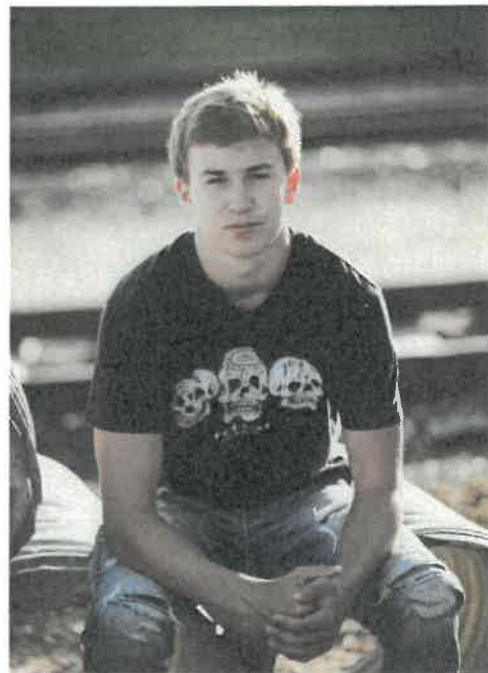

# Trojan Football Returns Key Weapons In 2020

The Barnesville Trojans are finally back on the gridiron in this crazy 2020 year of pandemic mania with the season postponed only to be resumed again. In what was supposed to be another run to US Bank Stadium, to a season of unknowns, the Trojans are now back at work for another season of football with high expectations.

The 2019 Barnesville Trojan football team waltzed through the regular season, winning the section title and another state football quarterfinal victory before meeting up with the four-time defending state champion Caledonia Warriors, who had beaten them in the championship game the previous season.

After battling to an even first quarter, the Warriors exploded in the second with a few big plays that turned the game into Caledonia's favor as they cruised to a 43-12 victory to end Barnesville's season for the third time in four years.

The Trojans are hoping for another matchup with the Warriors down the road, but first have to take care of business in the regular season and see if the MSHSL lets them have a playoff system to determine a state champion.

Bryan Strand returns for his 16th season as head coach of the Trojans with an overall record of 127-41. His teams have made it to US Bank Stadium, three of the last four years and are coming off a 12-1 season.

Barnesville finished 4-0 in the Midwest District White Division to earn the top seed in the playoffs. They would go on to defeat Hawley and Warroad before beating Pelican Rapids in the Section 8AA championship.

Barnesville would defeat Osakis

flurries before their season ended at US Bank Stadium.

Strand has guided his Trojans football team to four straight section championships, and they would seem to be the favorites to making it five in a row.

Consistency has been the key for Barnesville during their successful run over the last four years, and a solid coaching staff is a big reason why.

Offensive coordinator Phil Trowbridge returns for his 21st season with the program, with Nick Paur and Nathan Strand back to lead the junior varsity and freshman teams. Volunteer coaches will once again be Scott Snobl, Ace Gregg and Dain Biewer, while the junior high program will be led by former varsity assistant coaches Matt Askegaard and Stacy Martz, who will lead the eighth graders. Scott Amundson and Tracy Hinsz will coach seventh grade.

"The culture we have built for football here in Barnesville has been excellent," said Coach Bryan Strand. "We changed our mindset about the weight room years ago and the benefits have shown. We are bigger, stronger and faster than we have ever been and we got the kids to believe in our system.

"Our coaching staff has remained intact, which has been a big reason why we have been successful as well. The amount of expertise we have on staff and in our junior high and FM football programs has been fantastic as well. The kids know our system, believe in how we do things and are taught the fundamentals at an early age. This is why we have been successful and our program has been so consistent over the last 10 years."

Back for his senior season and the glue of both the offensive and defensive sides of the football is Adam Tonsfeldt. Two years ago, Strand took Tonsfeldt aside and told him to plan on playing quarterback for the varsity team. Tonsfeldt was not a strong believer at first, but that

offenses.

Tonsfeldt's ability to make defenders miss him in his space or not see him behind his offensive line of scrimmage is a defense's nightmare. When teams try to key on him, the running backs then gain big chunks of yards. Either way, the offense is very powerful.

Defensively, Tonsfeldt is a ball hawk in the secondary and leads the team in interceptions each of the last two years.

The Trojans have had many great players over the last few years and Tonsfeldt ranks right up there with that group.

Other players of note returning for their last campaign include seniors Joey Mark, tight end/linebacker; Brady Kroll, tackle/defensive end; Eric Ackerson, center/defensive tackle; and Aaron Schiefert, fullback/linebacker; with juniors Cameron Heng, running back/defensive back; Noah Krause, running back/defensive back; and Kaden Zenzen, tight end/defensive end; while sophomore Jonny Robideau, guard/linebacker, returns for another run at Trojan glory.

New players the coaching staff are looking to take the next step in their development and help the team include juniors Peyton Pauna, running back/defensive back, and Ryan Martinson, tight end/linebacker; sophomores Braeden Bredman, running back/defensive back; Spencer Schumacher, offensive line/defensive line; and Tim Wells, offensive line/defensive line; with freshman Justin Krueger-offensive line/defensive line in the mix.

The Trojans lost a lot of talent from last year's team in Hunter Zenzen, who is playing at Iowa State, Connor Morse; who is playing for Concordia, as well as Matt Samuelson, Jackson Wahl and Hunter Anderson.

"But we are returning many athletes that saw plenty of playing time over the last year or more,"

This year's freshmen, Dawson Gregg, Zach Bredman, Hunter Blilie, Ayden Hauck, Noah Stanford, Nate Huesman, Asher O'Brien, Dovante Russell, David Spillum, Avery Schroeder Peyton Amundson, Carter Swenson, Christian Lien, Jay Tschumperlin, Ethan Larson, Levi Eickenbrock, Jaxon Ernst, Kaden Mueller, Tyler Drees, Ethan Hoppe, Sawyer Ernst, Michael Atteberry, Jameson Haycraft, Jack Hough and Atticus Olson, are chomping at the bit to get a look this year.

"We have a lot of kids out for football in grades nine through 12," said Strand. "The Trojan Tradition began at the lower levels as they learned our system and has continued throughout the years. It also includes a fantastic weight training program that gives the kids the belief they can beat anyone they play."

The team had a great offseason-lifting program where the boys have gotten much bigger and stronger.

"We have lots of key players back

from our 2019 squad that made the state semi-finals," Strand said. "We also have a few young faces that are in the mix to get some significant playing time. We need to stay healthy, and if we can, we should have a very successful year."

Barnesville will once again battle teams in the Midwest District, representing the white division. They will be joined by the Breckenridge Cowboys, Crookston Pirates, Hawley Nuggets and Roseau Rams.

Strand believes that Breckenridge is a favorite in the district with Pelican Rapids, Hawley and Barnesville bringing back strong teams in the section.

"Football may be a game, but these kids have poured their heart and soul into the sport for the last few years," concluded Strand. "They deserve and need a football season and a playoff format. If we can have that type of season, the seniors will go out with their heads held high. If the season gets cut short, everyone loses. Let's hope we can have a safe and healthy season as we move forward through this pandemic."

# **With Minnesota's football season underway, Barnesville not taking anything for granted**

**BARNESVILLE, Minn. —** For the first time in months, the Barnesville Trojans felt a sense of normalcy last Friday evening. The football team was opening its season the next day and the first-game jitters were creeping in.

But the Trojans were quickly back in uncharted territory when they got word their season opener against Pillager was at risk of being scrapped because of COVID-19 issues.

Barnesville senior Brady Kroll asked himself, “Is this how my season is gonna start out?” Luckily, the game was played as scheduled, but with less players on the opposing side’s bench. Pillager competed without several players. One of Barnesville’s captains, who was exposed to someone who tested positive for the coronavirus, was also absent.

“By the time I heard that we could actually play, I was like, ‘Heck yeah, I’m gonna go out there and play like this is my last game, like is this for the section title. I’m going to go out there and kill and do my job,’” Kroll said. “I don’t want to have to feel that. I hope no other team feels that because I don’t want anybody getting their season taken away from them.”

Barnesville had already had its football season moved once. The Minnesota State High School League voted in early August to move football and volleyball to a “flex” spring season, but that decision was reversed on Monday, Sept. 21. The game that looked like it may not happen reminded the Trojans about this season’s on-again, off-again nature.

“It really puts it into perspective that you have to play every single game, every single play like it’s your last, because you don’t know when you might not be playing,” said Barnesville senior quarterback Adam Tonsfeldt, who was 2 for 3 in passing for 48 yards and two touchdowns Saturday. “You don’t know when you might be positive for COVID-19 and not able to play at all. It just literally can happen in a split second. So you’ve gotta give everything you’ve got every single game.”

The Trojans quickly realized just how chaotic and uncertain this pandemic football season would be. Barnesville is navigating an unfamiliar landscape, but seemed to be adjusting to the new normal just fine as it cruised to a 36-6 win over Pillager. Barnesville is coming off a 12-1 season that ended in the Minnesota Class 2A state semifinals.

“Pillager was a good team, and I thought we looked really good against them,” said senior Joey Mark. “Definitely a lot of things to fix, but that’s why we’re here and getting the work in. It went fluently. It was a little weird not shaking hands, we just waved to them at the end.”

What the team does know, though, is how appreciative they are to play in the fall instead of the spring. Tonsfeldt said they were bummed when they heard it was moved because of the uncertainty of what the spring could look like.

The flex season didn't seem as bad to Mark, who had four solo and 12 assisted tackles against Pillager.

“I was actually pretty excited when it got pushed to the spring because we’d have so much more time to improve on our strength and get a little faster,” Mark said. “I feel like our team has a little more dedication than most when it comes to the weight room and just off-the-field stuff. But I’m happy we have a fall season and I’m excited for the rest of the games.”

The Trojans enter this season with a bit of a chip on their shoulder. Caledonia ended Barnesville’s season in the playoffs for the second year in a row last fall. But the teams probably won’t face each other this year. In an Oct. 1 meeting, the MSHSL Board of Directors voted against providing a “culminating event” beyond section tournaments for fall sports.

“I’ve had a great run right now and being a senior, I’m really just experiencing and cherishing each moment that I get and we want to go out on top like we have the last few years,” Tonsfeldt said. “So that’s our goal.”

The atmosphere will be far quieter in Barnesville this year. The Minnesota Department of Health limits outdoor events to 250 spectators.

Each player and coach for Barnesville gets two tickets apiece and can give those two whomever. Still, it’s a stark contrast from the thousands of fans who normally pile into Barnesville’s stadium.

# Trojan Football Opens Season With 36-6 Victory

The Barnesville Trojans finally were able to play a game in the delayed Covid-19 football season as they hosted Pillager to open the 2020 campaign on Saturday, October 3.

With expectations running high for another successful season, the Trojans cruised to a 36-6 victory over the Huskies.

Barnesville opened up the season with the football and connected on their first score after five plays as quarterback, Adam Tonsfeldt connected with Kaden Zenzen for a 40-yard touchdown pass. Tonsfeldt would add the two-point conversion run for a quick 8-0 lead.

Pillager would put together a nice drive before the Trojan defense stopped them on downs and gave the offense the ball back.

The second half saw the Trojan defense force a stop and the offense cruise to another touchdown after five plays. Noah Krause would take a quick hand off up the middle all the way to pay dirt, covering 40 yards for the score. Nolan Rick would

come on to boot the extra point that gave the Trojans a 29-6 lead.

Barnesville would quickly add a defensive score on the Huskies next possession as Brady Kroll stripped the quarterback of the football, with Zenzen scooping it up and racing untouched 63 yards for his third touchdown of the game. Rick would bang through his second PAT that made the score 36-6 Barnesville.

All our practices this week were in the gym and covered through zoom for those that could not be there. The leadership shown by everyone to work through this situation, play well and get the win was fantastic".

Strand continued, "We had some great performances from players that have not seen much, if any action this year. Ethan Larson, Mason Moen, Jordan Kroll, Cole Swenson and Carter DuBord were awesome on the offensive line. They dominated

in getting this victory under trying circumstances.

We have two huge weeks coming up and expect to get everyone back this week. We travel to West Central Area next week and play Breckenridge the week after. They are both fantastic teams. We will have to have two great weeks of practice to be ready," Strand concluded.

Heng led the Trojans with 76 yards rushing on five carries with two scores, while Schiefert added 67 yards on 10 carries and a score. Tonsfeldt returned to lead the charge with 65 yards rushing on 10 carries and two scores, adding three completions for 89 yards and a touchdown as well, while Mark tallied all three catches for 89 yards and a score.

Mark led the defensive troops with nine tackles (5 solo, 4 assisted), two caused fumbles and three tackles on kicks, with Wyatt Roller netting six tackles (2 s, 4 a) including two for loss, adding a sack and three tackles on kicks.

Schiefert finished with eight tackles (2 s, 6 a) with one for loss, one sack and a fumble recovery with Cole Swenson netting six tackles (3 s, 3 a) one for loss and a sack.

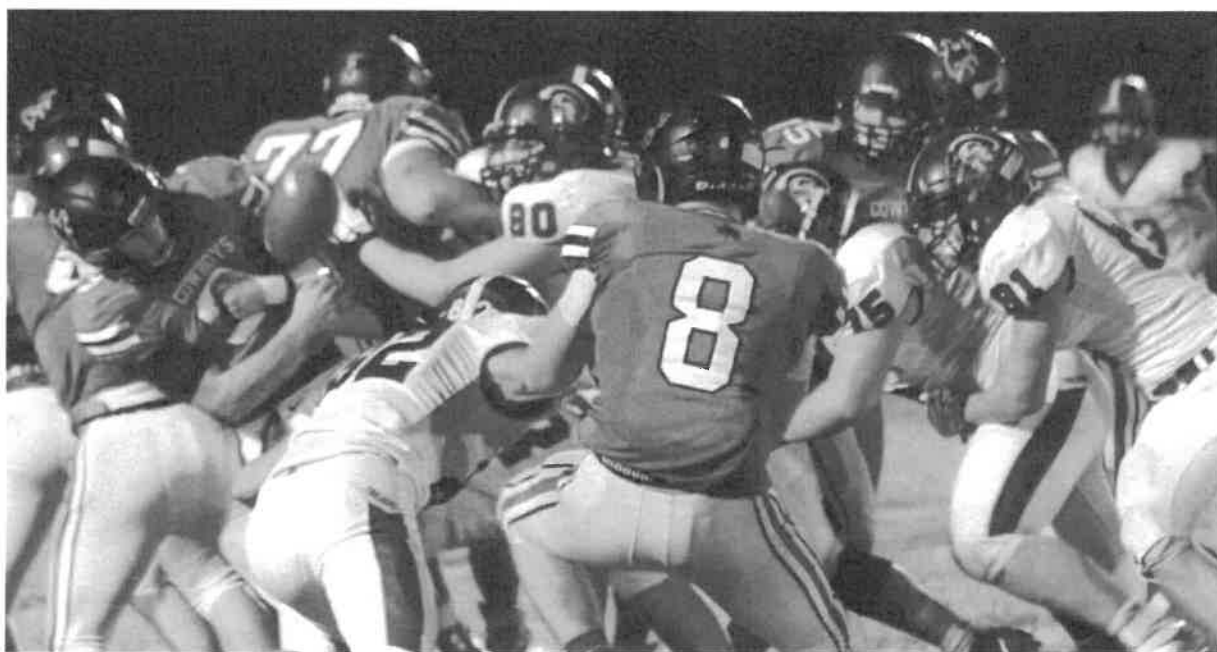

Gonnerman would catch the two-point conversion pass from Bruns that made the score 57-44. They would add a Bruns to Loge 16 yard scoring pass to cut the lead to seven at 57-50 putting pressure on the Trojans to respond.

Barnesville would do just that as Tonsfeldt would score his third touchdown of the game, running it in from 20 yards out with Schiefert adding the two-point conversion that made the score 65-50 as the third quarter came to a close.

But Morris would come right back as Bruns connected with Decker from 53 yards out with the two-point conversion play not good making the score 65-56. Both teams would get a few more chances, but the defenses decided to finally show up and stopped any more scoring as the slugfest came to an end with the Trojans winning the battle of the heavyweights.

"Everything that could happen seemed to happen. Kickoff return for touchdowns, fumble return for touchdowns, long passes, tipped passes for conversions, it was up and down and back and forth. Over one-thousand yards of offense in a high school game is unbelievable.

We were approached on Monday to switch our game to play Morris and since both of us would have matched up in the first round of state if we won our sections, we figured it would be a great game.

It was tough to prepare for them in only two days as they have a lot of weapons. But credit the kids as they came and played their butts off. It was a fun way to end the regular season at 6-0 and to beat a good team like Morris is icing on the cake.

Now we need to heal up for the playoffs. We get a first round bye/forfeit, as neither Menahga nor Bagley will compete in section play. We are now onto the home stretch. We have two more weeks and two more games hopefully. This is a great group of seniors and the underclassmen have really stepped up."

Tonsfeldt was all over the field as he tallied 248 yards rushing on 30 carries, with two touchdowns, while adding 64 yards passing on four completions and two more scores, while chipping in an 80 kickoff return for a score.

Schiefert was a bull dozer netting 151 yards rushing on 17 carries and three scores, with Heng adding 71 yards rushing and eight yards receiving with two scores, while Krause chipped in 55 yards rushing on 11 carries, with Zenzen netting 56 yards receiving on three receptions and a score.

Schiefert led the defense with 10 tackles (6 solo, 4 assisted), three for loss, two sacks and a tackle on a kick, with Tonsfeldt adding eight tackles (4s, 4a), an interception and two tackles on kicks. While Jonny Robideau finished with nine tackles (2s, 7a), two tackles for loss, a sack

tackles, two tackles for loss, two fumble recoveries and once sack with Joey Mark netting seven tackles (2s, 5a) one for loss and one sack.

As a team, the Trojans finished with 589 total yards of offenses with 525 yards rushing and 64 yards passing, while Morris tallied 511 total yards of offense with 471 yards passing and 40 yards rushing.

Barnesville's record now stands at 6-0 on the season.

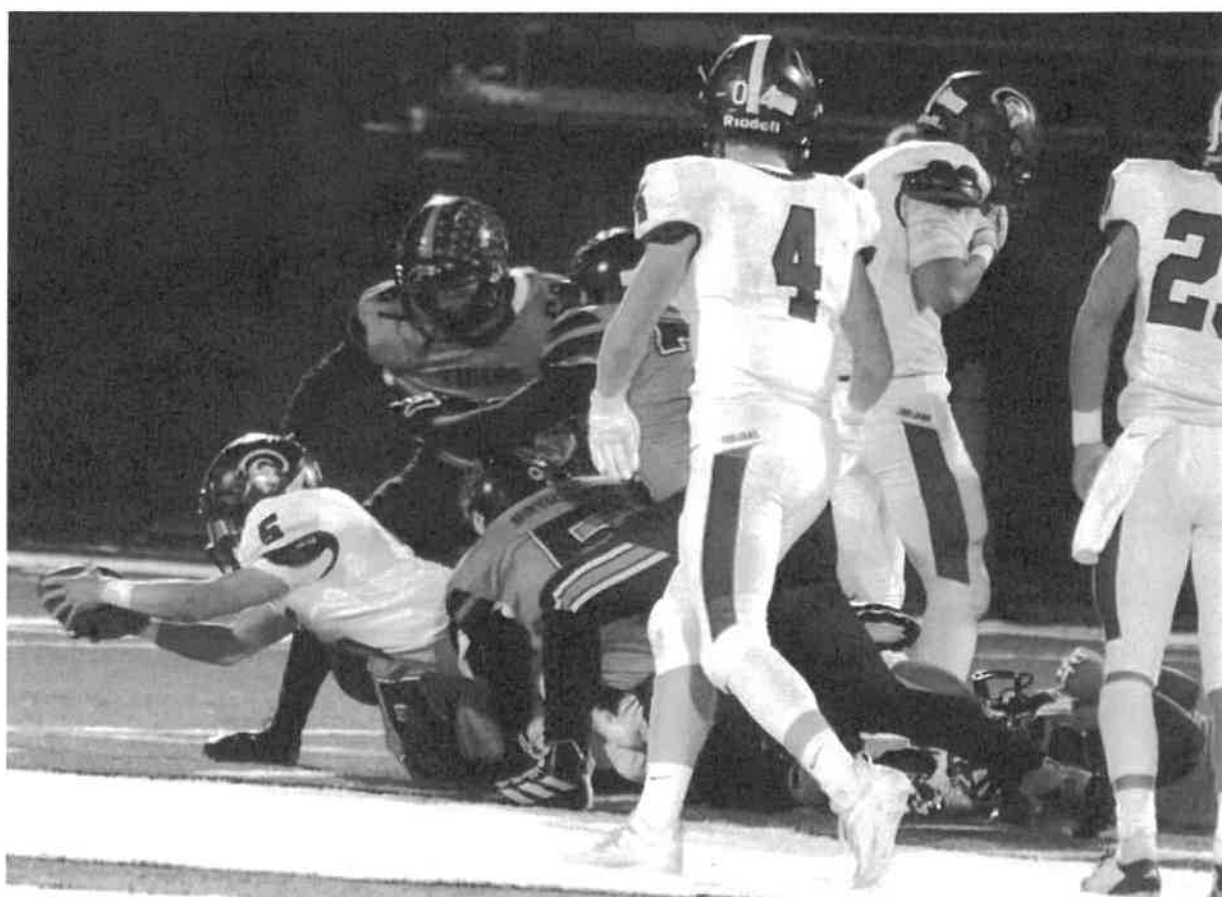

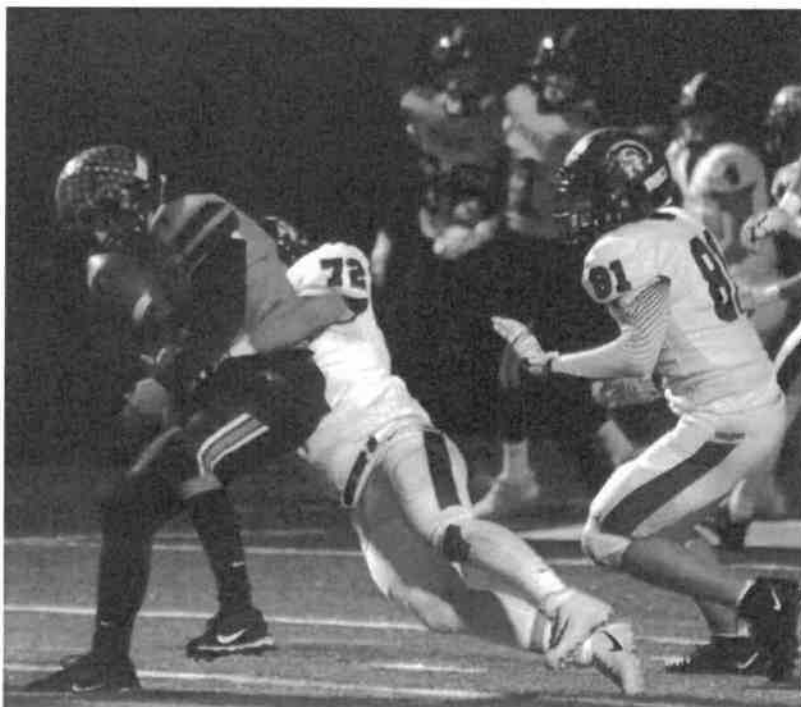

# Tigers end season with loss to third-ranked Barnesville, earn No. 1 seed in 5AA playoffs

With 121 points and 1,120 yards between two Class AA state-ranked teams, third-ranked Barnesville came out victorious over fifth-ranked Morris Area/Chokio-Alberta, 65-56, in a battle of the undefeateds on Wednesday, Nov. 11, at Big Cat Stadium in Morris.

"Barnesville is a tough team, I think we're the only team (this season) that has really given them a run for their money," MACA starting center, junior Austin Rathis said.

"That was the toughest team we have and will face this year, and we were with them in that game," MACA senior Josh Rohloff said. "We can definitely have confidence in our team to beat anyone after a game like that."

Still, the number of points put up on the scoreboard was a little surprising to some, including senior quarterback Zach Bruns.

"I honestly expected it to be a little lower than what it was. Our defense is really good at reading the plays but (Wednesday) it's like they ran three different plays with only one guy getting the ball," Bruns said. "We both have respect for each other. ... We're both top-five teams in the state, even though we lost, it was one of the most intense and fun games I've ever played."

"Definitely the most offensive game I've ever been a part of. I think it really came down to physicality and they used it to their advantage to force some turnovers," Rohloff added.

Outside of the opening drive fumble by the Tigers, each

The Trojans started digging their heels in in the second quarter as they capitalized on a MACA interception and a failed fourth down conversion to go ahead 57-36 at halftime.

The Tigers made some defensive adjustments in the second half.

"I've said it all year, I'm so proud of our young men. We've dealt with adversity all year and we have risen to every challenge and Wednesday we did the same thing," Pope said. "We fumbled on our first offensive play then gave up a quick score to their tough offense. Right there a lot of other teams would have folded up their tents against a team like Barnesville. Instead we went right down the field and scored and we continued to match them blow-for-blow the whole game... I cannot not say how proud I am of these young men, they played phenomenal, they

The Trojans ran for an eye-popping 534 yards with quarterback Adam Tonsfeldt going off for 260 yards on 33 carries. Meanwhile, Brunns put up video game-like numbers through the air, completing 21 of 31 passes for 498 yards and six touchdowns. "Our offense continues to be a juggernaut, to score 56 points and not get stopped other than a few turnovers that we had was really impressive," Tiger coach Kevin Pope said.

Brunns' favorite target of the night was Kenny Soderberg, who had eight catches for a career-high 208 yards and three total

touchdowns, including an 80-yard kick return touchdown. Jackson Loge hauled in six balls for 93 yards and two touchdowns while Toby Gonnerman had a career-high 106 yards and a touchdown on just three catches.

"Zach did a good job distributing the ball (Wednesday) and reading the open receiver. With the success Jackson (Loge) and Kenny (Soderberg) have been having this season they had to key on them more and it gave me some opportunities," Gonnerman said. "We played a good Barnesville team and it was an exciting game. It was a privilege to be part of a game like this. I'm very proud of how the team played hard and never gave up. We've had a team first mentality (from the start of the season) and we play for each other."

In the age of COVID-19, teams would typically stand in a line and wave across the field at each other. After a hard-fought 48 minutes of football, these two teams congregated at midfield to greet each other on a job well done.

# Trojans End Season With 41-8 Victory Over Warroad

The Barnesville Trojans had to move their game up one day as the Governor of Minnesota put out a mandate to pause all high school sports as of 11:59 Friday night, November 20.

In another strange turn to the season, the Section Championship game was now not going to be a possibility. So the section semi-finals would be the last game played, pitting the Trojans against Warroad.

Adam Tonsfeldt was going to make sure his last game on the gridiron was going to be a good one for him and his team as he tallied 129 yards rushing on six carries with three scores, adding 38 yards passing with two completions in leading Barnesville to a 41-8 victory.

On the first play of the game, Warroad would fumble and senior Joey Mark would recover. A few plays later, senior Aaron Schiefert would score the first touchdown of the game with a four yard run. The fake PAT pass from Nolan Rick just went off the hands of Noah Krause making the score 6-0. Krause would then net an interception on the Warriors next possession giving the Trojans the ball back.

Tonsfeldt would get the next two scores with runs of seven and 24 yards with Cameron Heng adding the two-point conversion on Tonsfeldt's second score for a 20-0 lead after one quarter of play.

Senior Wyatt Roller would rumble in from 13 yards out for Barnesville's fourth touchdown of the game as the conversion pass failed making the score 26-0. Krause would tally the next score with an 18 yard run with Heng adding another two-point conversion run giving the Trojans a 34-0 lead that they would take into halftime.

The third quarter would only see one touchdown as Tonsfeldt raced in from 48 yards out for his final score of his illustrious career. Rick would tally the extra point kick that made the score 41-0 Barnesville

score on a 31-yard run from Blake Norris on the last play of the game. Virgil Laznicka would connect with Tucker Sprouls on the two-point conversion pass that made the score 41-8, which is how the game and season would end.

"Well that's a wrap on the craziest football season of all time," stated Head Coach Bryan Strand. "Even though it was short in games, the work that it took to get to the finish line was exhausting. The kids worked hard, stayed focused throughout the season. Which started in August when we thought we were playing in the spring, to September when we started our three weeks of practice, to when they made the announcement that we were going to be playing in the fall. Then it all came to an end when they stopped us literally three days before the section championship game. In the end I wouldn't have changed it for the world, as I was very pessimistic of a spring season.

"During this season we beat three teams that would end up being section champs or co-champs however you want to see it as Morris won theirs outright, Breckenridge won theirs outright and WCA split it, but felt they had a great chance as the top seed.

"I give a ton of respect to Warroad on making the drive down knowing their odds were not very good, but still wanting to give our kids and their kids one more game. Their kids played hard all the way till the end. I have much respect for the Warrior football team and Head Coach Gabe Richards.

"What a great group of seniors who were able to get some terrific memories from this crazy year. I can't say enough positives about this group. It was so much fun to go to practice every day and work with such fine young men. I am very lucky.

"The underclassman did a great job as well, as we will return a lot of outstanding players on both sides of

their tails off in the offseason.

"It sure would of been fun to finish up playing for the section championship, but we will just have to split it this year with Pelican Rapids who beat a good Hawley team. That doesn't diminish what this group of players accomplished this year," concluded Strand.

Schiefert finished his career with 85 yards rushing on six carries and a score, with Andrew Peterson netting 53 yards on three carries. Wyatt Roller ended his career with 34 yards rushing on six carries and a score with Krause adding 30 yards on five carries and one touchdown, adding one reception for five yards.

Heng would finish with two carries for 20 yards, with Peyton Pauna adding one carry for 10 yards, while senior Eric Ackerson was able to play his last game after suffering a torn ACL earlier in the season and getting a three yard rush. Mark would net one reception that covered 33 yards to help the Trojans accumulate 402 yards of total offense with 364 yards rushing and 38 yards passing.

Defensively, the Trojans held the Warriors to 94 total yards with 82 rushing and 12 passing.

Jonny Robideau led Barnesville with 10 tackles (3 solo, 7 assisted) including two for loss with one sack, while Mark ended his career with seven tackles (4s, 3a), a fumble recovery and two tackles on kicks.

Schiefert chipped in eight tackles (3s, 5a) with one for loss, with Brady Kroll adding five tackles (2s, 3a) with two for loss in his last game. Kaden Zenzen chipped in seven tackles (1s, 6a) with one for loss and a sack and Krause tallied an interception in the Trojans dominant performance.

The Trojans secured their fifth consecutive Section 8AA championship, as they will share the title with Pelican Rapids who defeated Hawley 40-14.

Barnesville's season comes to an end with an overall record of 7-0.

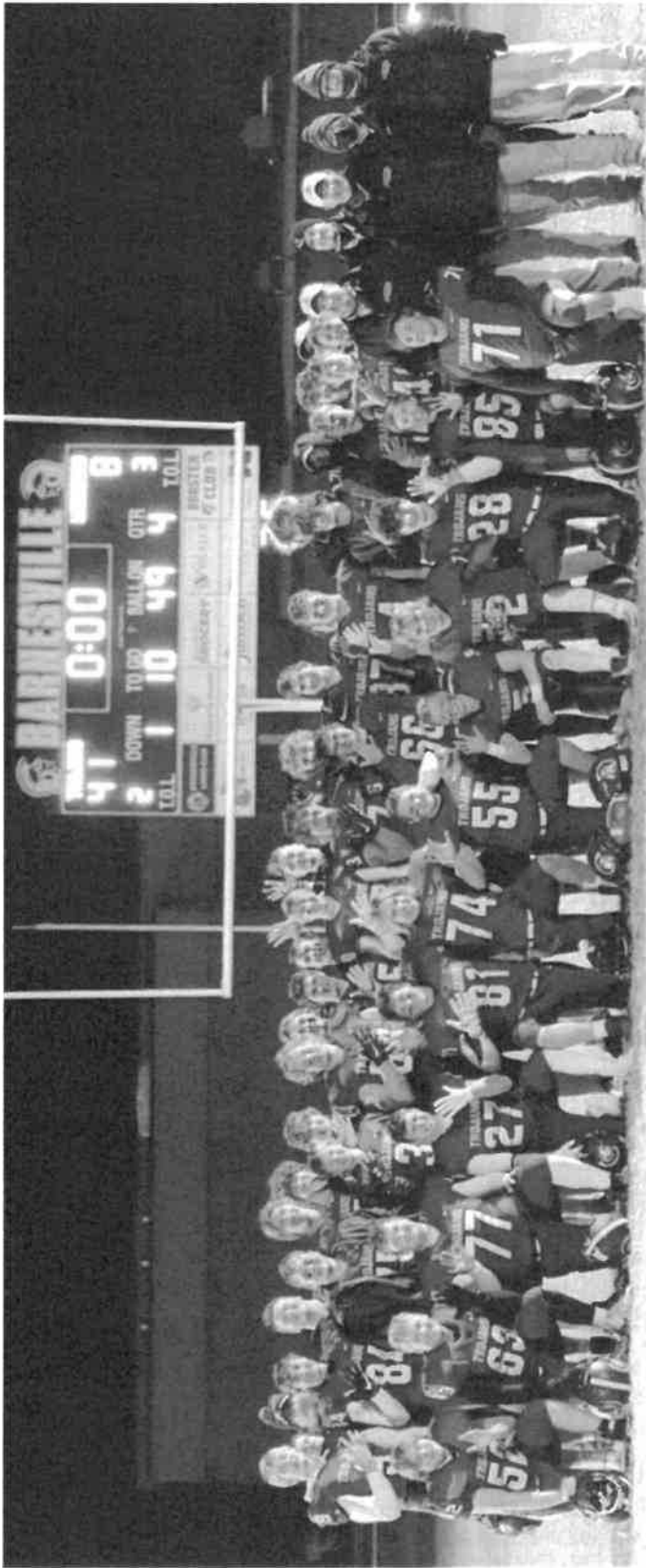

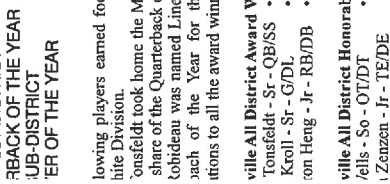

# Adam Tonsfeldt Named Mr. Minnesota Football Finalist

Barnesville High School's Adam Tonsfeldt has been named one of 10 finalists for Mr. Minnesota Football.

Each year, the Minnesota Football Coaches Association recognizes the top senior players in the state with the Mr. Football title.

Despite the 2020 season being disrupted by the coronavirus, Tonsfeldt led the Barnesville Trojans to an undefeated Section 8AA season. The team's 7-0 record led to a number three ranking in the final Class AA Associated Press poll.

"It's very cool, and a huge honor, especially knowing it's been such a tough year," Tonsfeldt said. "It was nice to capitalize on it with this honor."

Tonsfeldt was quarantined twice this past season, once during pre-season practices and once in the middle of the season. Despite that, he missed only one game.

The highlight game of the season was a 65-56 barn-burner victory over Morris in November. The game came about as a last-minute pandemic-related schedule change.

"That game felt like a state playoff game," Tonsfeldt said. "Both teams played super hard."

"Morris was the team we would have played in the first round of playoffs," said Head Coach Bryan Strand. "That's why we gladly accepted the invitation to play them."

In the six games he played in during the season, Tonsfeldt threw for 400 yards with eight TDs and only one interception. As a rusher, he ran for 800 yards on 80 carries, or an amazing average of a first down per carry.

As safety on defense, Tonsfeldt had three interceptions to finish his Trojan career with 17 picks, which is a school record.

Adam, the son of Ryan and Michelle Tonsfeldt, is the third of three generations to play Trojan football. In fact, his grandfather, Dean Tonsfeldt played on the last Barnesville team to go undefeated back in 1961. That team was 8-0 on the season, but there was no state playoff system in place at that time.

"Adam brings leadership and

On the sidelines he's still cheering on his teammates. That's something you don't always see."

Although he's made no decision about where he'll be next fall, Tonsfeldt said, "The way this season ended has definitely pushed me to go out for a sport in college."

The Mr. Minnesota Football award was initiated by the Coaches Association in 2004. Barnesville has

Tonsfeldt and Strand heartily agree that the three Trojan nominations speak volumes about the Barnesville football program.

"I guarantee there's not another AA team in the state that's had three finalists for Mr. Football," Strand said.

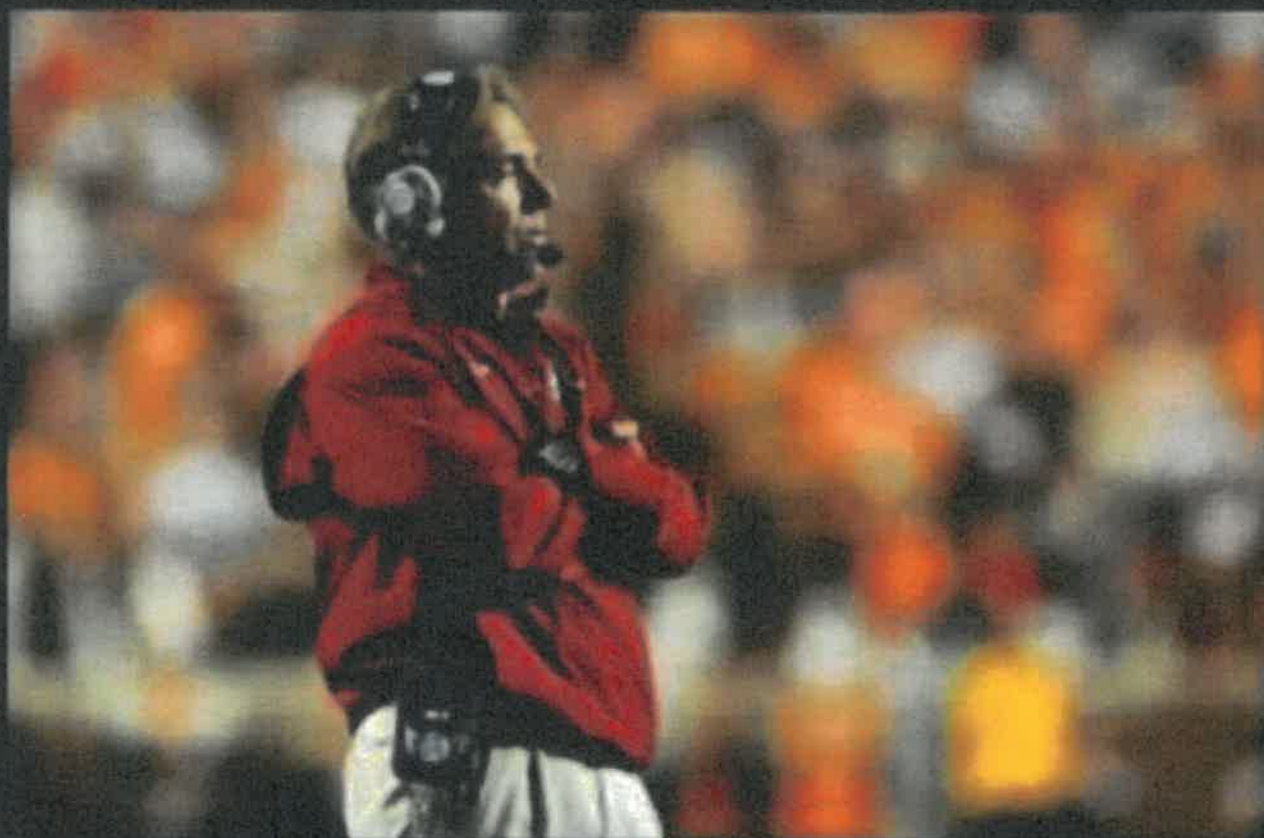
