The Barnesville Trojans had a magical 2018 season, making it to the state championship game, where they battled powerhouse Caledonia for four quarters before coming up short. The 2019 Trojans are hoping to jump on the success of last year in their quest to make it back to US Bank stadium for the third time in four seasons.

Back to lead Barnesville for his 15th season as the head coach is Bryan Strand. Coach Strand has an overall record of 115 wins and 40 losses with last year's team finishing at 11-3.

The 2018 team was not the favorite to make to the state tournament, but the team gelled and bonded very well as the season played out. They finished 4-2 in the Midwest District-White Division, losing two one-point games to end the season before winning the section championship over Hawley.

The Trojans would go on to crush Moose Lake-Willow River before taking down powerful Minneapolis North in the state semifinals at US Bank Stadium. They went toe-to-toe with juggernaut Caledonia, but could not slay the dragon, succumbing in a close battle.

Strand has guided his team to three straight Section 8AA Conference championships, making it to US Bank Stadium two times. The goal of this year's team is to keep the tradition going that has been put before them.

"Last year was another outstanding season of Trojan football," Strand said. "We had a very successful team that came together at the right time. The senior class was a fantastic group that worked very hard and bonded

together. Every one of those seniors led this team and had a hand in our success as state runner-up in Class AA football.

"We lost a lot of talent with the graduations of Sam Askegaard, Luke Aaudett Chase Brenner, Gabe Dent, Nick Detloff, Kellen Hinsz, Grant Inniger, Brooks Martinson, Jacob Morgan, Jackson Poepping and Preston Snobl. I thank each of them and wish them the very best in their future endeavors. But we have grown a program that has underclassmen ready to step up and help lead our team in 2019. Our offseason weight room work was outstanding. As much fun as last season was, we are looking forward to our upcoming season."

Assisting Coach Strand will be some familiar faces as offensive coordinator Phil Trowbridge returns for a 20th season with Nick Paur and Nathan Strand back to lead the JV and freshman teams.

Volunteer coaches include Scott Snobl, Ace Gregg and Dain Biewer, while the Junior High coaches are Matt Askegaard, eighth grade; Scott Amundson, seventh grade; and Tracy Hinsz, 7/8 grade assistant.

Barnesville returns some talented players for the 2019 season. Senior Hunter Zenzen returns for his final campaign with continued high expectations having played since the eighth grade. He signed to play college football at Iowa State and is looking to lead his team back to US Bank Stadium.

He will be joined by fellow seniors Connor Morse, Hunter Anderson and Matt Samuelson, who were vital in the team's success last season. Morse and Samuelson will anchor the offensive and defensive lines, with Anderson taking on full-time duties at running back and linebacker.

Another prominent player back this season is junior quarterback/defensive back Adam Tonsfeldt. He started last season with a broken

hand and did not play right away. When he returned, the offense entered another level with his ability to hide, deceive and run the football. His vision and ability to make people miss tackles makes him extremely difficult to tackle. He also was a ball hawk, leading the team in interceptions as well.

Other players who saw action last season and are ready to see increased time are juniors Joey Mark, tight end/defensive end and Aaron Schiefert, running back/linebacker. Juniors Eric Ackerson, Ian Bolgrean, Carter DuBord, Toby Elliott, Brady Kroll, Mason Moen, Jack Olson, Marcus Paul, Nolan Rick and Cole Swenson will also vye for playing time.

The sophomore class will include Travis Affield, Brady Dollison, Logan Ernst, Noah Krause, Bryce Krueger, Ryan Martinson, Joaquin Nelson, Peyton Pauna, Wyatt Roller and Kason Sysmsma. There are 25 freshmen trying out for the team this season.

"We have a lot of talented athletes returning from last year's state runner-up team," said Strand. "These players have played a lot of minutes and will be expected to step into important leadership roles. Zenzen returns for his final season of Trojan football, and is super excited to get the season going. He is a workout warrior, motivating other

players to get into the weight room. Add in seniors Hunter Anderson, Connor Morse and Matt Samuelson, along with juniors Adam Tonsfeldt, Joey Mark and Aaron Schiefert and a few other younger players, we have high expectations for the 2019 season."

Continuity at the youth football levels all the way up through the varsity, has been instrumental in the success the team has built over the last 10-plus years. Players have bought into the Trojan Football tradition with weightlifting, teamwork and cohesiveness.

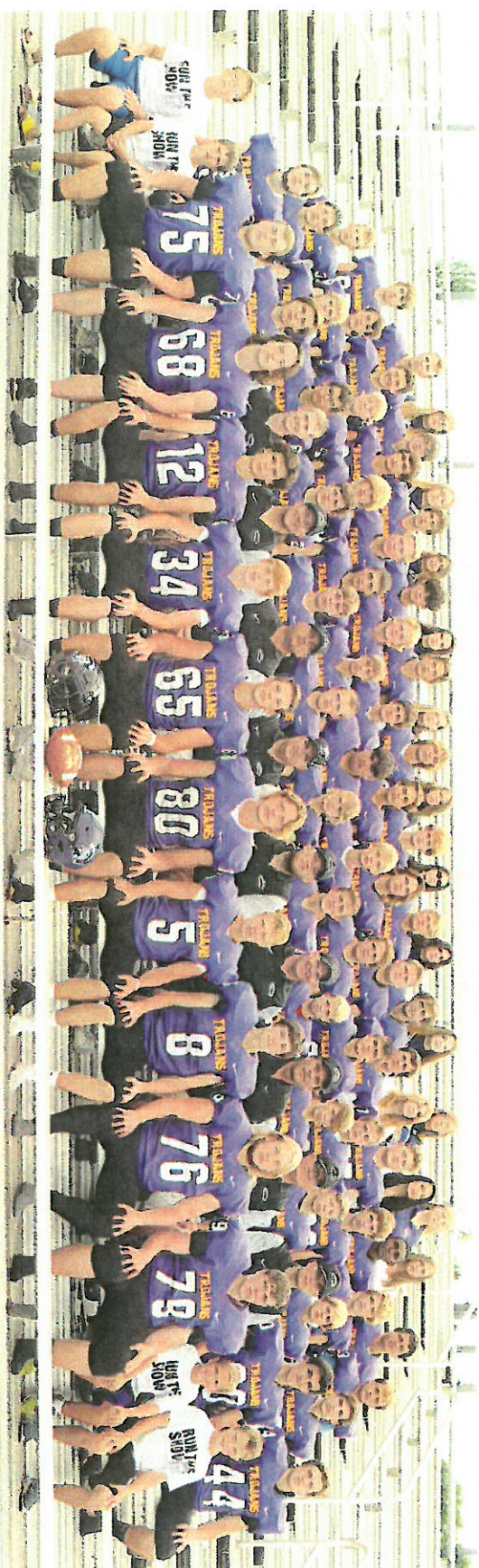

Tonsfeldt Leads Trojans To Opening Season Victory

The Barnesville Trojans played a strong first half to open up a big lead and cruised to a convincing 35-22 road victory over Ada-Borup/Norman County West to open up the 2019 football season on Friday, August 31, 2019.

Adam Tonsfeldt spearheaded the victory with two touchdown passes, two, two-point conversion runs, a touchdown run and an interception.

It did not take long for the Trojans to strike as Aaron Schiefert scored on a 35 yard run a few plays into the game with Tonsfeldt adding the two-point conversion for an 8-0 lead.

Tonsfeldt would find Iowa State University football commit, Hunter Zenzen for a five yard touchdown pass on their second possession that made the score 14-0 after the missed PAT.

Barnesville was not done yet in the first quarter as Tonsfeldt would connect with Cameron Heng on another touchdown pass of five yards with Tonsfeldt adding the two-point conversion run for a 22-0 lead after one quarter of play.

The second quarter would see Schiefert score his second touchdown of the game, this time from 27 yards out with the two-point conversion run no good that increased the Trojans lead to 28-0.

Tonsfeldt would close out an impressive first half of Trojan football with a six yard score, while Nolan Rick converted the PAT for a 35-0 lead that Barnesville would take into halftime.

"We played a terrific first half of football," said Head Coach Bryan Strand. "But the second half was way below average. We rotated players and rested some guys, but our backups have to be better and we have to take care of the football.

The first half we had 195 yards rushing and 10 yards passing and

built a 35-0 lead. Our defense held them to 17 total yards. We came out thinking they were going to roll over in the second half and that everything would be super easy. This was a good lesson to learn.

Ada is a very good team and very well coached. They might run the table and win the rest of their games. We were very impressed by their team. We learned some things and need to fix a few on both sides of the football before our game against Hawley next week."

The Cougars would score 22 points in the second half with their first score on a long 75-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Preston Gwin to Avery Okroi. The extra point was good making the score 35-7.

The fourth quarter saw Ada-Borup tack on two scores. The first was on pass from Gwin to Braden Thompson covering 30 yards with the PAT splitting the uprights. Their last touchdown came on a run of three yards from Ryan Hoven with the two-point conversion run finding pay dirt that made the score 35-22, which is how, the game would end.

Schiefert would lead the team with 74 yards rushing on five carries with Heng adding 72 yards on nine carries and one reception for five yards.

Tonsfeldt would tally 68 yards rushing on 11 carries while completing two of four passes for 10 yards. Hunter Anderson added 23 yards rushing on five carries with Wyatt Roller chipping in 15 yards on four carries and Zenzen netting one carry for nine yards and one reception for five.

The Trojans finished the game with 260 yards of total offense with 250 yards on the ground and 10 in the air.

Defensively, Barnesville was led by Joey Mark who tallied six total

tackles with four for loss adding in a fumble recovery and a sack with Zenzen having eight total tackles including two for loss and a sack.

Anderson tallied seven tackles with one for loss and an interception with Roller netting four tackles and two tackles on kicks. Jonny Robideau and Brady Kroll each tallied five tackles with Damian Camperud chipping in three to help the Trojans to a season opening victory.

Barnesville's record now stands at 1-0 on the season.

The Trojans would get another fantastic kickoff return from Cameron Heng that put the ball at the 46-yard line. The first play saw Hunter Anderson break off a long run into Nugget territory as he was finally brought down at the 29-yard line.

A few plays later, Aaron Schiefert rambled 24 yards to the one-yard line where Heng took in a sweep on the next play for the Trojans first score of the game. Quarterback Adam Tonsfeldt would score the two-point

conversion that gave Barnesville an 8-7 lead.

Hawley would put together a nice offensive drive before the Trojans defense stiffened and forced a field goal that was short, keeping the Nuggets off the scoreboard.

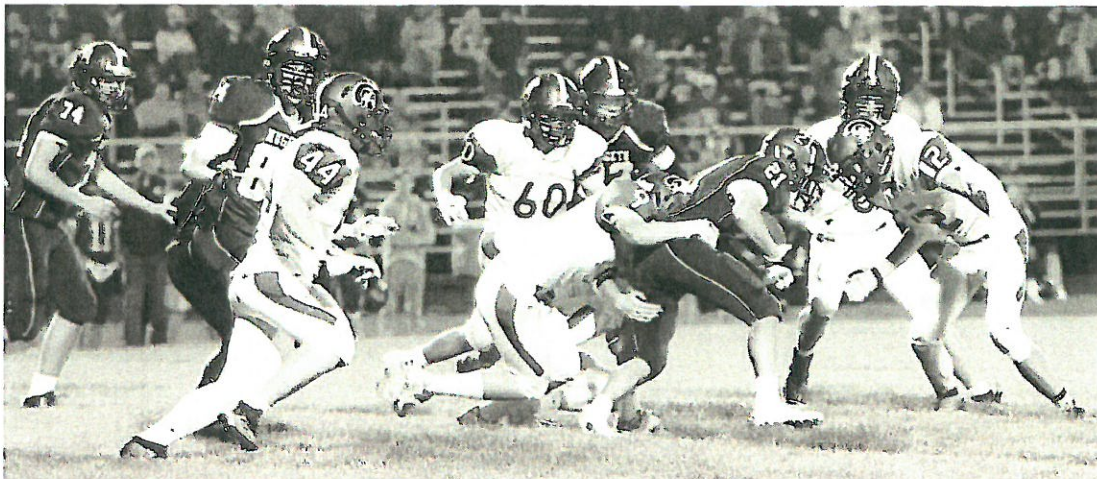

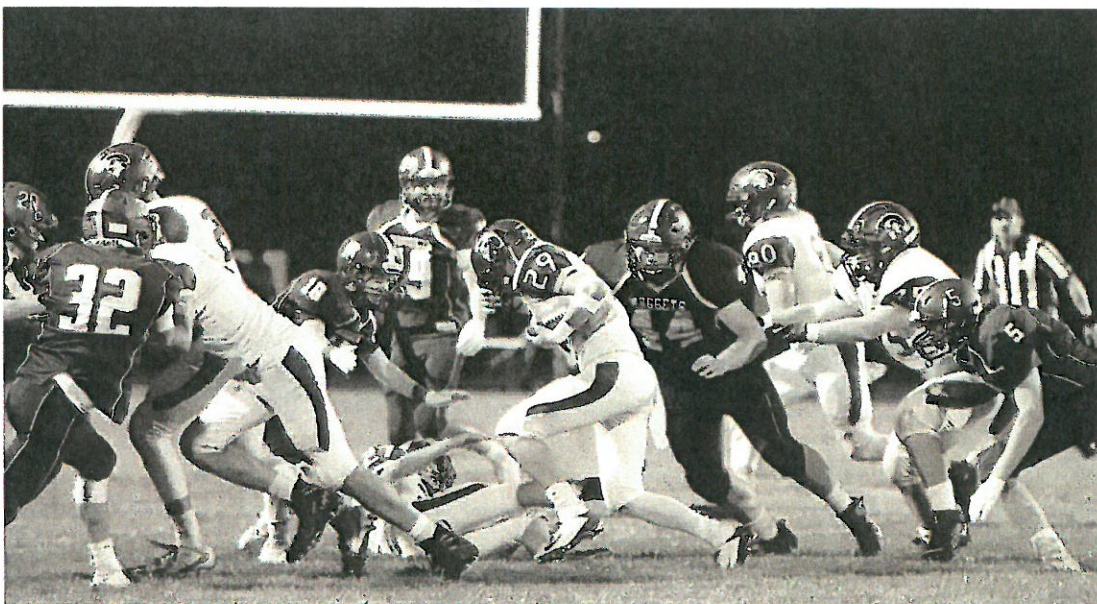

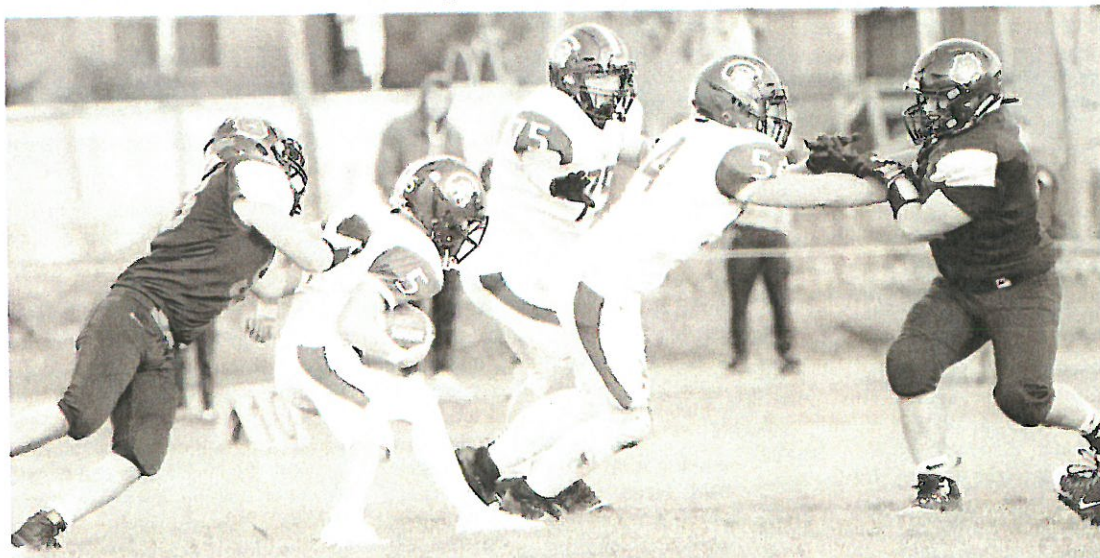

different score of the game with a nifty 60-yard punt return. The Rick PAT was good and the Trojans were cruising 35-0.

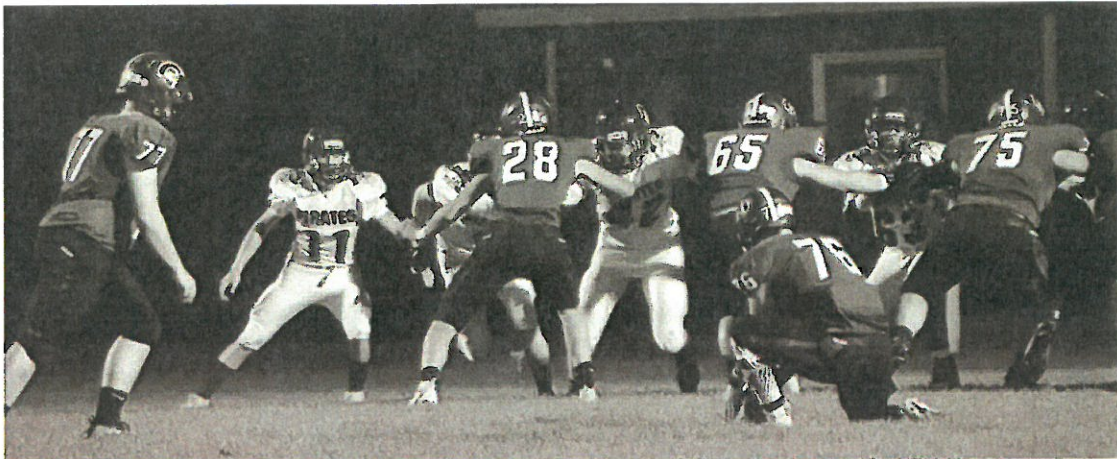
Tonsfeldt would add his fifth touchdown of the game with a 20 yard scoring run with Rick nailing the extra point to send both teams

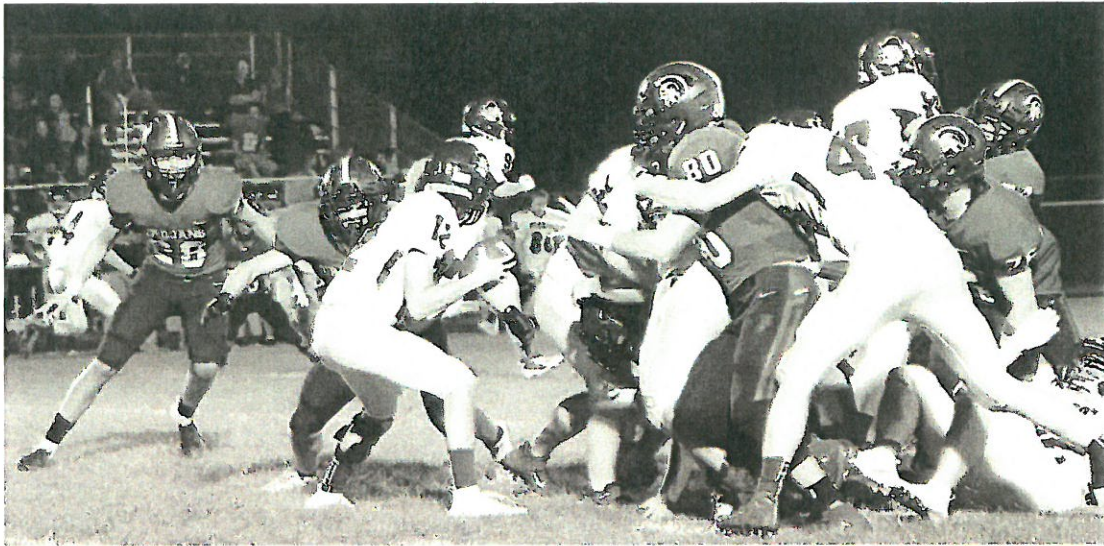

Barnesville, Minnesota, Trojans will come to Breckenridge ranked second in Class AA with a 4-0 record. Last year's state runner-ups, the Trojans are looking to avenge last year's upset loss to the Cowboys.

"It's a rivalry like no other. They don't like us and we're not all that fond of them. We enjoy beating them when we can," Breckenridge coach Chad Frederickson said.

If Breckenridge wants to make it back-to-back seasons with wins over Barnesville, they're going to have to beat the Trojans at their own game.

"Obviously we've got to play physical and match their physicality. That is very noticeable on film," Fredericksen said. "They get off the ball, get into people and they're a run-first, pass-never type of team. They'd prefer to run every dang play so if they get four yards, they're going to stay with the rush and not be overly concerned with the pass. We need to stop the run."

Barnesville's offense includes a wide variety of misdirection. Keeping track of where the ball is going is half the battle.

"That's where it's huge that we read our keys and don't get lost in the shuffle there. As long as we play discipline I don't think it's going to create that many issues for us," Fredericksen said. "We obviously still got to step up and make plays. Hopefully we're disciplined and locked in."

The big name on the scouting report is obviously Hunter Zenzen. The tight end/linebacker is committed to Iowa State and one of the best athletes in the area.

"They got their D1 prospect in that Zenzen kid and he's a pretty physical guy," Fredericksen said. "We've just got to be up to the challenge and match that same intensity."

Tossing it to Zenzen in the rare cases the Trojans throw the ball will be Adam Tonsfeldt. The junior signal-caller is deadly with his legs and is always a threat out of the backfield.

"Their quarterback is pretty talented," Fredericksen said. "He's kind of a playmaker. When they need a big play the ball is usually in his hands."

Breckenridge is only missing one starter due to injury. Bryant Hasse will be out of the lineup, but Jonah Paintner, who started at the beginning of the season, will step back into the guard spot.

"We're probably as healthy as we're going to get," Fredericksen said.

Coming off a big win over Ottertail Central, Minnesota, Breck's offense and defense were at their best. Fredericksen would be happy to see his team continue to shine on both sides of the ball, but he would also like to see the return units come up with some game-changing plays.

“Even though we were 5-5 on our extra points, our other special teams have to get better,” Fredericksen said. “Our punt return and our kick return, we’ve taken a lot of pride over the years in how well we do that and sometimes that’s the only spark we can get so we need to get to that point where those teams are stepping up and performing at a higher level.”

Kickoff is set for 7 p.m. Friday, Sept. 27.

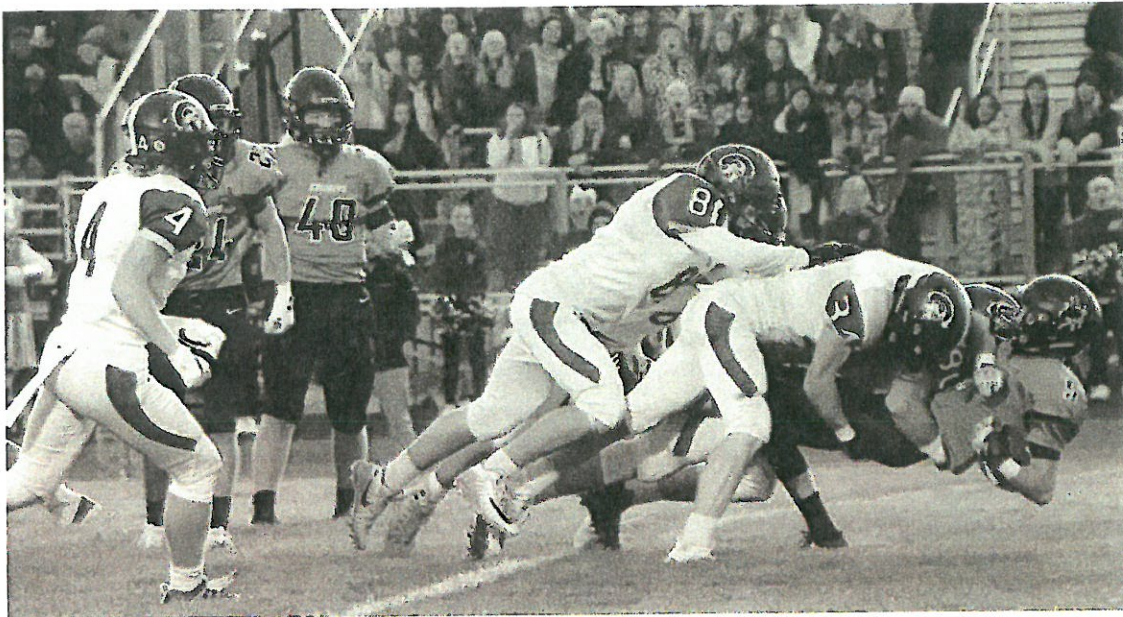

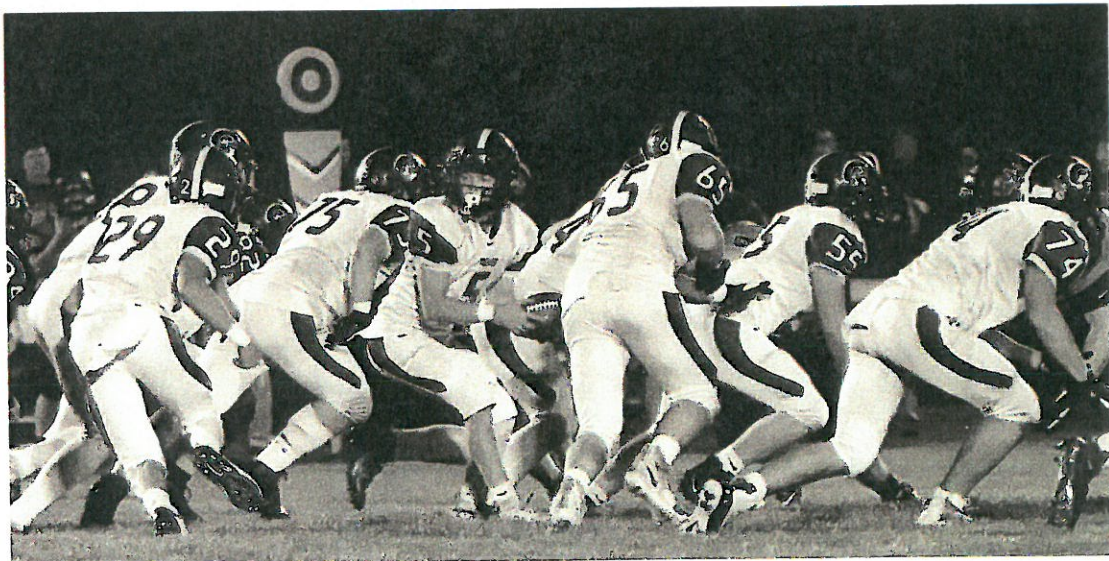

Barnesville, Minnesota, lived up to the hype when they came to Breckenridge on Friday, Sept. 27. The No. 2-ranked Trojans jumped out to a three-touchdown lead right away and never missed a beat on their way to a 62-16 victory over the Cowboys.

"They're very good. They talk the talk and they walk the walk," Breckenridge coach Chad Frederickson said. "My hats off to Barnesville. They took it to us all night long and we seemed to be playing back on our heels. That's a credit to them."

Coming into the game, Breck knew they had to contain quarterback Adam Tonsfeldt. The speedster put his elusiveness on display for a trio of rushing touchdowns while also throwing a pair of TD passes in the first half, giving his team a 41-0 lead heading into the locker room. Tonsfeldt ran for 171 yards on only seven carries.

"I tell you what, when the ball's not bouncing your way, it's not bouncing your way. Whatever happened with our kickoff on the return there, everything just kind of rolled the wrong way for Breck," Frederickson said. "We're not going to say woe is me, we just need to snap back next week and come in on Monday and do our best going forward."

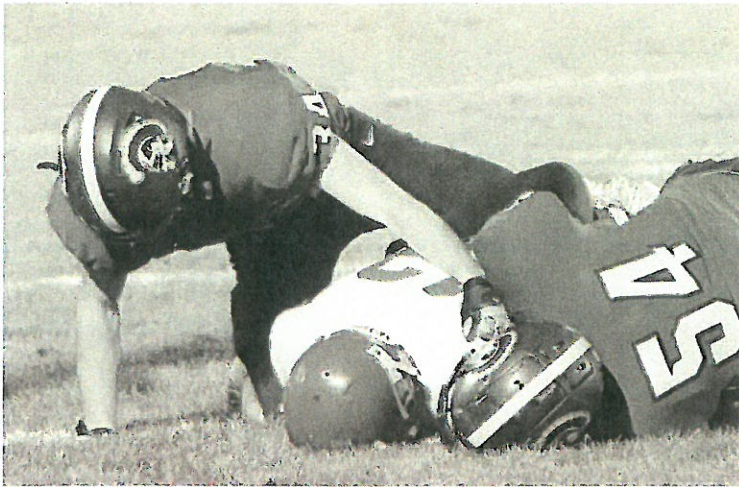

As a team, the Trojans tallied 238 total yards with 187 yards rushing and 51 yards passing.

Schiefert led Barnesville with 55 yards rushing on five carries and one score, with Cameron Heng netting 36 yards on five carries. Anderson tallied 29 yards rushing on three carries and one touchdown, adding another score on a kickoff return and one on a fumble recovery off a bad snap on a punt.

Braeden Bredman finished the game with 25 yards rushing on three carries including his first varsity

touchdown, with Tonsfeldt adding 23 yards on four carries, while completing three of five passes for 51 yards and a score. Zenzen finished the night with 2 receptions for 44 yards and one touchdown.

Defensively, the Trojans held Roseau to -7 total yards of offense with -27 yards coming on the ground and 20 yards through the air.

Zenzen and Anderson were beasts on the defensive side of the ball with Zenzen netting 10 total tackles with seven solo, three for loss, a sack and a tackle on a kick with Anderson adding seven tackles with five solo, two for loss, a sack and two tackles on kicks.

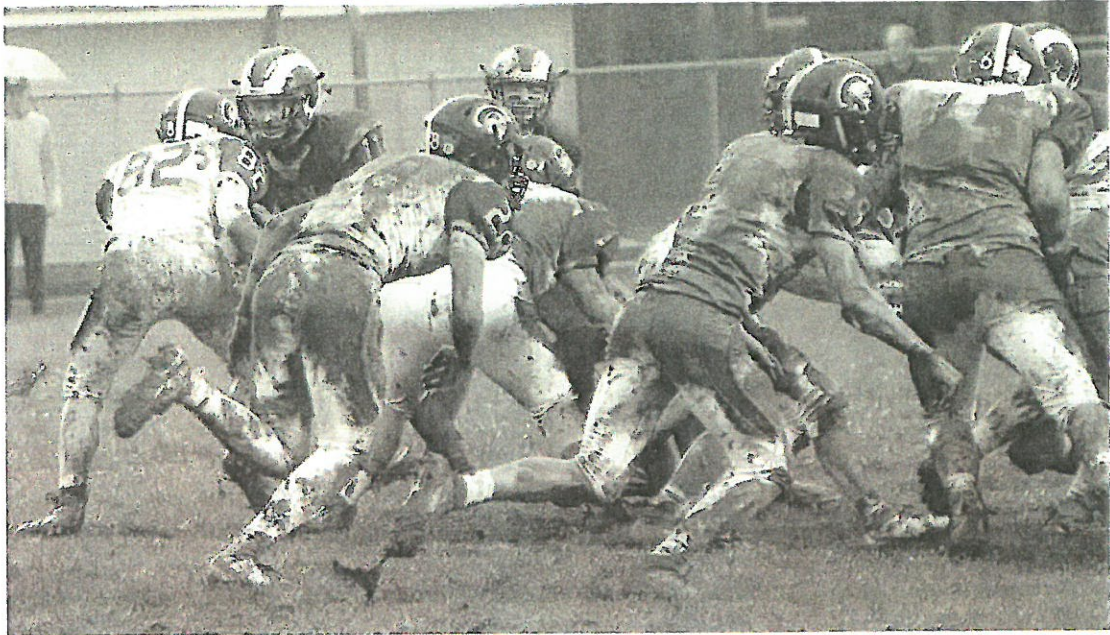

The undefeated Barnesville Trojans hosted a Staples-Motley team coming in with only one loss in a matchup of two very good football teams. The stingy Trojan defense would quickly force a three and out punt taking over the ball on the 42 yard line. Anderson tallied 94 yards rushing on seven carries with a touchdown, while adding one reception for 10 yards, with Schiefert netting 60 yards on eight carries and a score. Wahl would finish with 45 yards rushing on six carries and two scores with Cameron Heng adding 31 yards on six carries. Mark would net the other reception that covered 30 yards for the Trojans.

As a team, the Trojans finished with 432 yards of total offense with 392 yards coming on the ground and 40 yards through the air, while the defense held the Cardinals to 52 total yards for the game with 56 yards rushing and minus four yards passing.

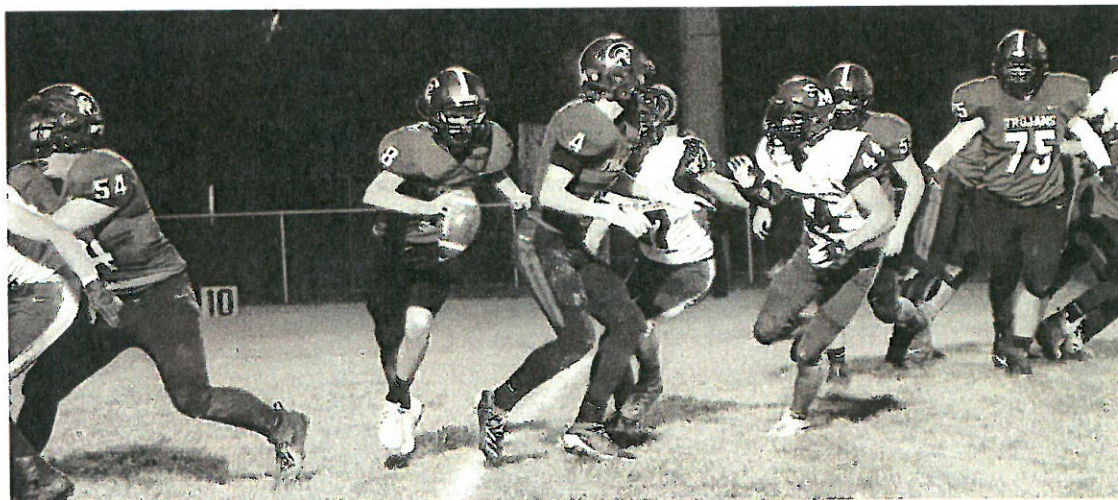

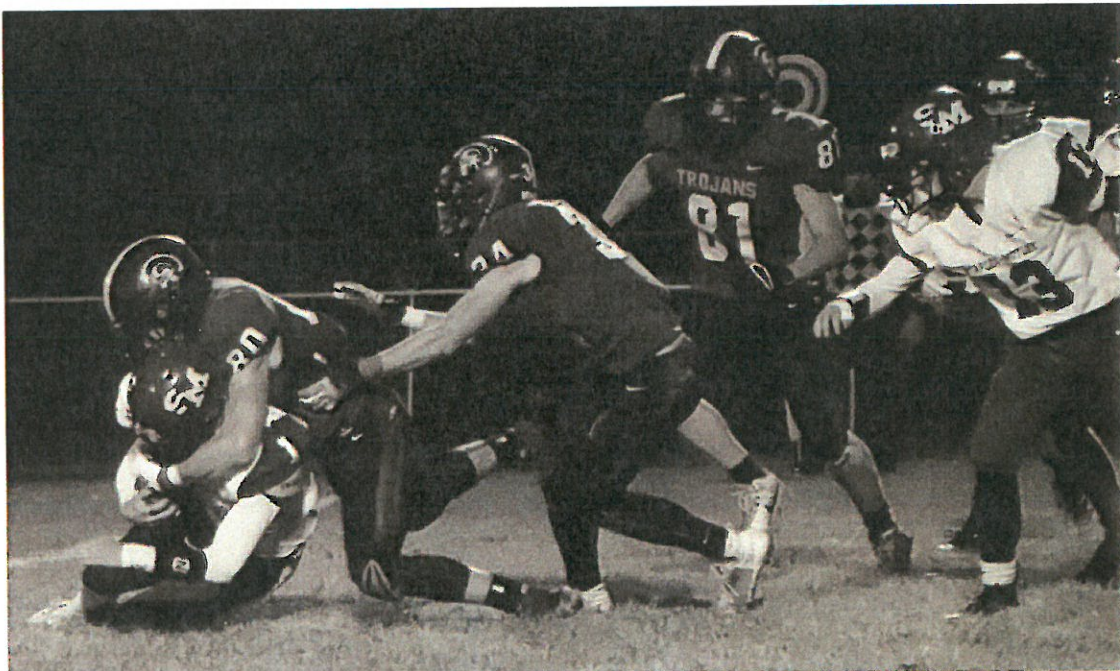

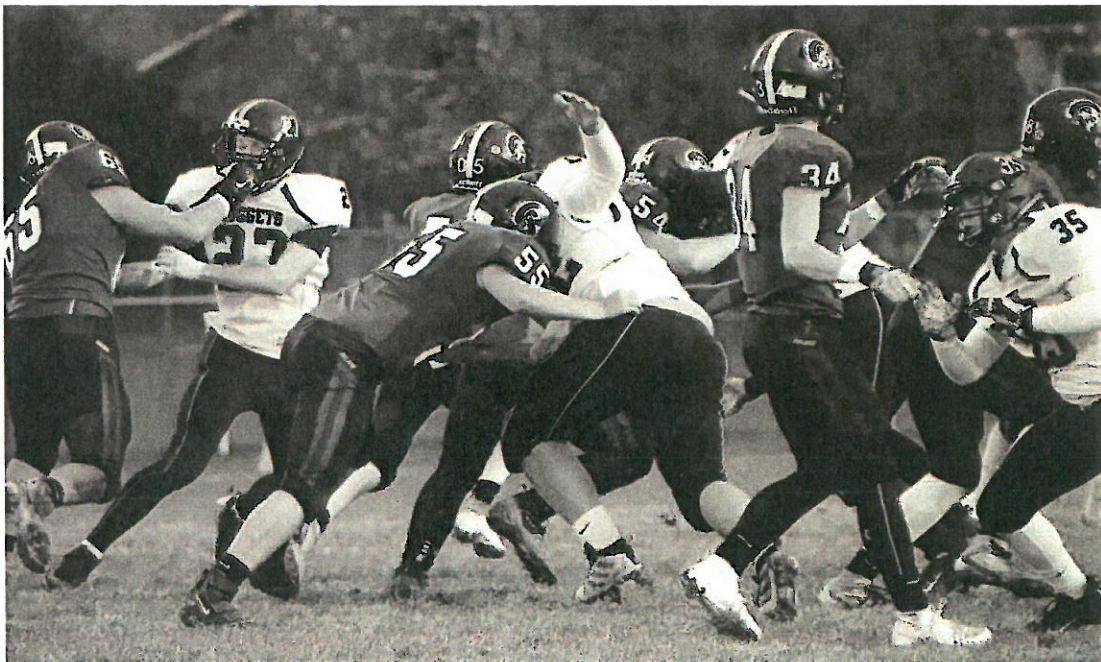

The next possession saw Warroad make a couple of miraculous throws to move deep into Trojan territory. Tonsfeldt once again ended the drive with another interception.

With the game switching to the second quarter, the Trojans put together a nice drive of mixing the run with the pass and ended it with another Anderson touchdown run from 33 yards out. Rick would connect on his second PAT for a 30-8 Barnesville lead.

With Warroad in desperation mode, they pulled out every long pass play in their books. But the last pass would be intercepted for the third time of the half by Tonsfeldt to put an end to the Warriors drive.

Barnesville would start on their six yard line and quickly flip field position before a turnover stopped the Trojans from another score. The defense would force a turnover on downs and Barnesville would quickly find the end zone on a dive play up the middle from fullback, Aaron Schiefert from 25 yards out. Rick would connect again with the PAT for a 37-8 Trojans lead.

Warroad would try some trickery with a fake punt that was stopped short of the line to gain, giving the Trojans the ball back. Two plays later, Tonsfeldt would race into the end zone from 34 yards out for the touchdown. Connor Morse would get his shot at the PAT and put it through the uprights that made the score 44-8.

The second half would start where the first half ended as the Trojans got the ball and quickly found the end zone with a Tonsfeldt 55 yard run. Rick's PAT would make the score 51-8 Barnesville.

Cameron Heng would get the next Trojans touchdown with a 31 yard run with Rick netting the PAT for a 58-8 lead, before Warroad put together a nice drive that ended with a score from Cole from 13 yards out to start the fourth quarter. Cole would add the two-point conversion

run making the score 58-16.

The Trojans would score their last touchdown of the game with a long scoring drive that culminated in a Max Olson four yard scoring plunge. Barnesville would kneel down the two-point conversion to make the score 64-18 which is how the game would end.

"Warroad hit us on the opening play for a big pass covering about 70 yards and scored a few plays later," said Head Coach Bryan Strand. "That was only the second time this season where someone scored on our team in the first half of a game. After that, we played great defense and ran and threw the ball well on offense. We shut down their run game and forced them to pass. We ended up with four interceptions in the game.

We were up 44-8 at the half, but I felt the team needed a stern talking to about doing their jobs and just playing the game. We were getting mixed up with too much extra curricular things on the field, making too many mistakes and not playing at the level I expected from them. I think the team got the message and understood where I was coming from.

The second half I did not see any more of the behaviors or dumb plays out of the starters. I felt the backups came in and played very well. They moved the ball and played good defense.

Our running backs averaged 13 yards per rush with the starters averaging 19, which is amazing. Adam Tonsfeldt played fantastic on both sides of the football as he threw for two touchdowns, ran for two and intercepted three passes.

We will need to shore some things up to get ready for a very good Pelican Rapids football team. They have a very potent offense led by McHale Korf and a great coach in Dave Haugen. We will have our hands full getting ready for them this week."

Barnesville managed to gain 605 yards of total offense with 435 yards on the ground and 170 yards through

the air.

Tonsfeldt tallied 102 yards rushing and two touchdowns with another 132 yards passing on three completions with two more scores, while Aaron Schiefert led the team with 126 yards rushing on six carries and a score.

Anderson added 53 yards on three carries and two scores, with Heng netting 47 yards on two carries and one score, while Wyatt Roller added 45 yards on five carries.

Wahl led the team with two receptions for 71 yards and two scores, with Noah Krause adding one catch for 38 yards and Hunter Zenzen netting one reception for 23 yards.

Defensively, the Trojans held the Warriors to 250 total yards with 166 yards passing and 84 yards rushing.

Brady Kroll led the Trojans with seven total tackles (4 solo, 3 assisted), two tackles for loss, a sack and three tackles on kicks, with Tonsfeldt netting three interceptions, three tipped passes and two solo tackles.

Zenzen tallied five tackles, two for loss and two tackles on kicks,

with Schiefert adding seven tackles (3s, 4a), one for loss and one tipped pass. Krause finished with three tackles (2s, 1a), an interception and a tackle on a kick, with Mark netting six tackles (1s, 5a) with one for loss and one on a kick, while Heng had four solo tackles. Jonny Robideau and Tate Shellito combined for a half a sack each to round out the defensive statistical scoring leaders.

The Trojans will play for their fourth straight Section 8AA title as they square off against Pelican Rapids on Friday, November 1 at the Fargo Dome with game time slated for 8:00 p.m.

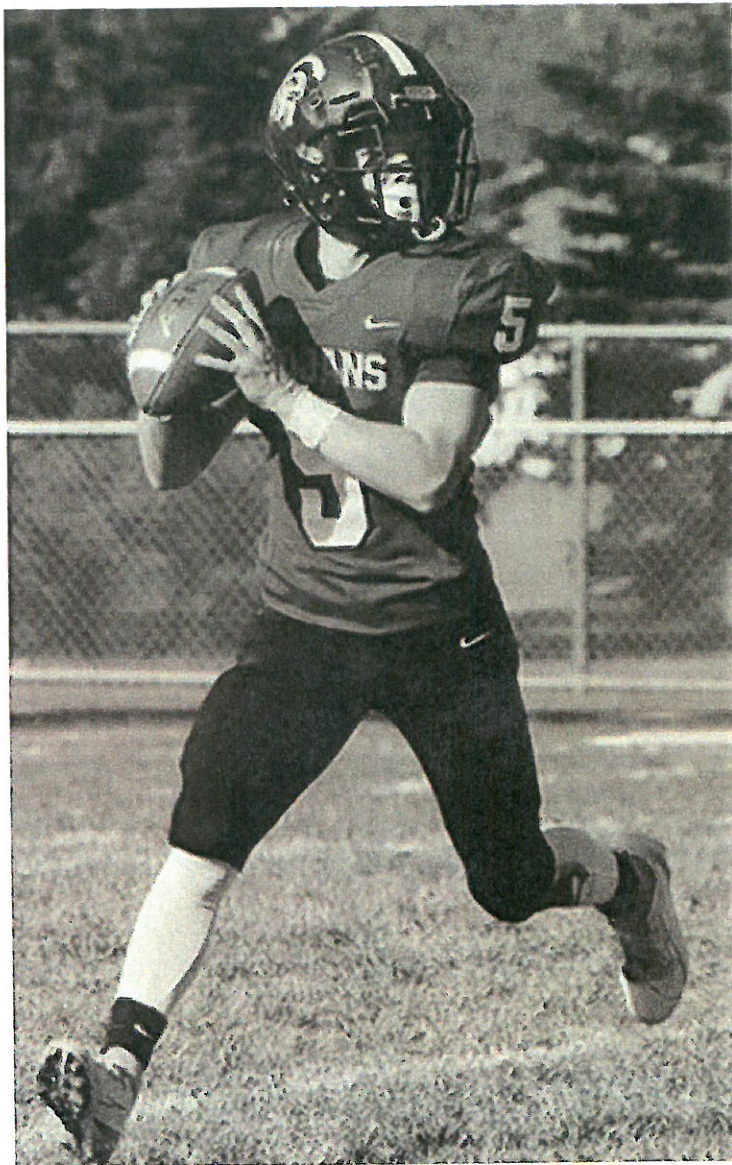

Trojans Steamroll Vikings: Win Fourth Straight Section Championship

The Barnesville Trojans were not going to be denied their fourth straight Section 8AA championship as they jumped out to an early lead scoring 30 first quarter points in cruising to a 65-14 victory over Pelican Rapids.

Barnesville would start with the ball and use an eight-play drive that ended with a two-yard touchdown run from quarterback, Adam Tonsfeldt. Tonsfeldt would also run in the two-point conversion for an 8-0 lead.

The Trojan defense would force a quick three and out series on their first opportunity, forcing a punt. The snap would sail over the punters head and go out of the back of the end zone for a safety and a 10-0 lead.

The punt on the kickoff allowed for a very nice return by Jack Wahl setting up a short field for Barnesville. It would take one play as Tonsfeldt rolled right to pass, did not find anything to his liking and took off running. He zigged and zagged, weaving through the entire Viking defense as he rolled to a 44-yard touchdown. The conversion pass was stopped short making the score 16-0 Barnesville.

Tonsfeldt would stop the next Pelican Rapids offensive series with an interception. A few plays later, running back Aaron Schiefert took a pitch to the right and raced to the end zone for a 49-yard touchdown. The extra point was not good putting the score at 22-0 still in the first quarter.

The Trojans defense would force a fumble on the next series with Cameron Heng picking up the loose ball deep in Vikings territory. A few plays later, Heng would waltz into the end zone from seven yards out for the Trojans fourth touchdown of the first quarter. Tonsfeldt would net the conversion run that made the score 30-0 with the quarter finally

coming to an end a few minutes later.

Pelican Rapids would put together a nice drive to start the second quarter, getting the ball to the six-yard line of the Trojans. But the defense would force a fourth down incomplete pass to take over on downs.

It would only take two plays to cover the 89 yards needed as Tonsfeldt threw a bomb to a wide-open Kaden Zenzen that went for 44 yards. The next play saw Tonsfeldt find Hunter Zenzen from 45 yards out for the touchdown. The PAT was blocked making the score 36-0 Barnesville.

The Trojans Hunter Anderson would make a fantastic defensive play to get Barnesville into position to score another touchdown as he went to tackle the Vikings running back and stripped the ball away, running it down to the two yard line. After a pair of penalties, Jack Wahl would get the call and march into the end zone from the one-yard line. The extra point was missed putting the score at 43-0.

The defense would produce another three and out and the Vikings punting game would once again derail them as the snap went sailing over the punter's head and out of the back of the end zone for another safety.

Anderson would return the ensuing kickoff to the 19-yard line and would take the handoff on the next play into the end zone. Connor Morse would make the extra point that made the score 51-0 Barnesville, which is how the half would end.

The Trojans first possession of the second half saw backup quarterback, Noah Krause take a keeper off right tackle and race 84 yards untouched for the touchdown. The extra point snap was low forcing a pass that was intercepted, negating the score with the Trojans now leading 57-0.

Pelican Rapids would put together a nice drive to get on the scoreboard as McHale Korf scored on a four yard run with the Barnesville defense denying the two-point conversion making the score 57-6.

The Vikings would add a second touchdown with a three yard scoring plunge from Jonny Ziebell and the conversion run from Carter Johnson that made the score 57-14.

The Trojans would get their last score of the game on a 38-yard touchdown run from Joaquin Nelson. Max Olson would connect with Blake Torfin on the two-point conversion that put the final score at 65-14.

"What a first half of football," stated Head Coach Bryan Strand. "The kids played outstanding and with so much intensity. I can't say enough positives about them. Both sides of the ball, as well as the kicking and return games were on par. Our offensive line was outstanding allowing our running backs to gain huge yards. We hit our second goal and still have another one in our sights. We need to stay healthy and continue to improve.

"Congratulations to Coach Haugen and Pelican Rapids on a great season. They are full of underclassmen and will be back next season. However, up next for us is Osakis, another excellent team that is well coached. They have the best rushing attack I have seen this year. Going to be a tough week to prepare for what they want to do. I feel the kids will get it and will be ready for battle next weekend in Moorhead," Strand concluded.

The Trojans finished with 462 total yards of offense with 373 coming on the ground and 89 yards through the air against Pelican.

Tonsfeldt led the Trojans with 96 yards on five carries and two scores, while completing two of

three passes for 89 yards and one touchdown. Krause tallied one carry for 84 yards and a touchdown, with Schiefert adding 62 yards on three carries and a score. Nelson had one carry for 38 yards and a touchdown with Anderson netting 34 yards on three carries and a score. Olson finished with one carry for 19 yards with Wahl netting four carries for 18 yards and a touchdown. H. Zenzen finished with one reception for 45 yards and a score with K. Zenzen adding the other reception for 44 yards.

Defensively, the Trojans held the Vikings to 262 yards of total offense with 215 on the ground and 47 yards passing. Brady Kroll was a beast on the defensive line as he finished with four solo and five assisted tackles with two for loss, two sacks and a caused fumble, with H. Zenzen adding two solo and 11 assisted tackles, two tackles for loss and three tackles on kicks.

Anderson tallied two solo and four assisted tackles with a fumble caused and a fumble recovered while adding two tackles on kicks, with Tanner Kadrmas adding three solo and six assisted tackles with one for loss and one tackle on a kick.

K. Zenzen finished with four tackles (2 solo, 2 assisted) and a tackle on a kick with Joey Mark adding three assisted tackles, a fumble caused and a tackle on a kick, while Torfin chipped in five tackles (1s, 4a) and a tackle on a kick to lead the Trojans defense.

Barnesville's record now stands at 11-0 on the season. The Trojans will take on the Section 6AA champions Osakis on Saturday, November 9 at 12:00 p.m. at Moorhead High School in the quarterfinals of the State High School Football Playoffs.

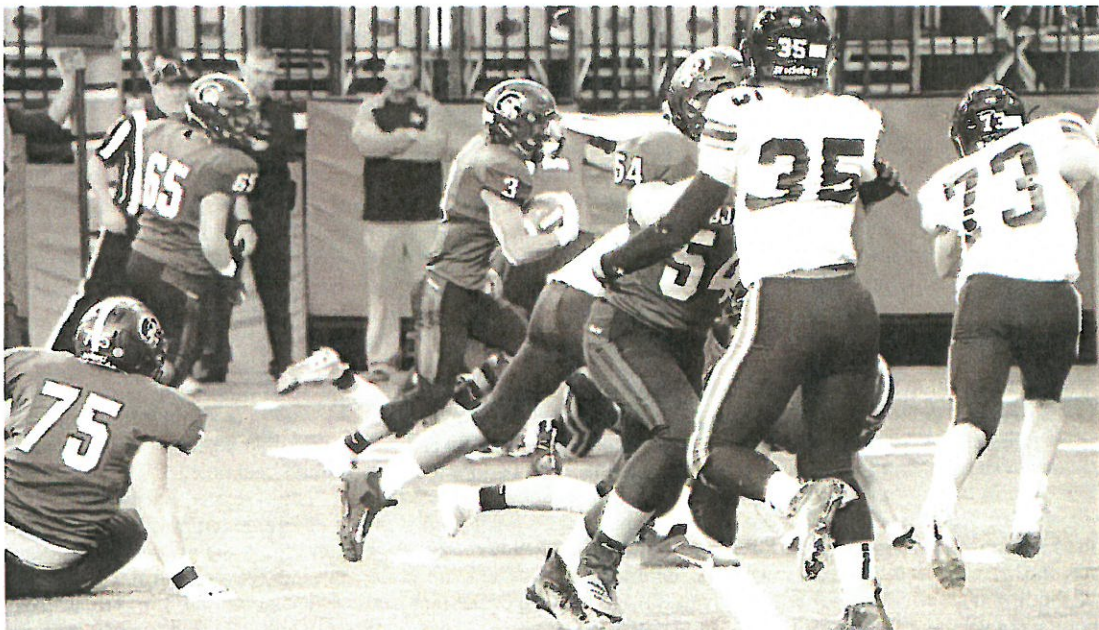

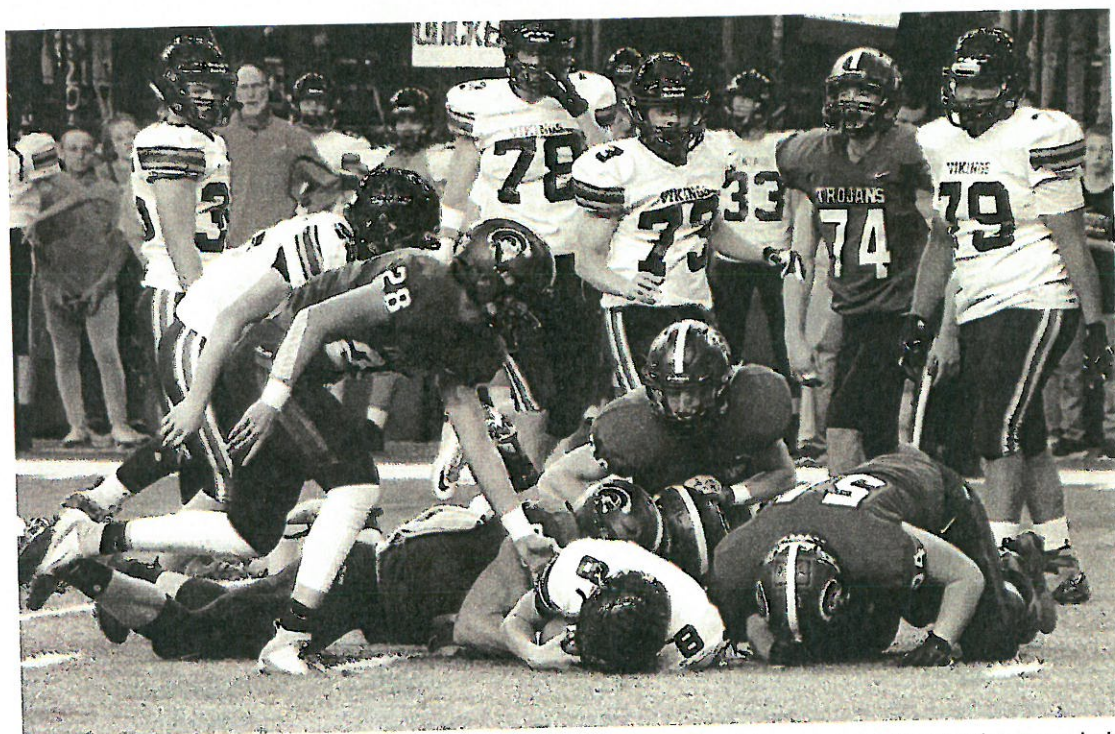

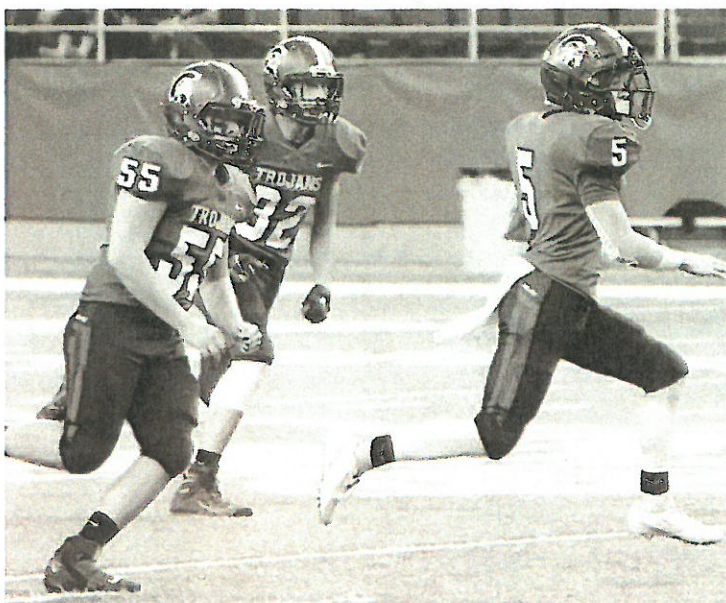
Jackson Wahl runs down the field while his teammates make the holes for him to get through.

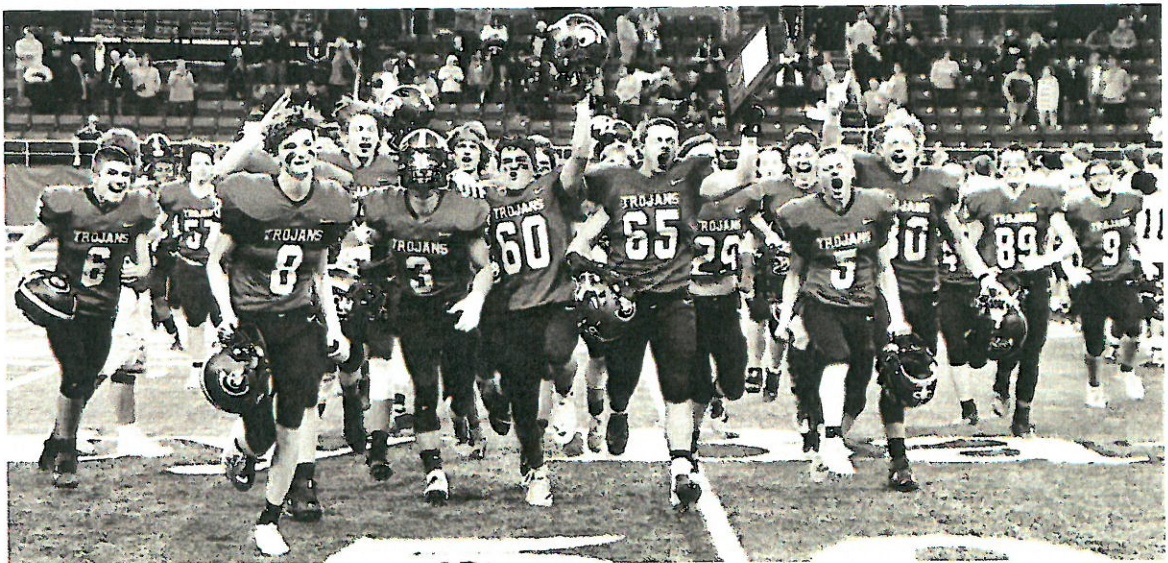

Tonsfeldt Runs For 218 Yards Sending Trojans To The Bank

The Barnesville Trojans behind the stellar play of quarterback Adam Tonsfeldt, and the blocking of the entire offensive line, bullied their way to another quarterfinal victory in the State Minnesota football playoffs with a 28-6 win over Osakis at Moorhead High School.

Barnesville started out on defense and made the first big play of the game when the Silver Streaks fumbled a fourth down play at their 40 yard line with Joey Mark recovering the football.

The Trojans would take a six play drive the needed distance with Tonsfeldt scoring from three yards out for a 6-0 lead as the two-point conversion was stopped short.

Osakis next possession saw a 62 yard touchdown run taken off the board with a holding call backing the Silver Streaks up deep into their own territory. Another miscue saw the punter drop the snap, before picking up the ball and trying to run for the first down. He was stopped short as Barnesville took over on a short field at the 27 yard line.

A few plays later, Tonsfeldt would bull doze his way into the end zone from eight yards out for Barnesville's second score of the game. Cameron Heng would convert the two-point conversion that made the score 14-0 Barnesville.

The Trojan defense would come up with another big play as Jack Wahl intercepted an Osakis pass on the 43 yard line of Barnesville as the Trojans continued to show the Silver Streaks that moving the ball and scoring was not going to be easy on this day.

The Trojans started the second quarter with a nice drive as the Silver Streaks allowed yards but not big play strikes. Barnesville had the ball at the seven yard line and ran Tonsfeldt up the middle, but an Osakis player managed to strip the ball loose at the four to prevent

another score.

However, the Trojan defense would not allow any movement and forced another punt that was downed at the 44 yard line of Osakis. This drive saw the Trojans mix the run with the pass as they moved the ball down the field. With the ball on the eight yard line, Barnesville would dial up a Tonsfeldt pass to Hunter Zenzen that saw him barrel his way into the end zone for the Trojans third score of the game. The two-point conversion was stopped making the score 20-0.

The Silver Streaks would have one last gasp at producing points after a long run put them on the Trojans 23 yard line. But the next play saw a fumble that was recovered by Hunter Anderson stopping the drive and keeping them off the scoreboard.

Tonsfeldt would once again lead the Trojans down the field with his legs as another score looked eminent with time winding down. Barnesville would get to the 14 yard line before Osakis stepped in front of a pass intended for Zenzen for the interception. The return was close to going the distance, but center Eric Ackerson chased down the Silver Streaks player to get the Trojans defense back on the field. Osakis could not put anything together as the halftime horn sounded with Barnesville up 20-0.

The third quarter saw Osakis stop the Trojans short of the goal line to prevent another score to open the second half. The first offensive play saw the Silver Streaks break off a big run, but the Trojan defense would stiffen after that and force a turnover on downs as the quarter came to a close.

Barnesville would convert their fourth score of the game off this drive with another Tonsfeldt run covering four yards. Heng would net his second two-point conversion of the game that made the score 28-0.

Osakis would start with the ball

on their 39 yard line and put together a 61 yard scoring drive that saw the Silver Streaks net a huge run of 31 yards, before fullback Isaac Hetland rumbled through the defense to cover the 25 yards for their first score of the game. The two-point conversion was stopped short that made the score 28-6.

The Trojan offense would take the ball over after an invalid onside kick and once again seemed to be poised to score another touchdown, but a fumble stopped the drive short. The Silver Streaks would hold onto the ball as the clock hit zero with Barnesville winning the game and moving on to US Bank Stadium and the State Semi-Finals.

Tonsfeldt finished the game with 218 yards rushing and three touchdowns on 23 carries, while completing two of three passes for 17 yards and another score, with Hunter Zenzen netting his only catch for an eight yard score, while adding 30 yards rushing on two carries. Aaron Schiefert tallied 32 yards rushing on six carries, with Wahl adding 20 yards on seven carries. Anderson finished with 17 yards rushing on four carries, with Heng netting 14 yards on two carries, while Kaden Zenzen tallied one reception for nine yards.

As a team, the Trojans finished with 348 total yards of offense with 331 on the ground and 17 through the air, while the defense limited Osakis to 218 total yards all on the ground.

H. Zenzen finished the game with six total tackles (4 solo, 2 assist) with four for loss and two tackles on kicks, with Brady Kroll netting 10 tackles (4s, 6a) one for loss and one tackle on a kick. Schiefert finished with seven tackles (2s, 5a) with one for loss and two on kicks, with Connor Morse adding five tackles (3s, 2a) a fumble caused and a tackle on a kick, while Damian Camperud totaled five tackles (4s, 1a) with one

for loss.

Joey Mark added five tackles (3s, 2a) and a fumble recovery, with Ackerson netting six tackles (3s, 3a) and Anderson chipping in four tackles (1s, 3a) one for loss and a fumble recovery, while Wahl tallied an interception.

"Elements were tough for both teams with the cold weather and snow falling, but we handled it well enough to net the victory," said Head Coach Bryan Strand. "Adam Tonsfeldt was huge for us offensively and the offensive line was fantastic. Eric Ackerson, Connor Morse, Brady Kroll, Matt Samuelson, Jonny Robideau and the Zenzen brothers were outstanding against a very physical Osakis front seven. They took away a lot of our runs we normally hit, but Tonsfeldt was key in keeping drives alive and getting us into the end zone. He finished with over 200 yards rushing and three scores. He played outstanding all day long.

I thought we played pretty well defensively and kept them out of the end zone for most of the game. But, we did miss a few tackles and had too many turnovers that we normally do not commit. We will need to get that fixed before we play Caledonia next week at US Bank Stadium.

They are an excellent team and have the longest winning streak in the nation. It will be a tough test, but one that our kids want. We have nothing to lose. They have won the last four state championships. We played them really tough in last year's state championship, but this is a new year and a new team. We will need to have a great week of practice and get the kids ready to play."

The Trojans record now stands at 12-0 on the season.

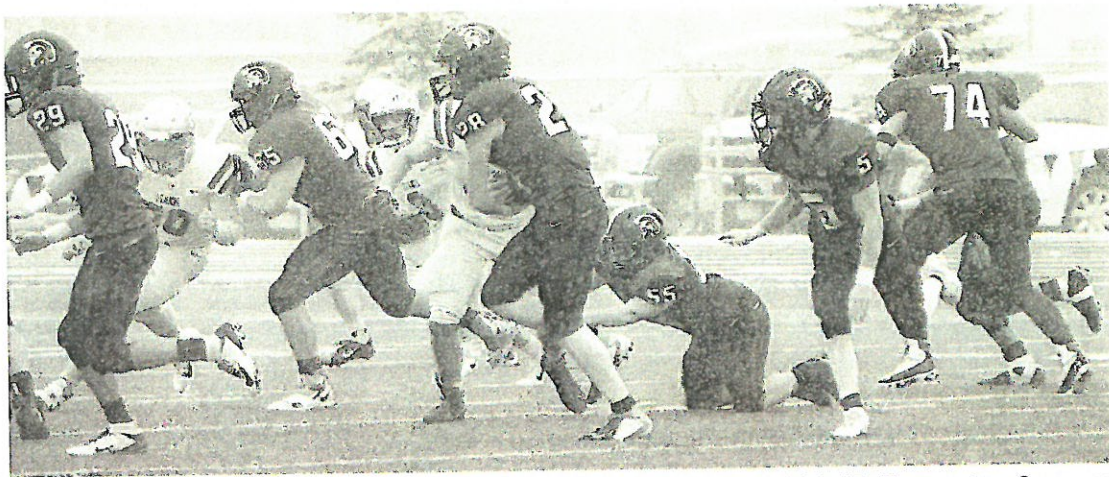

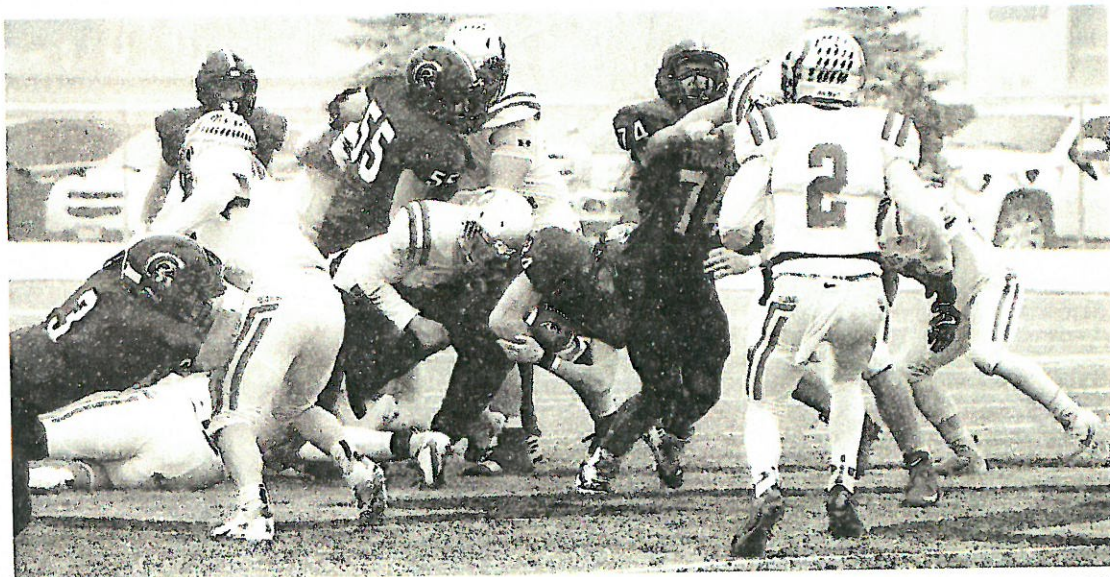

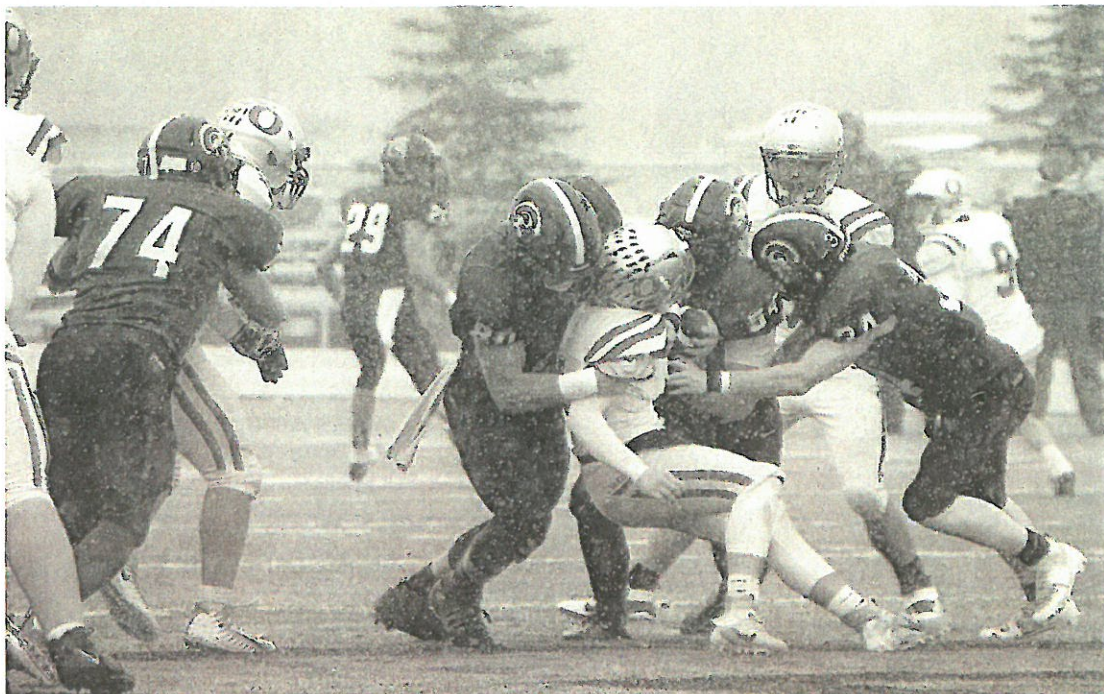

The Osakis football team was making its first appearance in the state tournament since 2005 on Saturday in Moorhead, and the Silverstreaks ran into a program that has been a fixture there recently.

Barnesville finished as the Class AA runner-up in 2018, and the Trojans came into this year's state quarterfinals 11-0 and beating teams by almost 40 points per game. They had to work a little harder against Osakis in the snow, but Barnesville won 28-6 to advance to the semifinals at U.S. Bank Stadium.

"We knew they're a great team," Osakis senior Luke Imdieke said. "We knew they were going to be physical. They were there last year, and we knew they were hungry to get back to where they were, so they came out and played hard."

If the Silverstreaks were going to beat the Trojans, they needed a better start. Osakis had a fumble on a fourth-and-one play, a fumbled snap on a punt, an interception and an Imdieke 62-yard touchdown run called back after a holding penalty all in the first quarter.

"I think that's ultimately what it comes down to for us was a poor start," Osakis head coach Bill Infanger said. "Barnesville is a great team, and our bad start, you got to give a lot of credit to them for that. They were physical right away and maybe forced us into a couple of those errors. If you're going to beat a good team like that, you have to play clean."

The Trojans are led by junior quarterback Adam Tonsfeldt, who is listed at 5-feet, 7-inches and 140 pounds. Tonsfeldt uses his speed and elusiveness in the run game as his touchdown runs of 3 and 8 yards in the first quarter gave Barnesville a 14-0 lead early. He then found tight end Hunter Zenzen for an 8-yard passing touchdown in the second quarter to make it 20-0 at the break.

"He has great fakes and it's hard to know where the ball is," Osakis senior Mason Moore said of Tonsfeldt. "You have to respect all their other backs because they're great too. When he gets in the open field, he's shifty and hard to take down."

Osakis' defense gave the Silverstreaks a chance. Barnesville averages 48 points per game, but had a tougher time finding the end zone against Osakis. The Silverstreaks held the Trojans to a season low in points and created three turnovers on two fumbles and an Imdieke interception.

It was still a three-score game after a scoreless third quarter before Barnesville scored early in the fourth on Tonsfeldt's third rushing touchdown. This one was a designed pass, and Osakis had it covered. The rush got to Tonsfeldt before he scrambled his way up the middle and into the end zone.

"We did a great job in everything we wanted to do with the exception of tackling Tonsfeldt," Infanger said. "He had a great game...you got to give him credit for being a hell of a running quarterback. The things he did with his feet today, some of them were just flat out impressive. There were a couple times when I was a little bit in awe of the plays that he made. You just shake your head and try to make the next play."

The Silverstreaks' only touchdown came on a run from junior Isaac Hetland. Imdieke set things up with a long run into Barnesville territory, and Hetland did the rest as he broke free a play later for a 25-yard touchdown run.

It wasn't the ending the Silverstreaks wanted, but this group put itself into program history by becoming the seventh Osakis football team to make state and the first to do so in more than a decade.

"This whole week has been amazing, just seeing the support from all of our teachers and everybody in this community has been unreal," Moore said. "To get back here and make a difference and show the younger kids how it's done is amazing. We've been dreaming about this for a long time."

Infanger was thankful for the seniors on this team that led the way to an 8-3 record.

"I'm just so grateful to have gotten to coach these seniors," Infanger said. "They're a great group of kids, and such great competitors. For them to lose in that section championship game last year to Pillager and knowing Pillager had everyone back from that team, to work as hard as they did and create the culture for us on how hard we need to work in the offseason, I'm so thankful for that group of guys that I got to coach."

The hope for the Silverstreaks is that this season is the start of more frequent trips to this tournament in the near future.

"Hopefully our younger guys will learn to set high goals for themselves and put in all that effort that's necessary to achieve that goal," Infanger said.

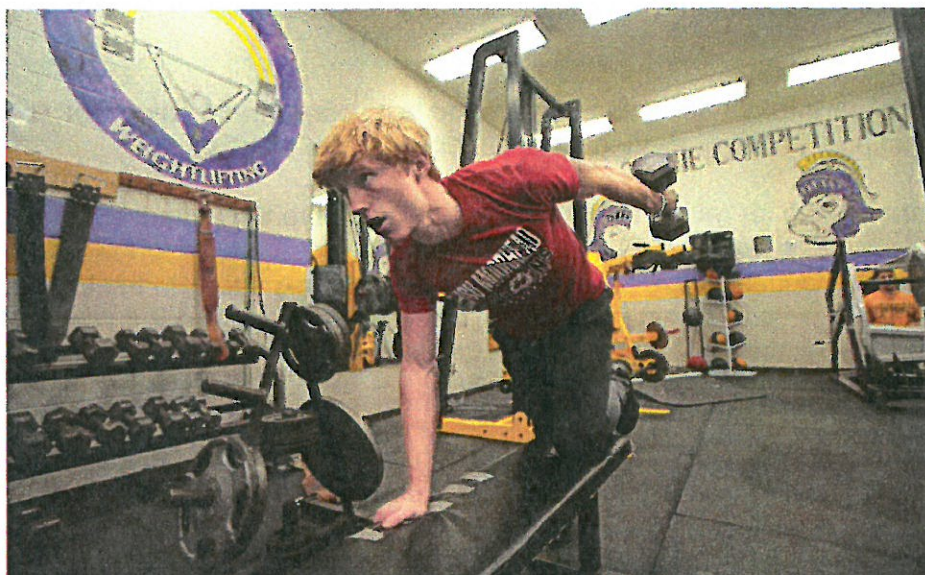

Barnesville football team's dedication in the weight room has it ready for rematch with Class 2A powerhouse Caledonia

Strategy and X's and O's are certainly great and important, but Barnesville football coach Bryan Strand knows that when it really comes down to it, the bigger, faster, stronger team is going to win most football games. So he makes training in the weight room a major priority for his program.

The Trojans train year round and lift four days a week in-season, including on game days. The coach says they get close to 50 athletes between grades 7 and 12 in the weight room every morning, and he is in there with them every day running the show.

"I figure if I'm asking them to be there and I want them to lift, then I better be in there too," he said.

That dedication to building big, strong athletes has paid off in a big way for Barnesville. They are 110-19 since 2009 with six state tournament appearances and two state championship game appearances. The most recent title game appearance was last season — a 21-0 loss to Caledonia, which Barnesville will face again at 11:30 a.m. Friday at U.S. Bank Stadium in the Minnesota Class 2A state semifinals.

"Football isn't so much finesse — you've got to be tougher than the guy across from you," Strand said. "And what I think it does for confidence, they know they're stronger than the team we're going up against. Caledonia is one that is at the same level that we are."

The Trojans win most games by blowing their opponents off the ball in the trenches and creating gigantic holes for their runners. Barnesville's leading rusher is junior quarterback Adam Tonsfeldt, who has 1,428 yards and 24 touchdowns while averaging 12.6 yards per carry.

But on Friday, the Trojans meet Caledonia, one of the few teams in Class 2A that can match or even surpass them physically.

"We surprised them with our ability to hang around last year," Strand said. "But we're not going to surprise them again. We're going to have to come up with some things."

The Trojans are looking for revenge. But they're going to have their hands full.

Caledonia owns the longest active high school football winning streak in the United States with 66 consecutive wins, with their last loss coming on Nov. 15, 2014. The Warriors have won nine state championships since 2007, including the last four in a row. And during their winning streak, they've won every game but one by double digits.

Last year's state title game was one of the closest games the Warriors have played, with the Trojans trailing by just 7 until late in the fourth quarter.

"We're coming back for a rematch," Brady Kroll said. "We all want to beat these guys. We've already all played them. They ended our season last year. So we want to take this chance to end their streak."

When asked if the Trojans have a philosophy in the weight room, Iowa State defensive end commit Hunter Zenzen replied, "Beat Caledonia." They have been waiting all year for another shot at the Warriors. And they've been training hard all year so that when they meet them again, they'll have the best possible chance to come out on top and topple the Goliath that is Caledonia football.

"Everybody's bigger, faster, stronger," Zenzen said. "The backfield is bigger this year. That is something we've gotten better at for sure."

They have improved physically with long-term dedication to the weight room. Strand likes to get his athletes started lifting in middle school to create good habits. He starts by teaching them the fundamentals of lifting and getting them to buy in. He worries about getting them to lift heavier weights as their bodies mature.

That buy-in attitude builds strong athletes over time. When Zenzen tested his max bench press for the first time as a seventh-grader, he could lift 155 pounds. Now his max bench press is 295 pounds and he owns the Barnesville weight room record for the clean with 295 pounds. And senior running back Hunter Anderson can bench press 255 pounds, while weighing 145.

"I've seen kids who have been average football players in ninth grade turn out to be pretty good by the time they are seniors because they're strong," Strand said.

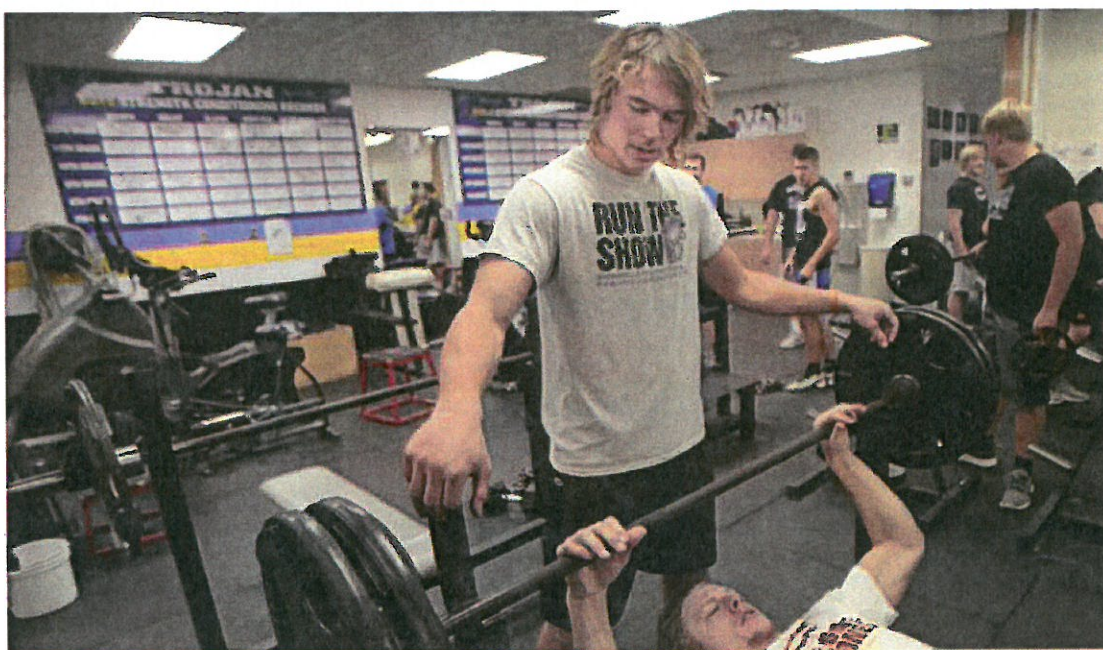
Zenzen and the other leaders on the team take it upon themselves to help teach the younger kids in the weight room and make sure they are doing everything correctly, the coach says. If

Zenzen spots somebody doing something incorrectly, he'll pause his workout to go help them and work with them.

"The kids look at him like he is amazing," Strand said of Zenzen, who has committed to play football at Iowa State. "Because he is. He's a great athlete. But he's so kind to everybody. He's the homecoming king and everything and there's a reason. His work ethic is second to none."

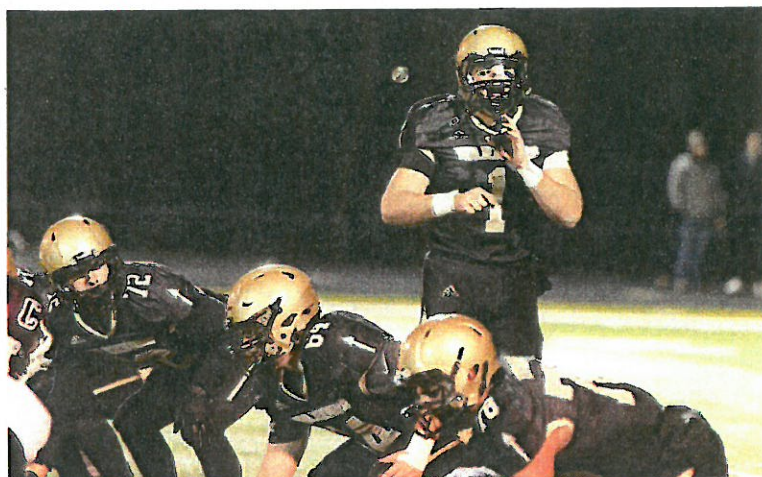
That kind of dedication is something Strand requires and expects of the captains on his football team.

"If you can't get your leaders in there, you can't get everybody else in there," he said. "I've got a rule that says if you haven't spent three years in the weight room, you can't be a captain. You can't even be on the ballot. And your chances of being all conference or all district are slim to none, unless you're absolutely amazing. If it's a competition and I've got two guys that are equal, the guy who worked his butt off is going to get the award."

Barnesville takes on a Caledonia football team that has won 66 straight games

CALEDONIA, Minn. — Caledonia, owner of a nation-leading 66 straight football wins, has not been seriously tested this season.

The 12-0 and No. 1-ranked Warriors now find themselves in the Class 2A state semifinals and with hopes of advancing a step closer to their fifth straight state championship.

Here is what Caledonia has accomplished in the last 12 years: nine Class 2A state championships, an overall record of 178 wins and 6 losses which is a 97% winning percentage and outscoring opponents 42-7 on average.

But here comes Barnesville. And if Caledonia is ever going to be tested this season, this figures to be the time and the team.

Even Barnesville head coach Bryan Strand admits to his team's comfort in facing the 12-0 Warriors. The Trojans are also 12-0 and ranked just one slot below Caledonia, at No. 2 in Class 2A.

"The good thing about our kids is they're not intimidated by Caledonia," said Strand, son of former longtime Southland football coach Dick Strand.

Some of that comfort comes from their familiarity with the Warriors and that they have hung with them the last two times they've met (at least for a half in 2016).

That especially includes a year ago when they clashed in the Prep Bowl final, Barnesville playing neck and neck with Caledonia until late in the fourth quarter. The Trojans trailed just 7-0 with 4½ minutes left in regulation before Caledonia got a couple of late touchdowns to win 21-0.

"We played them tough," Strand said. "We're hoping to do the same thing Friday."

That's when the teams meet again at state, this time at 11:30 a.m. in the semifinals at U.S Bank Stadium in Minneapolis.

On paper, this is the ultimate showdown.

Caledonia head coach Carl Fruechte understands why Barnesville is brimming with confidence.

"Really, I think they should be the favorite because they brought almost everyone back (from last year's state runner-up team)," Fruechte said. "We lost a lot of guys from last year (to graduation)."

Two guys Caledonia didn't lose are the King brothers, senior quarterback/defensive back Noah and sophomore wide receiver/defensive back Eli.

Noah threw for 339 yards in last week's 56-14 quarterfinal rout of Pipestone Area and Eli had 90 yards receiving and a pair of touchdowns (Cole Kronebusch led Caledonia with 129 yards receiving and three touchdowns).

Despite all of the skill the Kings and other Warriors possess, Fruechte says the game will likely not come down to them. He points to what happens up front as the key to who reaches the final.

"In the state tournament, it's always the same to me," Fruechte said. "It comes down to your offensive and defensive lines. They have to attack and get after (the opposition). Against Barnesville, we're going to have to be able to establish our running game or we'll be in trouble."

Running with the football is what Barnesville leans on most. Not nearly as diverse offensively as Caledonia, the Trojans — who have outscored opponents by an average of 46-8 — have an elite runner in quarterback Adam Tonsfeldt.

Part of what makes Tonsfeldt so effective is that at 5-feet-7, 140 pounds, he's hard to locate.

When Tonsfeldt is not hiding behind his big and strong offensive line, he's sprinting to daylight. The junior, who's helped Barnesville average 9.4 yards per carry, has 1,420 rushing yards this season. His per-carry average is a whopping 13 yards.

Barnesville also has one of the state's top tight end/linebackers with 6-3, 220-pound senior Hunter Zenzen. He has committed to play at Iowa State.

Still, as much as Barnesville has going for it, the Trojans know what they are up against. It's Caledonia, a team that no one has been able to solve in 66 games.

"You still have to give the advantage to Caledonia," Strand said. "Until someone knocks them off, they are the favorite. Caledonia has the best coached teams I've ever played against."



Caledonia Wins 67th Straight Defeating Trojans 43-12

The Barnesville Trojans squared off against the Juggernaut known as Caledonia, the team that defeated them in last year's Prep Bowl. The Warriors were riding a 66 game win streak, longest in the nation and have won the last four state championships.

After a stalemate first quarter, the Warriors started to flex their football muscle with a vaunted passing game that found seams in the Trojans defense. Caledonia scored on six straight possessions as they cruised to a 43-12 semi-finals victory at US Bank Stadium.

Barnesville opened up with the football and put together a nice drive that ended with a fumble that was recovered by the Warriors. The Trojans defense was up to the task early as they forced Caledonia to punt on three straight possessions as the first quarter came to a close with the score knotted at zero.

The Warriors finally hit a big play to open their portion of quarter two as quarterback Noah King found his brother Elijah King on a quick swing pass that saw the younger King make two players miss as he galloped down deep into Trojans territory.

Barnesville's defense would stiffen and also get some help as a touchdown was called back as they forced a fourth down. But the Warriors mentality of never relenting proved its worth as they completed a long pass play for another first down to keep the drive alive. Noah King would eventually find the end zone with his feet on a three-yard run for the first score of the game. The two-point conversion run was good giving the Warriors an 8-0 lead.

The Trojans would respond on their next possession as Adam Tonsfeldt found a seam and was off on a 78 yard touchdown run. The two-point conversion pass fell incomplete making the score 8-6.

The Warriors would strike quickly

as King found his receiver Cole Kronebusch down the right sideline for a 57-yard gain. Elijah King would catch a four-yard touchdown a few plays later to increase their lead to 15-6 after Braden McCallison's extra point was good.

The Trojan offense would move the ball on their next series before being forced to punt. Barnesville would try a fake that was snuffed out, giving the Warriors great field position late in the quarter. Caledonia would strike quickly with a 32-yard touchdown pass to Kronebusch with 1:09 to play in the first half. The extra point by McCallison was good making the score 22-6 as both teams went into the halftime break.

The Warriors got the ball to start the second half and found an opening for a very nice return to get the ball deep into Barnesville territory. Caledonia stayed with the pass and moved it down the short field, finding E. King for a five-yard pass and the score. The PAT from McCallison was spot on for a 29-6 Warriors lead.

Caledonia's next possession saw them march down the field in quick order with only a penalty backing them up momentarily. E. King had to come in to play quarterback for one play his brother went down with a cramp and it took only one play for him to take it to the house on a 15 yard run that saw him elude two would be tacklers before crossing the goal line. McCallison knocked through another extra point that made the score 36-6 Warriors.

Barnesville's offense was not able to generate much movement and was forced to make another punt and Caledonia would notch their sixth straight possession ending in a touchdown. N. King raced up the middle for a 12 yard score with McCallister netting his sixth extra point to increase the Warriors lead to 43-6 as the third quarter would come to an end.

The Trojans offense finally got something going as Tonsfeldt found an opening around the left edge for a 35 yard gain to get the ball to the 31 yard line of Caledonia.

He would back that up with another 15 yard run to get the ball to the two yard line before the offense moved backwards to the six. Tonsfeldt would score his second touchdown of the game with a run up the middle for the last score of the game, as the extra point was missed making the score 43-12, which is how the game would end.

"I thought we came out and played a good first quarter, especially on the defensive side of the ball," said Head Coach Bryan Strand. "But once Noah King settled in a little, he really tore us apart. I've said it before, but when you don't see a passing game like this the entire year, it is very difficult to get ready for it in one week. Caledonia did what they had to do and put points on the board. We did not make the plays when we needed to and that is a credit to them. They are a very disciplined football team.

We have to say good-bye to some terrific seniors that have done so much for the program as have their parents. It is always hard to watch kids when they realize that they may have played their last game of football.

I thought Adam had a great night running the ball. The alleys he usually sees just were not there, but he scrambled and worked so hard. He was hit on almost every offensive play. He also played well defensively.

Hunter Zenzen capped off his senior year with a good game defensively. It seemed like he was everywhere. He has also been nominated as a finalist for the Mr. Football Award. He will be honored at a banquet on December 9, the day after the All-Star game he will play in along with Connor Morse.

Coach Trowbridge will be coaching the offensive line. This is a fantastic honor for all.

It is always tough to end your season short of the ultimate prize. But we had a great year, had a lot of laughs, made a lot of memories and will see a great group of kids leaving the program. We also will have a very good group of players returning and should be a solid team again in 2020."

Tonsfeldt finished the game with 187 yards rushing on 26 carries with two touchdowns, while completing one of six passes for nine yards. Hunter Anderson finished with 20 yards on eight carries, with Aaron Schiefert tallying 11 yards on six carries. Jack Wahl finished with 10 yards on three carries with Cameron Heng netting nine yards on three carries, while Kaden Zenzen added one reception for nine yards to help the Trojans finish with 264 yards of total offense (255 rushing, 9 passing).

Defensively, Caledonia tallied

364 yards of total offense with 275 yards passing and 89 yards rushing.

H. Zenzen finished his career with nine total tackles including five solo, while Tonsfeldt tallied six tackles with five solo and a tackle on a kick. Joey Mark added four tackles with one for loss, with Heng netting three solo tackles and Anderson adding two solo tackles and one tackle on a kick. Jonny Robideau and Damian Camperud each tallied three total tackles including two solo to pace the Trojan defense.

Barnesville's season comes to an end as the team finishes with an overall record of 12-1.

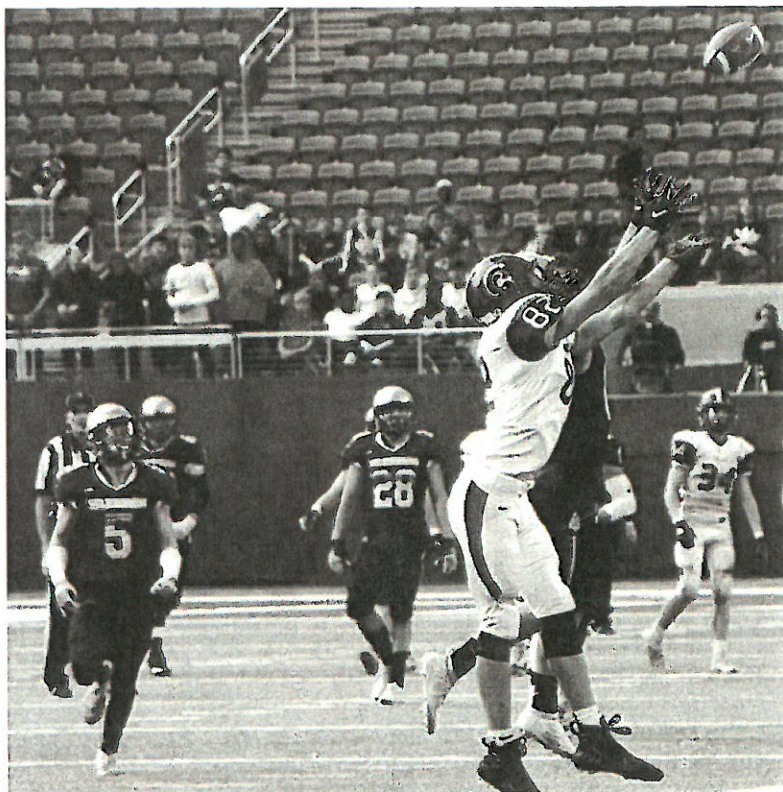

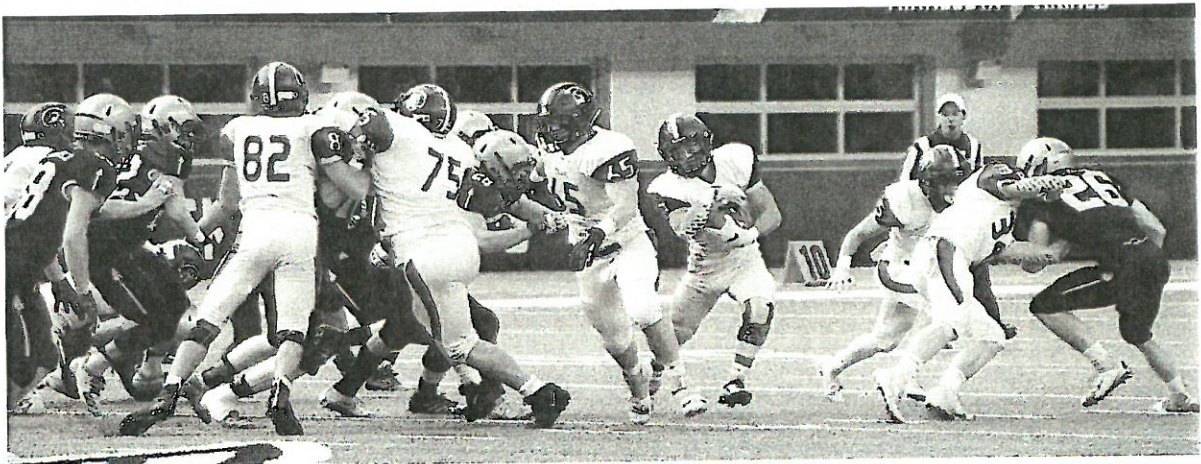

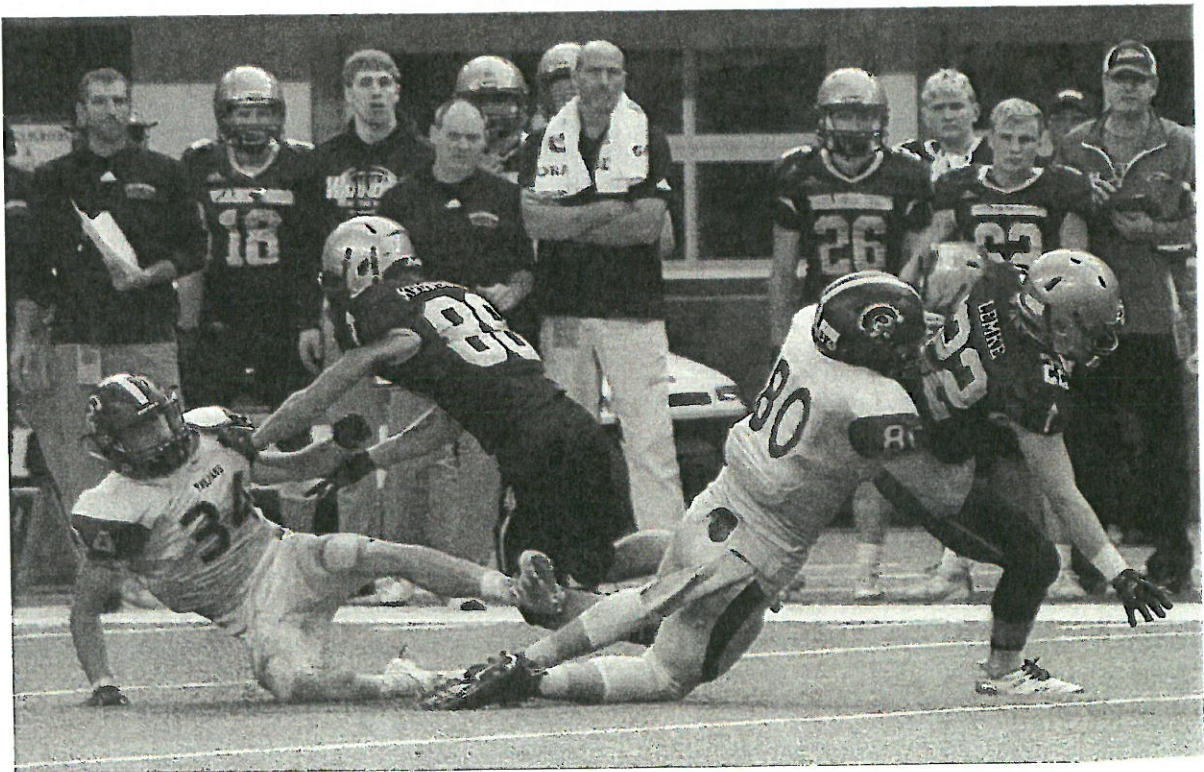

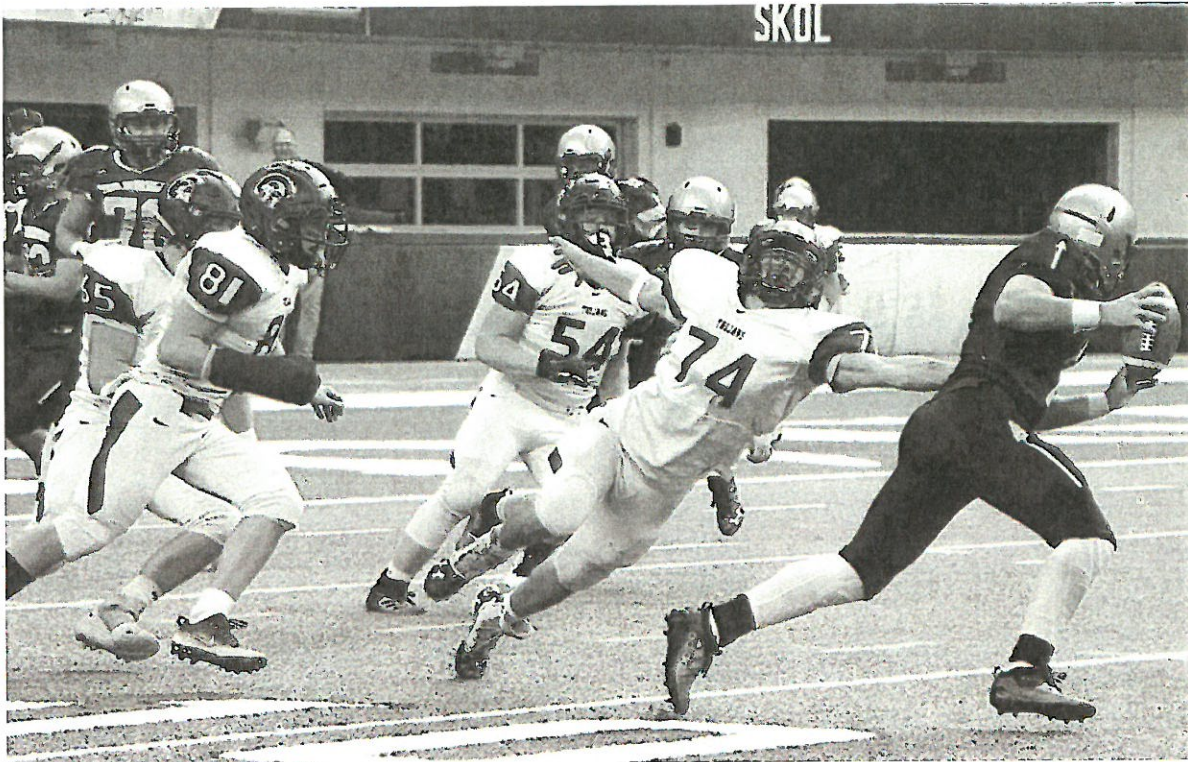

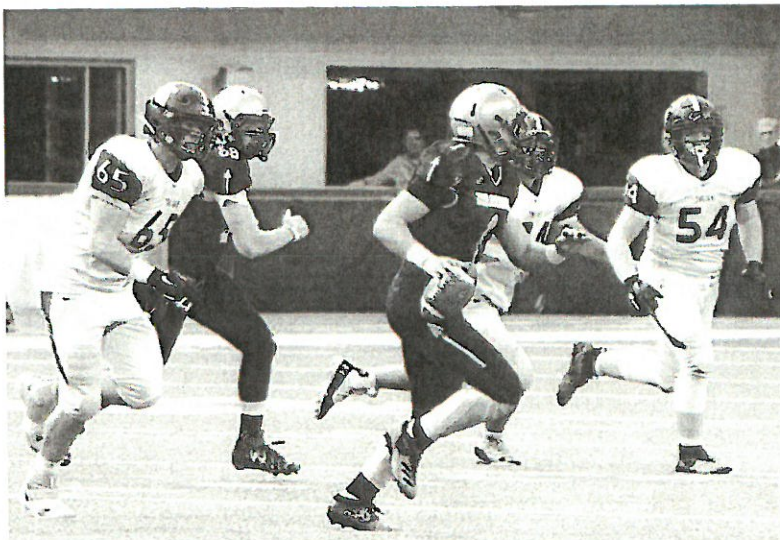
Jackson Wahl #3 tries to avoid the collision between the Trojans and the Warriors as he carries the ball down the field.



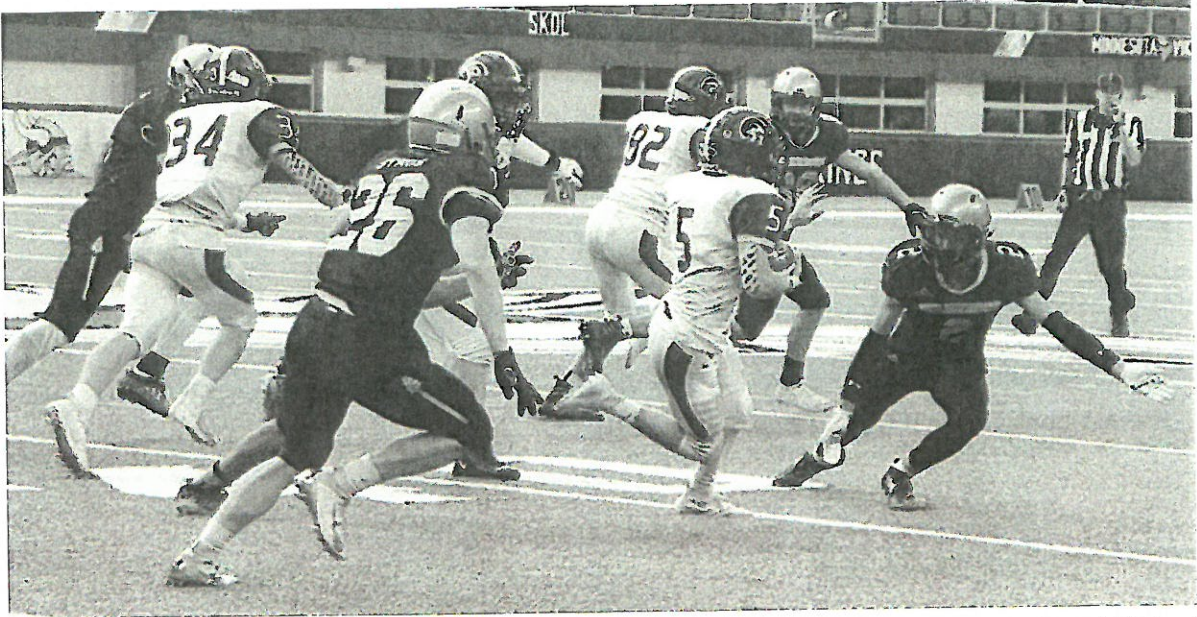

Caledonia ends Barnesville's season again, Trojans fall in state semifinal

MINNEAPOLIS — Barnesville's season ended at the hands of Caledonia inside U.S. Bank Stadium for the second year in a row, as the Trojans fell 43-12 in the Minnesota Class 2A state football semifinals on Friday.

The Trojans are the latest victim of the Caledonia football machine which owns the nation's longest active high school football winning streak at 67 straight games. The Warriors have won the last four state championships, including a 21-0 victory over Barnesville in last year's state title game.

Caledonia just brings a level of athleticism and offensive sophistication that the Trojans don't get to see from anybody else during the season.

"It's incredibly tough and what makes it even harder is that we don't see it throughout the year," Barnesville junior quarterback and defensive back Adam Tonsfeldt said. "We didn't see any passing throughout the entire year. Most teams we play run the ball 75 to 80 percent of the time. Then you come in here and face a team with incredible athletes and it makes it that much harder."

The Trojans brought in a few former Minnesota State Moorhead football players, including head coach Bryan Strand's son Michael, to simulate Caledonia's speed in practice this week. But it still wasn't enough.

Caledonia senior quarterback Noah King completed 13 of 25 passes for 277 yards and three touchdowns, and added 34 yards and two touchdowns on the ground. King's younger brother Eli King caught five passes for 94 yards and two scores, adding a TD on the ground. Cole Kronebusch caught five passes for 164 yards and score.

"That is a college style offense," Strand said. "They spread it around. (Caledonia receiver Eli King) is a pure athlete, plain and simple and they've got two or three other guys. If you double (King), you leave two other guys open. It's a tough feat."

Barnesville's defense seemed up to the task early on. It forced three straight three-and-outs as Noah King opened the game 0-for-7. But once The Warriors' offense clicked, it became just about unstoppable, scoring touchdowns on their next six drives. After the slow start, King completed 9 of 12 passes for 197 yards and 2 touchdowns in the second quarter.

"I knew we could play with them to begin with," Trojans senior defensive lineman Hunter Zenzen said. "The second half still had to be written. I thought we would match up really well — which we did — up front, just our secondary was so young, they're not as experienced and they've never been tested by any team. I thought they did a phenomenal job tonight and I couldn't be any prouder."

"We handled the pass pretty well in the first half, but as the game wore on and they wore us down, we just tuckered out," Strand said.

Barnesville's offense had some success, but its option rushing attack isn't built to play from behind, and just couldn't keep up with Caledonia. All 234 of the Trojans' yards came on the ground, with Tonsfeldt gaining the lion's share. He had 172 yards and a pair of touchdowns, including a 78-yarder, on 26 carries.

After Caledonia scored its first touchdown — a 3-yard run by Noah King — Tonsfeldt answered with his long touchdown run. He kept the ball to the right, blasted through a hole up the middle, shrugged off a tackler at the second level, cut to his right and ran away from the defense to make it 8-6.

But the Warriors came right back with a five-play, 71-yard drive that was jump started by a 57-yard reception by Kronebusch, and was capped by a 4-yard touchdown catch by Eli King.

"Offensively, we are a run-oriented team," Strand said. "That's what we do. And we do it pretty well. And they stop the run very, very well."

Tonsfeldt added his second rushing touchdown — a 6-yarder to the right — in the fourth quarter with the game out of reach at 43-12.

"They never quit," Strand said. "They fought hard. They worked hard to get here. This loss hurts, but it does not define them."

Barnesville's season comes to an end with a 12-1 record and its fourth consecutive Class 2A, Section 8 title appearance. Caledonia will look for its 68th straight win and its fifth straight state championship next Friday at 11:30 a.m. as the Warriors take on Minneapolis North in the title game.
