fumble recovery.

The Trojans record now stands at 10-2 on the season. Barnesville will now face Minneapolis North, who defeated Redwood Valley 20-12, in the semi-finals of Class AA football at US Bank Stadium with the game slated for Friday, November 16 at 11:30 am.

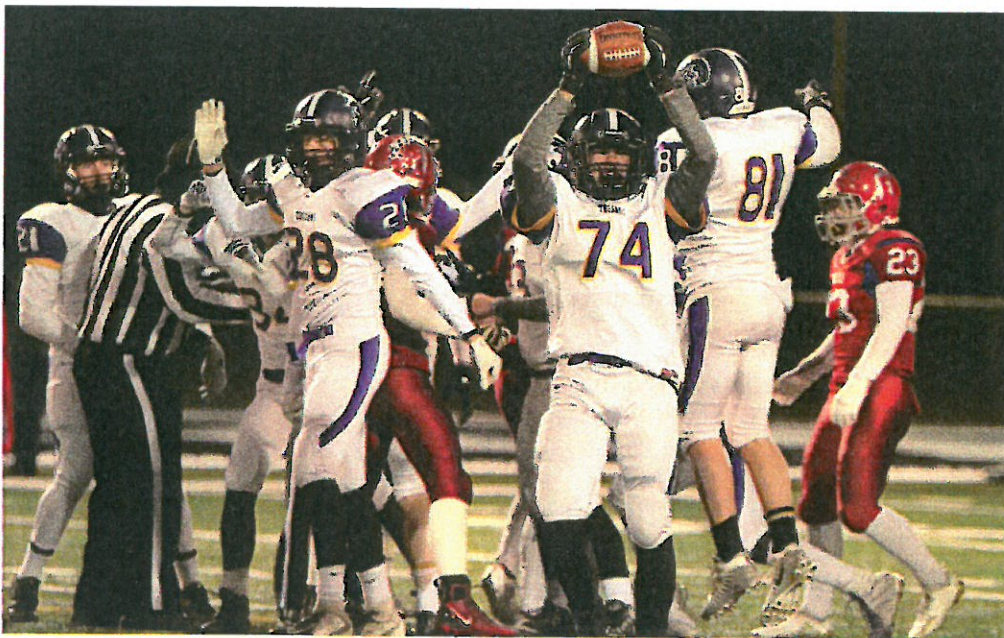

**BRAINERD, Minn.** - The Barnesville Trojans dominated the Moose Lake-Willow River Rebels posting a 40-0 shutout in the Minnesota Class 2A state football quarterfinals Friday night.

"The momentum was huge," Barnesville sophomore quarterback Adam Tonsfeldt said. "We got rolling. Our offensive line was playing great and sustained blocks all night. You have to give almost all the credit to them. They played incredible."

Tonsfeldt gave the Trojans the lead scoring on a 61-yard run down the Rebel sideline and passed to Grant Inniger on the conversion for an 8-0 advantage with four-minutes, 51-seconds remaining in the first quarter.

On the ensuing drive, Tonsfeldt picked off Rebel quarterback Mason Olson to set the Trojan offense up at the Rebel 34-yard line.

Four plays later, Kellen Hinsz scored from 14 yards out for a 14-0 lead on the last play of the first quarter.

While Barnesville was finding success moving the ball, the Rebels struggled to maintain drives.

"They pull a lot of lineman and our linebackers read so well tonight," Tonsfeldt said. "We shut down that double tight early and made them go spread and we got great penetration and played great defense."

The Trojan defense was stout forcing a three-and-out and a fourth down quick kick by the Rebels went nowhere giving Barnesville prime real estate at the Rebel 37.

Tonsfeldt converted a fourth-and-six with a pass to Chase Brenner to get inside the red zone. Hinsz dove for the pylon converting a third-and-11 from the 14-yard line to get to the goal line and Hunter Anderson plunged in from a yard out to go up 20-0 midway through the second quarter.

The Rebel offense got some traction late in the half after Brady Watrin intercepted a Tonsfeldt pass to give ML-WR the ball at midfield. The Rebels drove to the Trojan 24-yard line but Barnesville's defense came up big again.

A fumble bounded into the hands of Joey Mark, who scored on a back-breaking 75-yard return to give the Trojans a 28-0 lead in the final seconds of the half.

The Trojans deferred after winning the coin toss and took the opening kick at their own 30 looking to bury the Rebels. Moose Lake-Willow River stiffened forcing a punt at midfield and the snap dribbled to punter Preston Snobl where the ball was downed as he tried to corral it giving the Rebels hope inside the Trojan 40.

Barnesville defenders nipped any momentum in one play pouncing on an Anakin Oswald fumble to get the ball right back.

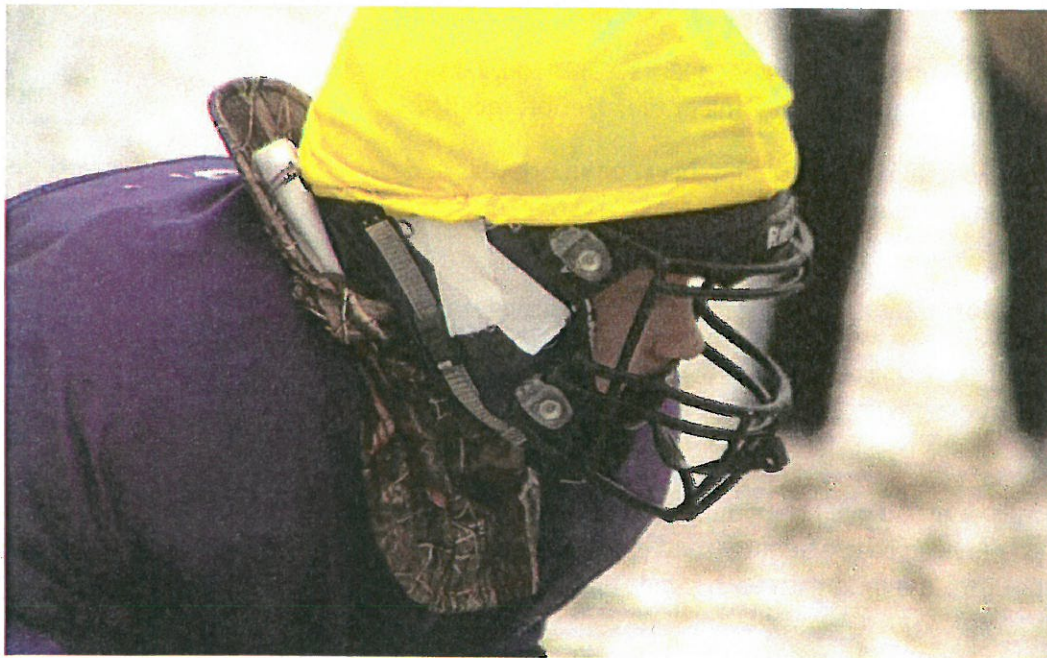

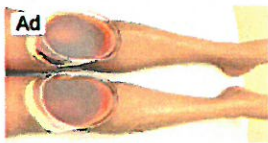

**BARNESVILLE** - In the first six weeks of the season, the Trojans had six different combinations in their backfield, but there has been one constant. Barnesville is getting big contributions from a player they didn't expect they would a year ago.

"They'd all come down and ask why are you not playing? Students would too. I'd say I don't know its not really my thing I guess, but it kept eating at me," Detloff recalled.

"He knows the feeling of winning the section championship his sophomore year and we felt it last year. I knew he was going to miss out and regret it," Trojans senior running back Chase Brenner said.

This season Detloff has made up for lost time and fought through his injury despite the pain.

"If it gets hit my whole arm will go numb. So it's hard to feel for the ball, but I still have my strength," Detloff said.

"That nerve was giving him all kinds of problems. I remember against Mengha/UNC running for a touchdown," Barnesville head coach Bryan Strand explained. "He got through and was running 60 yards down the field with both hands on the ball. He was not letting go of it."

No matter the punishment he's faced playing football, you can bet he'll hang on to these memories for the rest of his life.

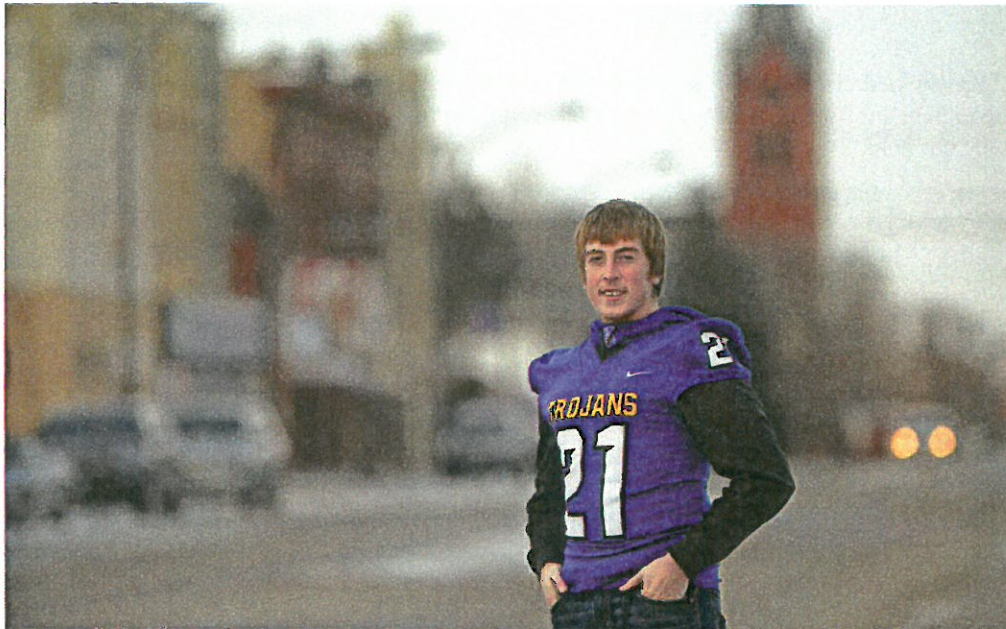

Tanya Martinson was beginning to get worried. She was waiting for her husband to return from his run, so they could drive to work together as they had always done. Mark Martinson had just received cortisone shots after a hip injury, so he was starting to run again.

Mark had a short and long route for his morning run. Tanya, figuring he was still getting over the injury, decided to drive through his short route. She couldn't find him, so she went back home to get her two sons ready for school.

Brooks Martinson, a senior linebacker for this year's Barnesville High School football team, was 5 years old when his mother pulled into the driveway. He was standing in the window of their home. She got Brooks and his 3-year-old brother into the car and went looking for Mark on the long route.

Brooks hates to admit he doesn't remember much about his dad, but he will never forget his mother throwing her cell phone against the windshield of the car when they pulled up to the scene of an accident and saw his father's body covered with a blanket in a ditch. He remembers wanting to go see his dad one last time.

Tanya identified the body for police. When she returned to the car, Brooks asked "Is dad OK?" and "What are they doing to my daddy?"

"Who's going to be my daddy now?" Brooks asked when he was told his dad was dead.

"He's a kid that has just gotten by with hard work and this bad thing happened to him, but he really hasn't let it define him," Barnesville coach Bryan Strand said. "He's a very sincerely nice kid that works hard."

Brooks is second on the Trojans with 73 tackles, along with three fumble recoveries and an interception this season. He will help lead the defense into Friday's Minnesota Class 2A quarterfinal matchup against Moose Lake-Willow River at 7 p.m. at Brainerd High School.

Brooks looks like his dad and has the same quiet sense of humor. Tanya says it was Mark's genuine personality and generosity that she loved. When she was asked for a story that sums up Brooks, she talked about a young neighbor boy, Noah, who is always waiting for Brooks to get home from practice.

"I just think he sees a helping hand," Brooks said. "He'll be outside and he likes playing with ratchet straps, so he'll yell over to me to help him load bikes into his dad's truck. It's not fun not being able to do something, so why not help."

"He was a slow developer," Strand said. "He just outworked the other guys at that position last year. He reads the lineman well, he studies film, he studies the game. He's not the biggest guy, fastest guy, certainly not the strongest guy, but he plays hard and with a lot of passion when he's out there."

Strand said Brooks used to try to go under blocks, but this season he goes through them. The scene of his dad's accident is not a place that Brooks tries to avoid either. He remembers it, but there's more to him.

"I try not to think of it," Brooks said. "It's weird to say, but it doesn't bother me anymore."

Life has gone on for Brooks and his family. Tanya is engaged to a man Brooks considers a role model. Brooks loves to hunt and fish with him.

"He's a great man," Brooks said. "He came into my life and has taken on that father role."

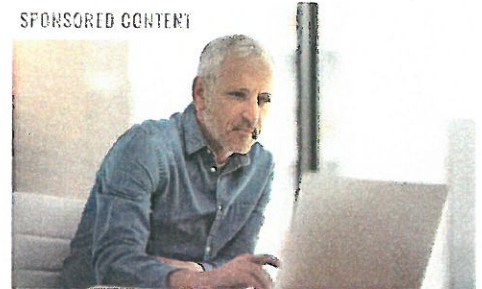

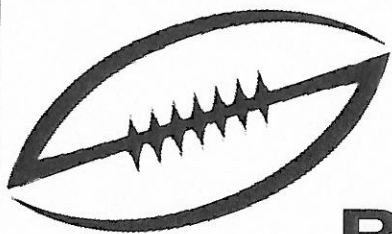

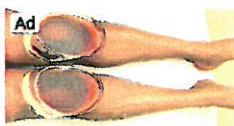

"He just doesn't back down," Strand said. "You want him in your corner. He's never scared or intimidated."

Last year, Strand asked eighth-grade coach, Matt Askegaard, who was the best player on his team. It was a group of eighth-graders who had lost one game in two years. Askegaard said Jonny, who was a seventh-grader. Jonny would play in games with the seventh-grade team and stay after to play games with the eighth-grade team.

Strand told Jonny in the weight room last year he was going to have him come up to varsity for camp. On the second day of summer camp, Strand told him his junior high playing days were over.

"Didn't take us long to see that he was ready and one of our better lineman," Strand said. "He doesn't get scared of any assignment. He will give you everything he has and then some."

There's been a lot of pieces to Robideau's success. He was eased into a starting spot. In Week 1, he didn't play, but was introduced to the bright lights and speed of varsity football. In Week 2, he was subbed in and out to get a feel for the game. In Week 3, he got his shot to start.

"He has been there ever since," Strand said.

A big reason for that is being surrounded by two upperclassmen, as senior captain Jackson Poepping is to his right at center and junior Matt Samuelson is to his left at tackle. In the beginning, Jonny had to turn to them to ask which way a play was going. The two took Jonny under their wing, as he went through the frustrations of adjusting to a completely different level of football and a run offense that can be complex.

Jonny doesn't need to ask them anymore. He knows where he's going.

"Learning the plays in a very short amount of time, that was definitely a challenge," Jonny said. "I'd say I have it all down now. It took awhile, but I got it pretty much figured out."

Jonny was quick to say it wasn't just Poepping and Samuelson, but everyone on the team.

"It was backs, it was linemen, it was everyone," Jonny said. "If I didn't know a play, they'd help tell me where to go to and which person to block."

"The preparation is just something I've had to adapt to," Jonny said. "It's kind of been a new challenge, but it's something I've adapted to pretty well."

"I like that feeling of winning. Mr. Strand says he hates losing more than he loves winning and that's what I like about it. I really just want to win and we've been pretty successful so far."

Nate jokes that Jonny will play five years on varsity, three of which he'll have to ride his scooter to practice. He certainly didn't look like an eighth-grader last week when he pulled on a run play and put Moose Lake-Willow River senior and best defensive lineman Aidan Szczymbak on the ground.

"He's only going to get better," Strand said. "We didn't expect this so quick."

# Trojans Defeat Polars For Birth In State Championship

The Barnesville Trojans continued their trek to the Prep Bowl State Championship game in Class AA football with a convincing 34-20 victory over previously unbeaten and the top ranked team in the QRF Minneapolis North.

The Trojans had a fantastic start to the game opening up a 28-0 lead using a powerful and deceptive running game to net huge yards and consume time. Minneapolis North could not find a way to stop Barnesville's offense until their deficit was too much to overcome.

The Trojans finished the game with 388 yards rushing on 57 carries for a 6.8 yards per carry

average, while not attempting a pass. Barnesville used this formula to dominate the time of possession as they held the ball for a commanding 30:08 seconds compared to the Polars 17:52.

Barnesville's great start began on the opening kickoff as Preston Snobl faked a reverse and ran for 43 yards putting the ball deep into Polar territory at the 38 yard line. Barnesville would proceed to dominate the line of scrimmage as they moved the ball down the field with big gains rushing, starting with a 10-yard run from Kellen Hinsz and a nine-yard run from Nick Detloff.

Both plays were the focal point of the entire first half as Barnesville used quick hitting running plays

to gash the Polars for yards up the middle, staying away from running plays out wide where Minneapolis North had a significant speed advantage.

After Adam Tonsfeldt gained three yards for a first down, Hunter Anderson took the next carry down to the six-yard line with a gain of eight yards. Detloff would gain the first down with a two-yard carry that was followed up by a Tonsfeldt run of five yards, putting the ball at the one-yard line. After a false start penalty backed the Trojans up to the six, Preston Snobl took a shotgun snap and charged towards the end zone for Barnesville's first touchdown of the game. He would run the same play for the two-point conversion

giving the Trojans an 8-0 lead after a beautifully executed seven play, 38 yard drive, giving Barnesville a load of confidence and momentum.

The Trojans defense would keep the momentum as they forced a fourth down play that saw quarterback Zach Yeager bobble the bad snap and cornerback, Adrian O'Brien come flying in to recover the ball on the Polars 31-yard line.

Barnesville would go right back to what worked well on the first drive, running the ball five times before Detloff found pay dirt with an eight yard touchdown run. Tonsfeldt would run in the conversion to make the score 16-0 Barnesville in the first quarter.

Minneapolis North finally started to move the ball on offense with the run until they got to midfield. The Trojans would once again force a fourth down play where middle linebacker, Brooks Martinson met the running back in the hole, stopping him short of a first down and giving the Trojans the ball back at their 46-yard line.

The Polars would force a Trojan punt and go for a big play as they connected on a pass that covered 40 yards, taking the ball down to the Trojans 16 yard line as the first quarter came to a close.

After a penalty backed them up to the 27-yard line, the Trojans would once again force a fourth down play. The Polars would run a hook and ladder pass play that saw the running back get past a Trojans defender, as he looked to be cruising to a first down or touchdown.

However, cornerback Chase Brenner would make the runner move sideways enough to give free safety Hinsz another step to race him down and force the runner out of bounds one yard short of the first down.

Barnesville would begin with the ball on their own six yard line and go back to doing what they had done so successfully all game.

A 16-yard run by Hinsz got them out of the shadows of their own end zone. That was soon followed by a one yard run from Detloff, before Tonsfeldt found a seam on a midline keeper and raced 52 yards before being tackled at the 24-yard line, flipping the field position once again in the favor of Barnesville.

The Trojans continued to move the chains with runs by Anderson and Tonsfeldt getting the ball to the 14-yard line. Hinsz took the next carry down to the two, with Brenner netting the touchdown run on the next play, culminating a seven play,

94-yard touchdown drive. The two-point conversion pass was stopped making the score 22-0 Barnesville.

The Polars would quickly get the ball to midfield again before fumbling the football on a handoff that was pounced on by defensive end Joey Mark at the 48-yard line of the Trojans.

Barnesville started with a five yard run by Hinsz before Detloff took an inside handoff 35 yards down to the 12 yard line. A penalty would move the ball to the seven where Anderson took the next carry down to the two. The next play saw Brenner net his second score from two yards out, giving the Trojans a 28-0 lead after the two-point conversion pass was knocked down.

The Trojans had dominated both sides of the ball for the first 21 minutes of the half, but the Polars still had three plus minutes to make some noise before intermission.

They would do exactly that, as they began to move the ball via the pass getting the ball to the Trojans 48 yard line. A swing pass saw the Trojans have it somewhat covered, but a questionable block sprung the Polars player free as he raced to the end zone 48 yards for Minneapolis North's first touchdown of the game. The two-point conversion pass was

called no good, but replay overturned the call making the score 28-8.

The Trojans were able to move the ball down the field, but ran out of time sending both teams into halftime. The Polars had some momentum on their side and would start the second half with the ball.

Barnesville's defense was making the Polars work for everything they got and forced another fourth down play that saw the Polars convert a first down. Minneapolis North would use this momentum to their advantage as they found a hole in Barnesville's defense, completing the pass as the receiver made a nice move to break free and race 48 yards to the end zone for their second score of the game. The two-point conversion pass was forced out of bounds to keep the score 28-14 Barnesville.

The Trojans got the ball back starting on their 35 yard line and went back to doing what they had done the entire first half. Run the ball and control the clock.

Hinsz started with a 10 yard run to move the chains and then it was the Detloff and Anderson show with Brenner mixing in a fourth down run for a first down to keep the drive alive. Both players accounted for the last 40 yards with Anderson netting 31 of the yards on four carries including the last carry from one yard out for the score. The two-

point conversion was snuffed out, but the Trojans had regained their 20-point lead at 34-14 and burned valuable time off the clock.

The Polars would return the kickoff all the way to the Trojans 35 yard line, but the Barnesville defense would come up with a big play as Tonsfeldt snared an interception off a Martinson tipped pass to stop their drive.

The Trojans would have to punt as they ran out the clock on quarter number three, pinning Minneapolis North down to their 12 yard line. The Polars would put together their best drive of the game as they used the run and the pass to march down the field 88 yards for the score on a two-yard touchdown run from Kehyan Porter. Barnesville would stop the two-point conversion run to keep the score at 34-20 in favor of the Trojans.

The Trojans lined up with their hands team as the Polars went for the onside kick. The ball was grabbed by Kaden Zenzen giving the Trojans possession at the 42-yard line. Barnesville was not able to do much with the ball, but took valuable time off the clock before having to punt.

However, the Trojan defense would come up big as they forced a fourth down play that was shut down as the long pass fell incomplete giving Barnesville the ball at the 25 yard line with very little time

remaining in the game.

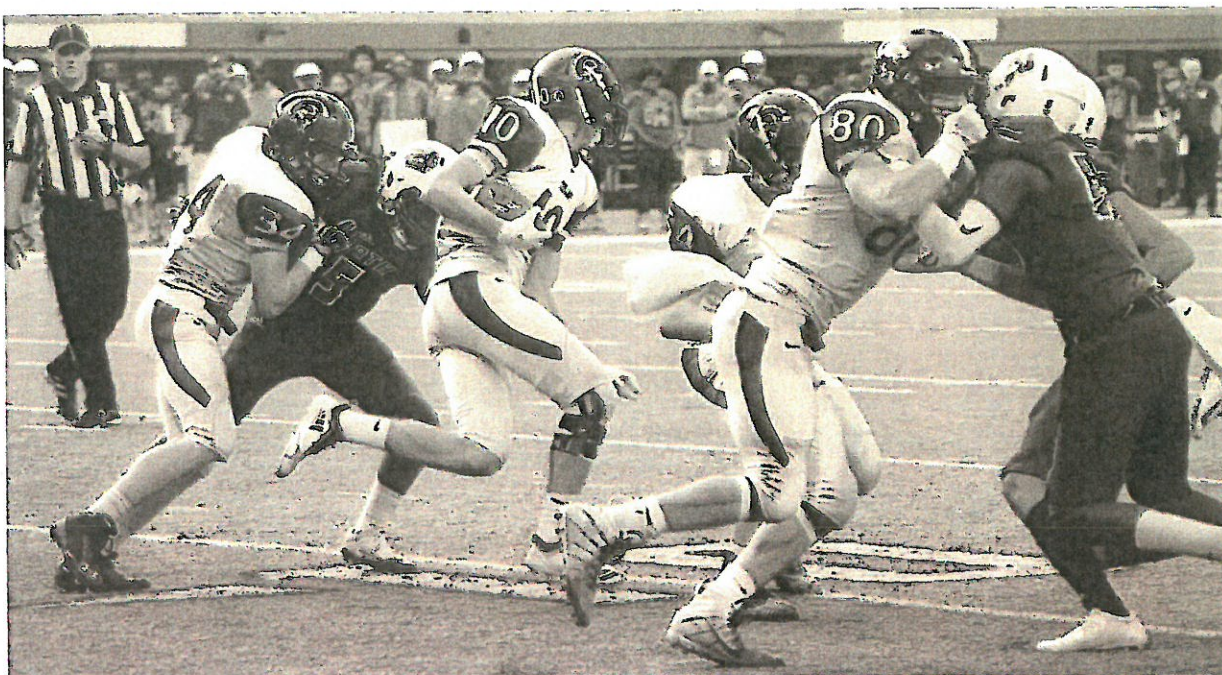
The Trojans would get one first down and then go into victory formation as Barnesville did what most people did not feel was possible in taking down undefeated Minneapolis North by the score of 34-20 and sending the team into the State Championship football game, where they will face three-time defending champion Caledonia.

"What a fantastic performance from everyone on the Barnesville Trojans team," stated Head Coach Bryan Strand. "Our kids had a fantastic start to the game with Preston Snobl returning the opening kickoff deep into their territory. We went to our running game and were getting yards and first downs quickly. If our kids were not sure if they could play with them, that first drive showed them quickly that they could.

Our defense also came up with some big fourth down stops and netted three turnovers that were critical to the victory. We controlled the ball and the clock, which is what we thought we would have to do against their high-powered, quick strike offense. They could not score if their offense was not on the field.

I am very proud of how disciplined we were in all facets of the game. We ran the ball north and south, using our quickness instead of trying to beat them with speed,

as they were much faster than our team. They had difficulty finding the football, allowing us to get yards in bunches. We averaged almost seven yards a carry, which is outstanding against a team that does not give up many yards or points.

I am very proud of the boys and the coaches for getting to this point. Everyone has worked extremely hard and put in countless hours to be here. We will need a great week of practice to get ready for an outstanding Caledonia team."

The Trojans finished with 388 total yards of offense, all on the ground on 57 carries, netting 21 first downs.

Tonsfeldt led Barnesville with 104 yards rushing on 12 carries, with Detloff adding 101 yards rushing on 16 carries and a touchdown.

Anderson tallied 97 yards rushing on 15 carries and a score with Hinsz netting 63 yards on eight carries. Brenner had 17 yards rushing on five carries and two touchdowns with Snobl adding one carry for six yards and a score.

Defensively, the Trojans gave up 395 total yards with 147 yards on the ground and 248 yards through the air. The Polars gained 18 first downs, but turned the ball over three

times.

O'Brien had a fantastic game as he tallied eight total tackles (3 solo, 5 assisted), with a fumble recovery and two tackles on kicks, with Mark adding eight tackles (2s,6a) with a fumble recovery and two tackles on kicks as well.

Anderson finished with seven tackles (4s,3a), two tackles for a loss and a tipped pass, with Hunter Zenzen netting 12 tackles (2s,10a) including one for a loss, while Tonsfeldt added eight tackles (2s,6a) and an interception.

Snobl chipped in eight tackles (2s,6a) and a tackle on a kick, with Martinson netting six tackles (1s,5a), including one for a loss, a tipped pass and a tackle on a kick.

Brenner had four solo tackles with Brady Kroll netting six tackles (1s,5a) and a tackle on a kick, while Jacob Morgan added two tackles (1s,1a) and two tackles on kicks.

The Trojans record now stands at 11-2 on the season. They will face three-time defending state champion Caledonia for the state championship on Friday, November 23 at 1 pm at US Bank Stadium in Minneapolis.

Barnesville push past Minneapolis North to reach sta...

MINNEAPOLIS — Barnesville coach Bryan Strand had a stroke in March. There were points where he thought he may die. A thought that never crossed his mind was not coaching high school football this season.

"It's part of who I am," Strand said. "It's part of my job. I think I'm a better principal because I'm a football coach. I got the respect of the kids and they listen very well and they're not going to be out there screwing around because they know they'll have to come and see me.

"I wasn't going to let that stop me. It just wasn't going to."

Minneapolis North couldn't stop Barnesville on Friday, as the Trojans rolled the Polars 34-20 in the Minnesota Class 2A semifinals Friday at U.S. Bank Stadium.

To begin the season, Strand was coming off a stroke, implementing a new offense he learned from Elk River with a sophomore quarterback who never played quarterback. That quarterback, Adam Tonsfeldt, broke his hand in a scrimmage before the season, and could not play quarterback until Week 6 of the season.

Minneapolis North, on the other hand, was a team that entered Friday having lost one game in its previous 35. It was a North team that was 11-0 and ranked No. 2 in the state.

It's now a North team that Barnesville sent to the offseason.

"He's such a big part of this team. I guarantee you we're not as good of a football team without him right here," Tonsfeldt said of Strand. "He gives us so much inspiration. He went through a lot and we know that. We're going to push ourselves. He wants to do it for us and we want to do it for him."

Barnesville junior Hunter Anderson couldn't resist chiming in.

"I don't think every student could say this, but I love my principal," said Anderson, who finished with 97 yards and a touchdown on 15 carries Friday.

Barnesville (11-2) was up 16-0 before North got its first first down. Preston Snobl took the opening kick 43 yards to the North 38.

Then, the Barnesville offense went to work. It took seven run plays to go 38 yards and find the end zone. Snobl took it in from 6 yards out and added the two-point conversion to put the Trojans up 8-0.

"We weren't disciplined on defense," North coach Charles Adams said. "We were running past the play and more of watching and see who has the ball instead of everybody doing their assignment."

Chase Brenner added a pair of two-yard touchdown runs to put the Trojans up 28-0 with 3 minutes, 43 seconds remaining in the first half. North entered Friday having given up 60 points in 11 games on the season. The most the Polars had given up in game all season was 28.

"To prove people wrong, it's fun," Anderson said.

North got on the board with a 47-yard touchdown pass from Zach Yeager to Nasir El-Amin with 1:46 remaining in the first half. Yeager found Eli Campbell for the two-point conversion to cut the lead to 28-8 at the halftime break.

Yeager and El-Amin hooked up for a 45-yard touchdown pass on the opening drive of the second half to cut the Barnesville lead to 28-14.

Barnesville answered with an 11-play, 65-yard drive that took more than six minutes off the clock. Anderson capped the drive with a 1-yard touchdown run to put the Trojans up 34-14 with 3:51 remaining in the third.

"Nobody really knows the strength of our offensive line, which I think is the strength of our team," said Tonsfeldt, who finished with 99 yards and two touchdowns on 12 carries. "They play so hard. They block so well. They know who to block. We get the touchdowns, but they should really be the ones getting the credit."

North would cut the lead to 34-20 on a 2-yard touchdown run from Kehyan Porter with 7:45 to go, but it was too late.

The underdog continues to bark, as Barnesville will take on top-ranked Caledonia at 1 p.m. Friday, Nov. 23, at U.S. Bank Stadium for the Class 2A title. Caledonia has won 53 straight games and three straight state titles.

"We're going to be ready for them," Tonsfeldt said. "They're a good team, but I guarantee we're going to be ready for them."

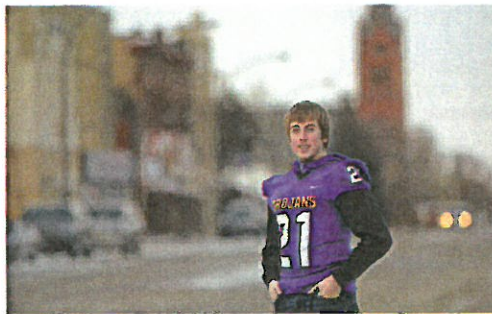

Barnesville used a fake reverse on the opening kickoff to give the Trojans' great field position. The Trojans' offense features two tight ends and three running backs in a straight T formation. They used the inside read option, trapping style offense used by Elk River and Lakeville South. **Preston Snobl** capped off their first drive with a 6-yard touchdown run. He also punched in the 2-point conversion giving the Trojans an early 8-0 lead. The only negative play was an illegal motion penalty.

North gambled on their first possession by going for it on fourth and three at their own 36. The Polars not only didn't convert, but they also fumbled, and Barnesville's **Adrian O'Brien** recovered the fumble.

The same formula worked for the Trojans on their second drive of the game. They moved the ball on the ground into the red zone and capped off the drive with **Nick Detloff** running right up the middle from eight yards out. The two-point conversion made the lead 16-0 with five minutes to go in the 1st quarter.

Going for it again on fourth and short, North was stuffed by **Hunter Zenzen** and **Brooks Marlinson** at the Barnesville 45. Barnesville could not convert the turnover into points as North's defense stood up to the Barnesville offense forcing a punt.

The Polars use the run game to set up the pass and hit a fade down the sidelines at the end of the first quarter. A penalty backed up North a couple of plays later forcing a fourth and twenty. A hook and ladder almost picked up the first down, but Barnesville took over at the seven-yard line.

Barnesville quarterback **Adam Tonsfeldt** pulled the ball out of the running back's belly and kept the ball on a misdirection play. His cutback got Barnesville into Polars' territory. Later in the drive, **Chase Brenner** got into the end zone for a three-yard touchdown. It capped a 93-yard drive. With over eight minutes to play in the first half, Barnesville led 22-0.

Barnesville's **Joey Mark** recovered a second North fumble stopping another promising drive for North. The turnover led to a two-yard touchdown run for Brenner giving the Trojans a 28-0 lead late in the first half.

A 50-yard touchdown catch for **Nasir El-Amin** from **Zach Yaeger** just before the half to cut the lead to 28-8 at the half.

North faced a 4th and five at mid-field coming out of the locker room. Yaeger was able to complete a pass into the flat to El-Amin to keep the drive alive. The conversion would lead to Yaeger's second touchdown pass to El-Amin. It would cut the lead to 28-14. The Polars would get no closer.

Barnesville converted their own fourth and short near mid-field, and the Trojans were also able to convert. The conversion led to an over six-minute drive capped off by a one-yard plunge by Hunter Anderson.

One play later Barnesville had the ball back. Marlinson tipped a pass over the middle and Tonsfeldt grabbed the fluttering ball giving the Trojans the ball back.

Tackle **Gabe Dent**, guard **Connor Morse**, center **Jackson Poepping**, guard **Jonny Robideau** and tackle **Brady Kroll** dominated the North front seven.

Barnesville's victory sends them to the Prep Bowl to face Caledonia.

"One day at a time," Zenzen said. "We focus on one game and we're this far so might as well win the whole thing."

## Football | Class AA state finals: Caledonia looks to 'leave it all on the field'

There was a time when Caledonia football coach Carl Freuchte may have had some doubts about the current class of senior players on the team.



Those doubts are long gone.

Led by that senior class, the Warriors are now just one victory away from a fourth straight Class AA state championship.

Caledonia (12-0), ranked No. 1 in the state in Class AA, will put its national-best 53-game winning streak on the line when it faces unranked Barnesville (11-2) in the Prep Bowl at 1 p.m. Friday at U.S. Bank Stadium.

"More than anything we just want to do it the right way for the seniors," Fruechte said. "They've grown up a lot since their younger days and matured a lot."

Fruechte said he had a long talk with the team in June about "being a brotherhood" and what the expectations should be this season.

"These guys bought in and really came together," Fruechte said.

Fruechte said the Warriors never talk about their long winning streak and he just wants the team to keep improving and play to the best of its ability.

"We just hope to finish strong and leave it all on the field," the coach said. "The guys are focused and they know it will be another big challenge for them."

The Caledonia players are once again enjoying the ride as they embark on a fourth straight unbeaten season.

"We don't get nervous, we just get more excited," senior running back/linebacker Nick McCabe said. "It makes it more fun to play."

In Friday's title game, the Warriors will take on a Barnesville team that relies almost entirely on the run. The Trojans use a Wing-T or a Straight-T with a quarterback and usually three running backs in the backfield. Barnesville has been successful using a lot of misdirection.

It is an offense that Caledonia faced this season when playing Cannon Falls.

"We hope that helps in some regard," Fruechte said. "I guess I'd say they (the Trojans) are very good at it. We have to make sure we stay at home and attack our gaps."



Caledonia might have a slight size disadvantage, but the Warriors are physical and use great team speed to allow foes an average of just 5.0 points per game.

"I'd like to think so," Fruechte said of having the speed advantage, "but we're hoping we don't overrun our gaps."

Despite Barnesville's running attack, the Trojans don't have one dominating ground gainer. They do feature balance with four or five solid rushers. Coming into the state tournament, Nick Detloff had rushed for 1,084 yards, Chase Breener for 566 and Adam Tonsfeldt for 442. The team's two quarterbacks, Tonsfelt and Preston Snobl, had combined to throw just 42 passes coming into the state tourney.

"You have to have eight in the box and have a good pass-run read," Fruechte said.

Barnesville, the Section Eight champion, averages 36.9 points and allows 10.2 per game. Fruechte expects the Trojans to play both 3-4 and 4-3 fronts on defense.

While Barnesville's offense is one dimensional, Caledonia has a very balanced attack. McCabe has rushed for 1,384 yards and 14 TDs, and senior Jack Beardmore has run for 832 yards and seven scores. Even junior QB Noah King has 418 yards and 13 TDs.

King has completed 134 of 238 passes for 1,825 yards and 17 touchdowns while leading an offense that averages 37.0 points per game. Senior receivers Tate Meiners (44 catches, 761 yards, 7 TDs) and Kyle Cavanaugh (31 catches, 242 yards, 1 TD) have been his top targets, while senior tight end Evan Denstad (19 catches, 248 yards, 1 TD) and freshman Eli King (eight catches, 253 yards, 1 TD) both have more than 200 yards receiving.

"We have to protect up front and give Noah time to throw the ball," Fruechte said. "And we have to open holes so we can run the ball. We have to communicate up front."

Caledonia was ranked No. 2 in the state in Class AA in the QRF ratings behind Minneapolis North. Barnesville, No. 9 in the QRF, defeated North 34-20 in the state semifinals.

"Barnesville is good. They were able to shut down North for the most part," Fruechte said. "They have good speed and quickness, too."

Strand told Tonsfeldt he wanted him to play quarterback in his new offensive scheme next season. Tonsfeldt had never played quarterback. He was a tailback. Suddenly the chair wasn't so comfortable.

"He said it was the best move for the team," Tonsfeldt said. "That's what he wanted, so that's what was going to be done."

Tonsfeldt, now a sophomore, will line up at quarterback to lead Barnesville into the Minnesota Class 2A state title game against Caledonia at 1 p.m. Friday at U.S. Bank Stadium.

"I've heard about it my whole life," Tonsfeldt said. "It shows you don't have to be the biggest guy or tallest guy to have success. You can do it all at different sizes."

Tonsfeldt being short is not the only reason Strand chose him to lead his offense, which has rushed for 4,229 yards this season.

"I'm a big basketball fan, so I've watched him for years on the basketball court," Strand said. "He has a quiet demeanor about him. He's a very good tailback and we wanted a tailback at that quarterback spot. Even if he screwed up this year we figured he'd have a few more years to grow into it."

"I think the kid is just a natural leader. I think kids follow him pretty well. And he's extremely intelligent."

Things didn't start off so well for Tonsfeldt this season. In the first scrimmage of the season, before he could even get a snap at quarterback, Tonsfeldt tipped a pass against Park Rapids and





"When he screws up, he's the first one to admit it," Strand said. "He doesn't blame anyone else. We allow him to change plays at the line and flip stuff based on what he sees. We let him change things up because we think he's smart enough to do it."

Despite not playing offense until the sixth game of the season, Tonsfeldt has rushed for 684 yards and nine touchdowns on 88 carries. He's also thrown for 271 yards, two touchdowns and two interceptions. He's got 18 solo tackles, 33 tackle assists, five tackles for loss, one fumble recovery and seven interceptions on defense as well.

"The defense has a hard time finding that ball and then, boom, he's gone," Strand said. "He's got quick feet. He's been the starting point guard for the last two seasons, so he's used to seeing multiple things in front of him."

Tonsfeldt has been going to Barnesville football games since he was 5 years old. He says he got into football because of the team aspect of it.

"It's not one player or one play that wins or loses a game, it's a team effort," Tonsfeldt said.

When he was told he was going to try quarterback, he went to a quarterback camp in Minnetonka, Minn., to work on throwing, not that Barnesville has done much of that this season. He studied film for seven hours before the semifinals and plans to have 10 hours of film under his belt before taking on a Caledonia team that has won 53 straight games and three straight state titles.

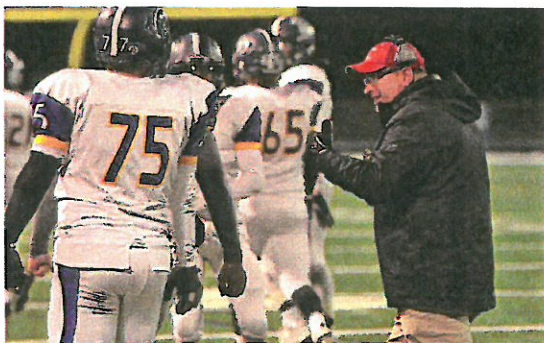

# Trojans Battle To Very End In Losing State Title Game To Caledonia

This team had been through this scenario for four straight weeks as the underdog to a more powerful or experienced team. It was once again billed as a David vs Goliath showdown.

Much like the week before in the semi-finals of the state football playoffs, the Trojans were given very little chance to win by anyone outside of their coaches, their players and their fans.

But, heart and preparation can change a lot of things and that is what this 2018 Barnesville Trojan football team was all about - Heart and Preparation!

The Trojans were facing a Caledonia Warriors team that has the longest winning streak in the United States in high school football and had won the last three state titles and eight out of the last 10. They are a dynasty! But everyone knows that dynasties will one day come to an end and the Trojan football team firmly believed that this was going to be that day.

A defensive showcase by both teams was put on display from the opening kickoff. Caledonia quickly found out that Barnesville was not going to be a push over. The Warriors had to fight for every inch to net a first down. Nothing was coming easy.

The Warriors opened up the game with the ball on their 44 yard line. They would use 13 plays netting a few first downs, before turning the ball over on downs to the Trojans at the eight yard line as Barnesville came up with a fantastic fourth down stop by linebacker Hunter Anderson.

Caledonia went to their whole playbook on the drive, but the Trojans would stand tall. A bend but don't break defensive stand.

As good as the Trojan defense was on their first series, the Warriors proved to be even better, as they held the Trojans to no yards on three carries, forcing a short punt and taking over the ball on the Trojans 25 yard line.

However, Barnesville's defense was up to the challenge as well,

forcing another fourth down and getting the ball back after Chase Brenner broke up a pass play in the end zone.

The Trojans would quickly net a first down after a short run by Brenner, ending the first quarter with the score tied at zero.

Barnesville started to move the ball, netting another first down and had a third and one play at the Warriors 48 yard line before a false start penalty backed the Trojans up five yards. The next play would be snuffed out by Caledonia forcing a Trojans punt with the Warriors taking over on their 29 yard line.

The Warriors went for a big play on first down and completed a pass, moving the ball into Trojan territory at the 37. After a pass play moved the ball to the 22 yard line, the Trojans defense would come up big again as linebacker, Preston Snobl intercepted a pass from Noah King, returning the ball back to the 22 yard line. Barnesville's defense was proving to be no slouch with their third stop of the game to get the ball



back to the offense.

Caledonia's offense might not be as strong as it has been in year's past, but their defense was still as dominant as before, forcing the Trojan offense to fight for every yard they could get.

A Trojan miscue on second down saw the ball come loose with the Warriors the recipient of the recovery at the Trojan 23 yard line. Barnesville would quickly force a third down and long play with the Warriors running a pitch to running back Nick McCabe to the wide side of the field. He would find a seam and race to the end zone for a 22 yard touchdown run. The extra point by Ryan Wagner was good giving the Warriors a 7-0 lead with four minutes and 53 seconds remaining in the second quarter.

The Trojans knew that in order to win this game, they had to secure the ball and limit penalties. Both categories would hurt Barnesville in the first half and late in the game.

The offense started the next series at their 31 yard line and quickly rattled off a 15 yard run by quarterback Adam Tonsfeldt. The Trojans were sitting at the Warrior's 49 yard line, facing a third and

five play, when running back Nick Detloff broke off an 11 yard run. However, Barnesville was called for an illegal shift penalty to negate the first down. Barnesville's third down running play was sniffed out forcing another punt after a promising start.

The Trojans had a golden opportunity as Snobl's punt was muffed at the 30 yard line with a Barnesville player close to the ball, but he was not able to secure it as the Warriors picked it up and rambled to the 37.

The defense came up with a great defensive play as Hunter Zenzen knocked away a pass intended for a Warriors receiver down the right sideline on second down, before the Trojans forced another punt with a defensive stop on third down.

But the Trojans would fumble the ball on their first carry on offense with Caledonia recovering at the 22 yard line late in the first half. Barnesville's defense had to make a stop or the game would get out of hand.

Things did not look good as a second down run by King put the ball at the Trojans four yard line with 50 seconds to play in the half. But Barnesville would get a break as the

shot gun snap by Caledonia was low and went through the legs of King. A scramble ensued with Anderson taking King out of the play and Zenzen cleaning up the fumble with a recovery at the 26 yard line. The Trojans would run two plays before the clock wound down, sending both teams into halftime with Caledonia leading 7-0.

Barnesville's defense was fantastic in the first half as they forced two fourth down stops, intercepted a pass and recovered a fumble. Take away the one rushing touchdown, and the Trojans had kept Goliath at bay.

However, the Warriors defense was equally as good if not better in the first half as they forced a pair of fumbles and a handful of punts. They were controlling the line of scrimmage and not allowing the Trojan's running game to get any traction.

Barnesville would open the second half with the ball. A promising start saw the Trojans face a third and one play at the 44 yard line, but Caledonia would blow the play up for a loss and force a punt. The Warriors would muff another punt, but the ball would bounce right

back to them as they took over on the 29 yard line.

The Trojan defense was once again up to the task as a chop block penalty moved Caledonia deep into their own territory.

Facing a third and 16 play, the Warriors competed a bubble screen pass that looked to gain yardage. But safety Kellen Hinsz came flying up to make a hard tackle while the pursuit of linebacker, Zenzen brought down the receiver four yards short of a first down, forcing another punt.

The Trojans defense was playing outstanding football. They played fast, physical and were not intimidated by anything Caledonia was throwing at them.

Barnesville would take over at the 32 yard line and the first play

from scrimmage saw Detloff rip off a run of 19 yards, moving the ball into Caledonia territory.

After a penalty brought back an eight yard run, Tonsfeldt would play Houdini on his next carry as he made four or five Warrior players miss tackles on his 29 yard scamper that took the ball down to the 25 yard line.

Caledonia would force a fourth down play and the Trojans looked to have something big happen, but Tonsfeldt's pass found two Trojans in the same area and neither player could corral the ball turning it over on downs and negating Barnesville's best scoring chance of the game.

The Trojans defense would stay rock solid as nose guard Jackson Poepping stuffed a first down run with the Warriors being penalized

with illegal touching, loss of down on their next play. The third down play was stopped as Hinsz and Brenner made the tackle short of the first down to force another punt.

Barnesville looked to have great field position again as Brenner returned the punt to the Warrior 49 yard line, but another penalty would back the Trojans up.

Tonsfeldt would get the first two carries with Anderson netting the first down run to move the ball to the 46 yard line. Hinsz would take the next carry for a 10 yard gain to move the chains again.

Detloff would take the next carry for a five yard gain with Tonsfeldt adding a nine yard run and a Trojan first down at the Warriors 30 yard line as the third quarter came to a close. David was going to the fourth

quarter trailing Goliath by a score of 7-0 with the ball deep in their territory. A story book ending was looking possible.

The offense was beginning to move the ball, wearing down the Warriors defense. But, Caledonia would find their second wind and force a fourth down play.

The play called for a pass that looked to have some big play capability.

The Warrior defender, McCabe got a finger on the ball, causing it to change direction slightly, bouncing off the finger tips of Detloff. Detloff almost had another chance at it, but the defender tackled him as the ball fell to the turf incomplete. A great defensive play negated another Trojan rally, keeping them out of the end zone.

Caledonia decided to go to the ground and pound game with McCabe taking the first carry up the middle, breaking three tackles and racing 24 yards to the Trojans 46 before Tonsfeldt made the tackle.

McCabe took the next carry nine yards before breaking through on his third carry for 19 yards to the 19 yard line, before Hinsz made a touchdown saving tackle.

Barnesville's defense was on their heels, somewhat tired, and the Warriors could sense this as they kept pounding the ball with McCabe, who was running through tacklers, netting big yards. Caledonia had finally found something they could be successful with and they kept running the ball between the tackles.

Two plays later the Warriors had another first down, when they decided to change up their play calling. This helped the Trojans as they held them to a short gain on first down and almost caused a big defensive play on second.

Caledonia's King went back to pass and was chased down by Zenzen who hit his arm just as it was going forward for an incomplete pass. A split second earlier and it might have been a fumble, but that was the story of the game for both teams.

Both played very hard, gave everything they had, but the ball always seemed to bounce in the favor of the three-time defending state champs.

A third down play saw the Trojans grab the facemask of the ball carrier, putting the ball down to the two yard line. Barnesville would stop the run bringing up a fourth down play from

the one. The state championship would come down to this play.

Coach Strand called a timeout just before the play got off as the Warriors scored the touchdown, giving his team one more chance.

But Caledonia went back to their smash mouth football game with Tate Meiners pounding it into the end zone from one yard out for the score with 4:29 to play in the game. The extra point was good making the score 14-0 Caledonia.

Barnesville tried to make things happen as they went to the passing game and into their wildcat formation. After a nice run by Detloff, a bobbled snap saw backup quarterback Snobl recover the ball and throw a pass intended for Tonsfeldt.

The Warriors defender Payton Schott would make a great play to tip the ball up in the air, secure the interception at the 43 yard line and race to the end zone untouched for a defensive touchdown to virtually end the game. The extra point was good making the score 21-0.

The Trojans would turn the ball over on downs with a fourth down sack by Caledonia, who would take over the ball and run out the clock



for their fourth state championship in a row.

"This is a great group of kids, whom I could not have asked any more from," stated Head Coach Bryan Strand. "We battled and fought with a team that had won 53 straight games and three state titles in a row. We showed no fear and played with a passion to end both streaks. The outcome did not come out the way we wanted, but the journey is what I think is the most important part here.

This group of kids takes to coaching, as well as any team I have ever had. They listen and don't bicker or fight with each other. They are great kids.

Everything was set up for how I saw the game turning out. I thought our kids had a ton of grit today. They didn't let up. We made some mistakes. They're kids, they're going to make mistakes, but our kids never quit. They played so hard it was a shame anyone had to lose this game. We had so many kids banged up with shoulders, knees and ankles. It was their 14th game of the season. But they stood toe-to-toe with the best team in the state and gave them all they could handle. They truly made this coach pretty dang proud.

That is the best dang team in the state, hands down. They blow away everybody and we were right there with them. Our kids played and prepared for this game as well as they could have."

Head Coach Carl Fruechte

had this to say about the Trojans. "Barnesville deserves a lot of respect. Their defense was awesome. Gave us lots of fits."

For the game, the Trojans finished with 136 total yards of offense, all rushing on 43 carries with eight first downs, but had three turnovers.

Tonsfeldt led the Trojans with 88 yards rushing on 18 carries, with Detloff adding 38 yards rushing on 10 carries. Hinsz finished the game with four carries for 11 yards rushing with Anderson adding nine yards on three carries.

Defensively the Trojans held the Warriors to 240 total yards of offense with 156 yards on the ground and 84 yards through the air, netting 11 first downs while committing two turnovers.

Zenzen led Barnesville with 10 tackles (6 solo, 4 assisted), a tipped pass, a fumble recovery and a tackle on a kick, with Snobl adding nine tackles (4s,5a) and an interception.

Adrian O'Brian finished with five tackles (4s,1a) with Anderson adding six tackles (2s,4a) and a tackle on a kick. Brenner added four tackles all solo with Brooks Martinson netting six tackles (2s,4a) in the loss.

Coach Strand had these final comments on the game and the season for his squad. "I am sad that the season is over, but not sad about the wonderful journey the players and coaches took over the past 16 weeks. What a great group of men the community and the town can be proud of. This team made

Barnesville fans, near and far, proud to be a Trojan! What a great group of seniors, they will be greatly missed."

The Trojans season ends with an overall record of 11 wins and three losses and a State Runner-Up finish in Class AA football for the 2018 season. Congratulations to all the coaches and players on an outstanding, fun-filled season!

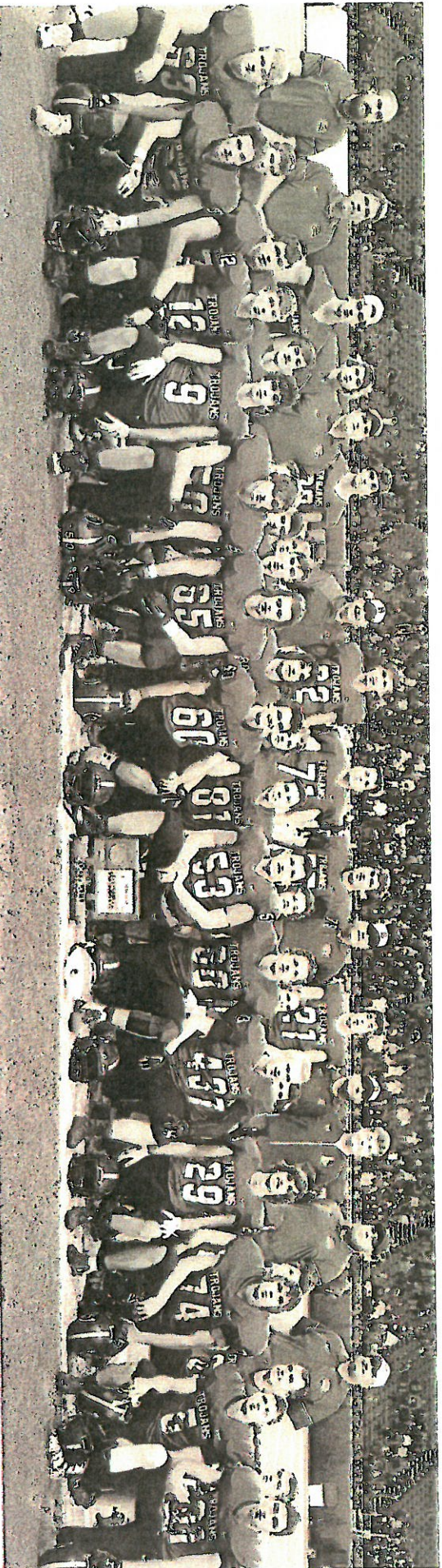

VIDEO: Caledonia tops Barnesville for fourth straight ...



MINNEAPOLIS — Barnesville was exactly where it wanted to be Friday at U.S. Bank Stadium. It was within one score in the fourth quarter of the Minnesota Class 2A state championship against top-ranked Caledonia.

The Trojans cared not about the 53 straight wins or three straight state titles the Warriors brought with them. They had their eyes set on their first ever state title.

On fourth-and-9, from the Caledonia 29-yard line, Barnesville quarterback Adam Tonsfeldt was asked to do something he had only done 25 times all season. Tonsfeldt had to pass. He shook off a tackle and floated a ball to senior Nick Detloff, who had nothing but the end zone in front of him.

Caledonia's Nick McCabe somehow got a fingertip on the ball to tip it in the air and Detloff couldn't haul in the deflection, smashing the turf with his fists.

The Warriors would put the game away on the ensuing drive, topping Barnesville 21-0 for the state title.

"This is a great group of kids," Barnesville coach Bryan Strand said. "They listen, they don't bicker, they don't fight and they take the coaching as well as any team I've ever had. The end result isn't what we wanted, but the journey is what I think is the most important part here."

The lone score of the first half came off a Barnesville turnover. The Trojans fumbled the ball and Ryan Wagner pounced on it at the Barnesville 23-yard line.

Two plays later, McCabe laid a stiff arm en route to a 22-yard touchdown run and a 7-0 Caledonia lead with 4 minutes, 53 seconds remaining in the first half.

"We couldn't have asked for a better, more exciting game than this," Caledonia senior Ryan Wagner said. "This was just what we wanted."

The Warriors had their opportunities to put the game away in the first half, but the Barnesville (11-3) defense would not break. Hunter Anderson blew up a play in the backfield on a fourth-and-1 run from the Barnesville 8 to end Caledonia's opening drive. Chase Brenner broke up a pass in the end zone on fourth-and-6, from the Barnesville 21, on the ensuing Caledonia drive to keep the Warriors off the scoreboard. Preston Snobl picked off a Noah King pass at the Barnesville 13 on Caledonia's first drive of the second quarter.

first half. A King 18-yard run set up the Warriors with a first down at the Barnesville 4. A bad snap and Hunter Zenzen chasing down the ball kept Caledonia out of the end zone again.

"Barnesville deserves a ton of respect," Caledonia coach Carl Fruechte said. "Their defense was awesome, really gave us a lot of fits."

The Trojans had 32 total yards of offense and two turnovers on 21 offensive plays in the first half, but Caledonia only had a 7-0 lead at the break.

"In the first half, they came out with a different defense than we thought they were going to play, so we had to make some adjustments at halftime," Tonsfeldt said. "We had just guys going to the wrong linebackers and different things like that."



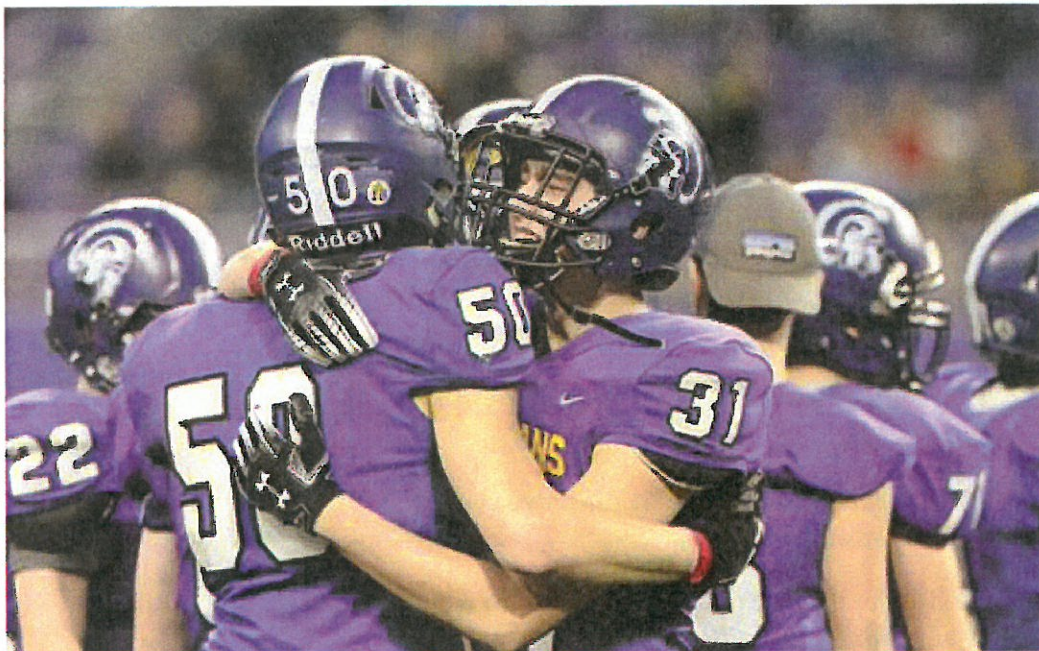

There was still 9:45 remaining in the game after McCabe knocked Tonsfeldt's pass away from Detloff. On the ensuing drive, he knocked Barnesville defenders to the turf, plowing through Trojans for runs of 24, 9, 19, 6 and 4 yards on the first five plays of the drive. McCabe set up a first-and-goal from the 9 for Caledonia.

"We got the energy up a lot once we started getting some holes and we just kept hitting them," said McCabe, who finished with a game-high 115 yards rushing on 14 carries.

Barnesville made a stop that would've brought up fourth-and-goal from the 7, but a facemask penalty gave Caledonia a third-and-goal from the 2. The Trojans stuffed the first attempt, but Tate Meiners punched it in on fourth down to make it a 14-0 game with 5:16 remaining. It was his only carry of the game.

"Winning all the time, you know what it takes to be successful like that," Meiners said. "Being here, I can't talk enough about the role models that we have with our coaching staff and the guys that came before us. They've been awesome. We just try to be like them pretty much."

Trailing by two touchdowns, Barnesville was forced to throw. Caledonia (13-0) put the finishing touches on its fourth straight state title with a 43-yard interception return for a touchdown by Payton Schott on Barnesville's third play from scrimmage on the ensuing drive.

"Everything was set up for how I saw the game turning out," Strand said. "I thought our kids had a ton of grit today. They didn't let up. We made some mistakes. They're kids, they're going to make mistakes, but they made this coach pretty dang proud."

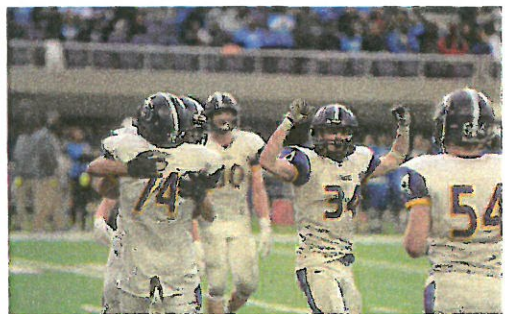

## Football | Class AA: Caledonia's winning tradition continues

MINNEAPOLIS — This time it was close.

Caledonia has won a lot of blowout games, including at the state tournament, while winning the past three Class AA football championships. The Warriors capped another unbeaten season with a fourth straight state championship on Friday at U.S. Bank Stadium. But this time it was a tussle as the



Warriors needed two touchdowns in the fourth quarter to pull away and defeat Barnesville 21-0.

The Warriors have prepared for situations in which they are in close games, or even behind.

"We talk a lot about it in practice, what are we going to do? Are we going to freak out, are we going to handle it?" coach Carl Fruechte said. "We try to put ourselves mentally there."

"We talk about it all the time," Caledonia senior tight end/linebacker Evan Denstad said. "It makes it almost not that hard to deal with when we're actually in the game. I have to give the coaches credit for that."

## MADE IT INTERESTING

After winning their first two state games 41-0 and 40-6, the Warriors didn't mind playing a close game.

"I think it is probably little bit more exciting, especially being on the biggest stage, where it wasn't given to us," junior Noah King said. "We really had to battle for it and we stuck together and everyone did their job and we came out on top."

Caledonia has now won 54 straight games. It has not only won four straight state titles, but 10 overall and a whopping nine since 2007.

"It teaches us a lot of life skills," Denstad said. "Winning all the time, you know what it takes to be successful like that. And being here, I can't talk enough about the role models we have with the coaching staff and the guys that came before us. They've been awesome, and we just try to be like



them and it works out fine usually.”

For many of the players, they have had older siblings or other relatives pave the way for the winning atmosphere.

“It means a lot to me because I’ve seen my brother do it,” senior Nick McCabe said. “I’ve seen my cousins do it. We just grew up watching other teams play and watching them be successful for our whole childhoods. And we set our goals of being No. 1 and winning a state championship.”

Owen King had quarterbacked the Warriors to the past three state titles. His brother, Noah King, is now the Warriors’ QB. In Friday’s defensive struggle, King was 9-for-19 passing for 84 yards and an interception. He also rushed for 34 yards.

“I would say it’s more exciting this year,” King said. “Just a bigger role, so it means more.”

Caledonia’s defense was facing a Barnesville team that relies almost entirely on the run and uses a lot of misdirection with a quarterback and three running backs in the backfield. The Warriors were able to stifle the Barnesville ground game most of the way. The Trojans rushed for just 132 yards on 43 attempts and had zero yards passing.

“Our ‘D’ line played fast and hard and hit the gaps, and it just freed me up,” said Denstad, who had a team-high nine tackles. “Everyone was just playing hard.”

McCabe and Kyle Cavanaugh both had eight tackles for Caledonia, while Ezra Dvoreak and Isaiah Forrester recorded sacks.

“We just had to keep communicating,” McCabe said. “They had some shifty players and some big linemen, and we had to all make sure every gap was accounted for and go hard.”

Barnesville was also tough on defense. It limited Caledonia to 240 yards. The Warriors broke a scoreless tie in the second quarter when McCabe scored on a 22-yard run with 4:53 left in the half. Senior defensive end Ryan Wagner set up the 23-yard drive with a fumble recovery.

“We couldn’t move the ball and they’re incredibly aggressive and incredibly fast and strong on defense,” Barnesville quarterback Adam Tonsfeldt said. “They all play with high motors, (and) they’re well coached.”



The game remained 7-0 until Caledonia came up with a big defensive stop in the fourth quarter. Barnesville (11-3) advanced to the Caledonia 29 and had a chance to tie the game. But the Trojans, who didn't complete a pass all game, just missed on a deep throw on a fourth-and-9 play from the 29.

The Warriors then turned to McCabe running the ball for a key 71-yard scoring drive. The senior had runs of 24, 9, 19, 6 and 4 on consecutive runs as Caledonia reached the Barnesville 9. McCabe finished with 14 carries for 115 yards.

"We got the energy up a lot once we started getting some holes," McCabe said. "We just started them and we had to run the clock out.

"They were flowing to the ball really hard; they had great linebackers," he added. "We just had to get through the hole fast."

Senior Tate Meiners capped the drive with a 1-yard scoring run with 4:29 left as the Warriors took a 14-0 lead and finally had some breathing room.

"We probably ran the ball 80 yards down field, and Nick ran the ball hard and Tate did at the end," King said. "It was really fun watching them be physical up front and the backs running hard."

Defensive back Payton Schott sealed the victory on the next Barnesville possession. The senior made a leaping one-handed interception along the sideline and returned it 43 yards for the clinching touchdown in the hard-fought game.

Not that the Warriors minded the challenge from the worthy Barnesville team, which is coached by Bryan Strand, the son of former Southland coach Dick Strand.

"We couldn't have asked for a better and more exciting game," Wagner said. "This is just what we wanted. We wanted a tight game."
